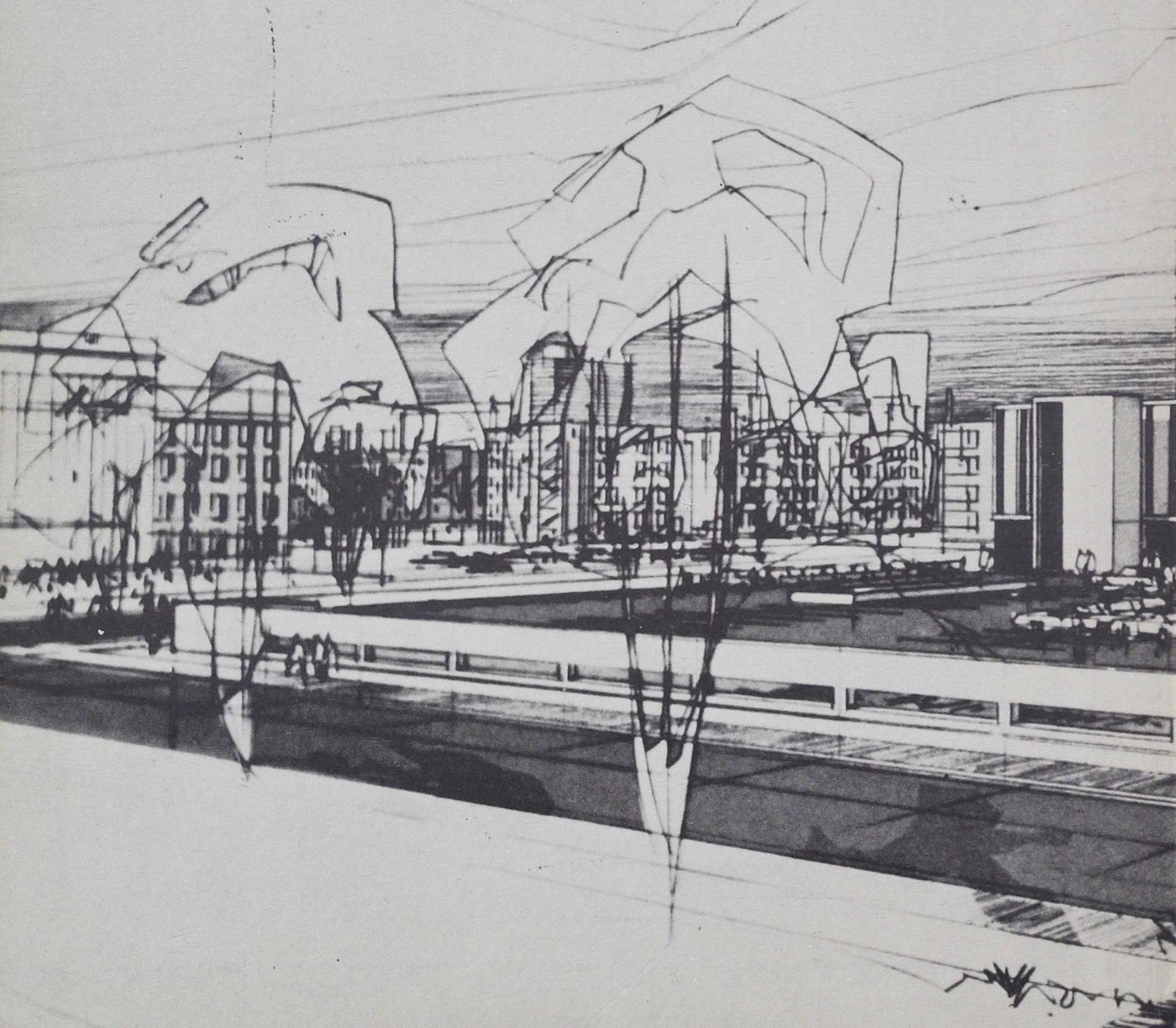

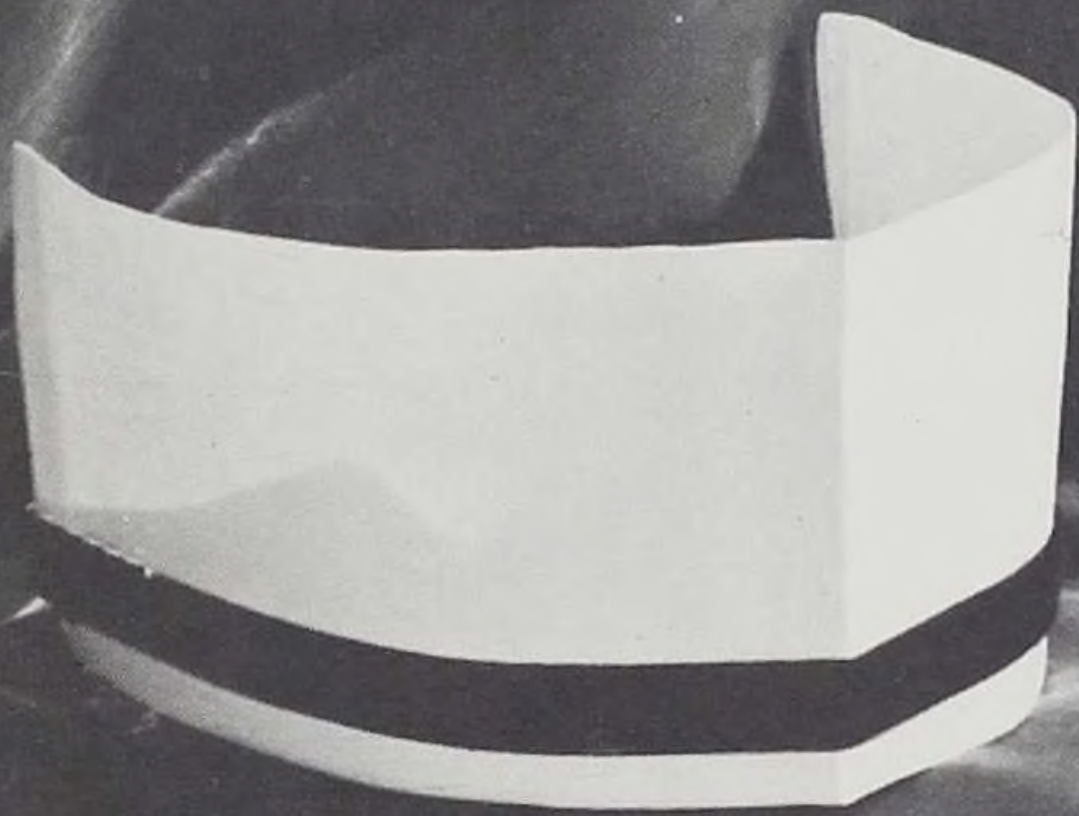
Another characteristic, honesty, also enters into everyday activities. A person who is honest, who has real personal integrity, has a deep sense of responsibility and lives up to her commitments.

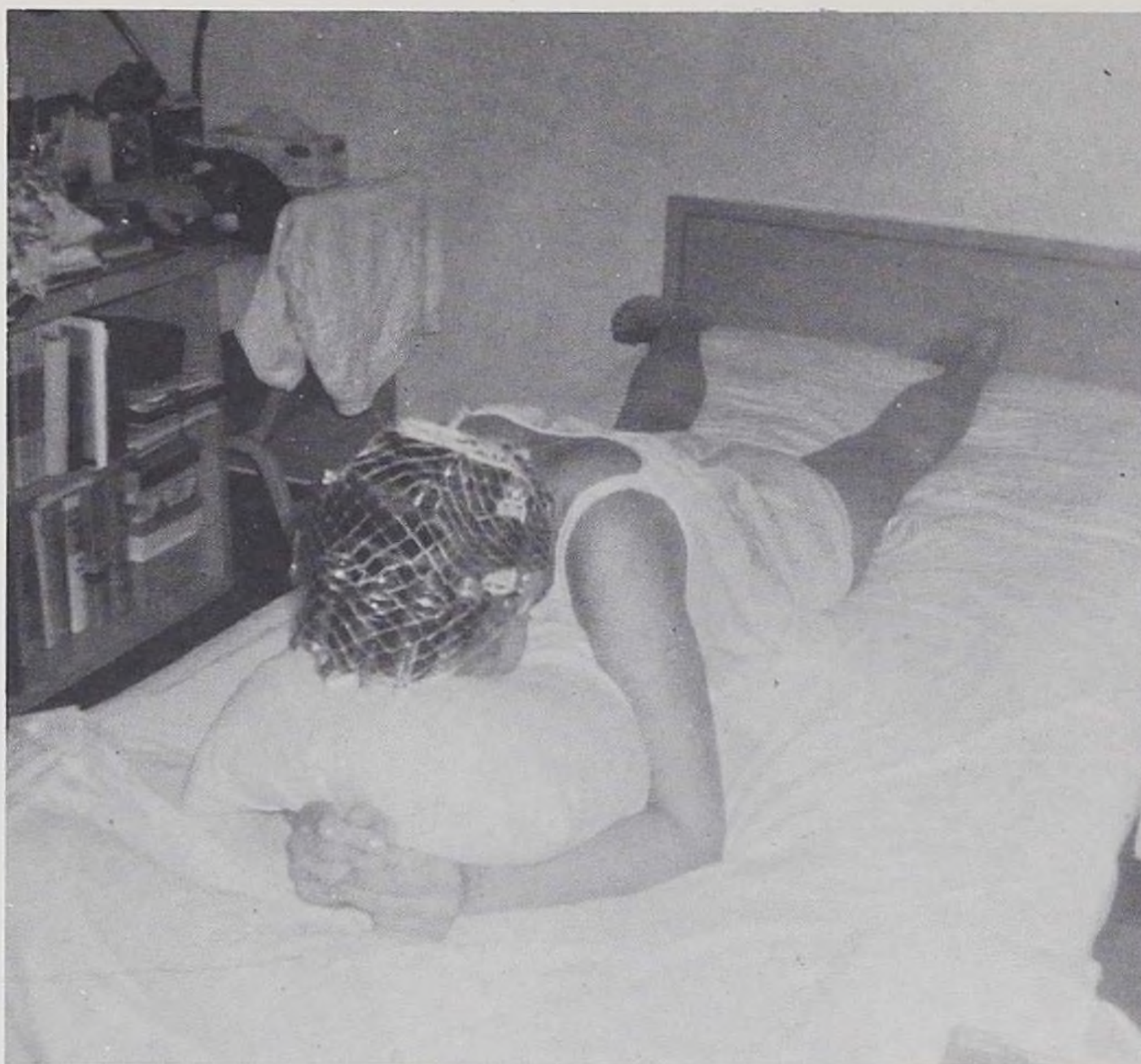

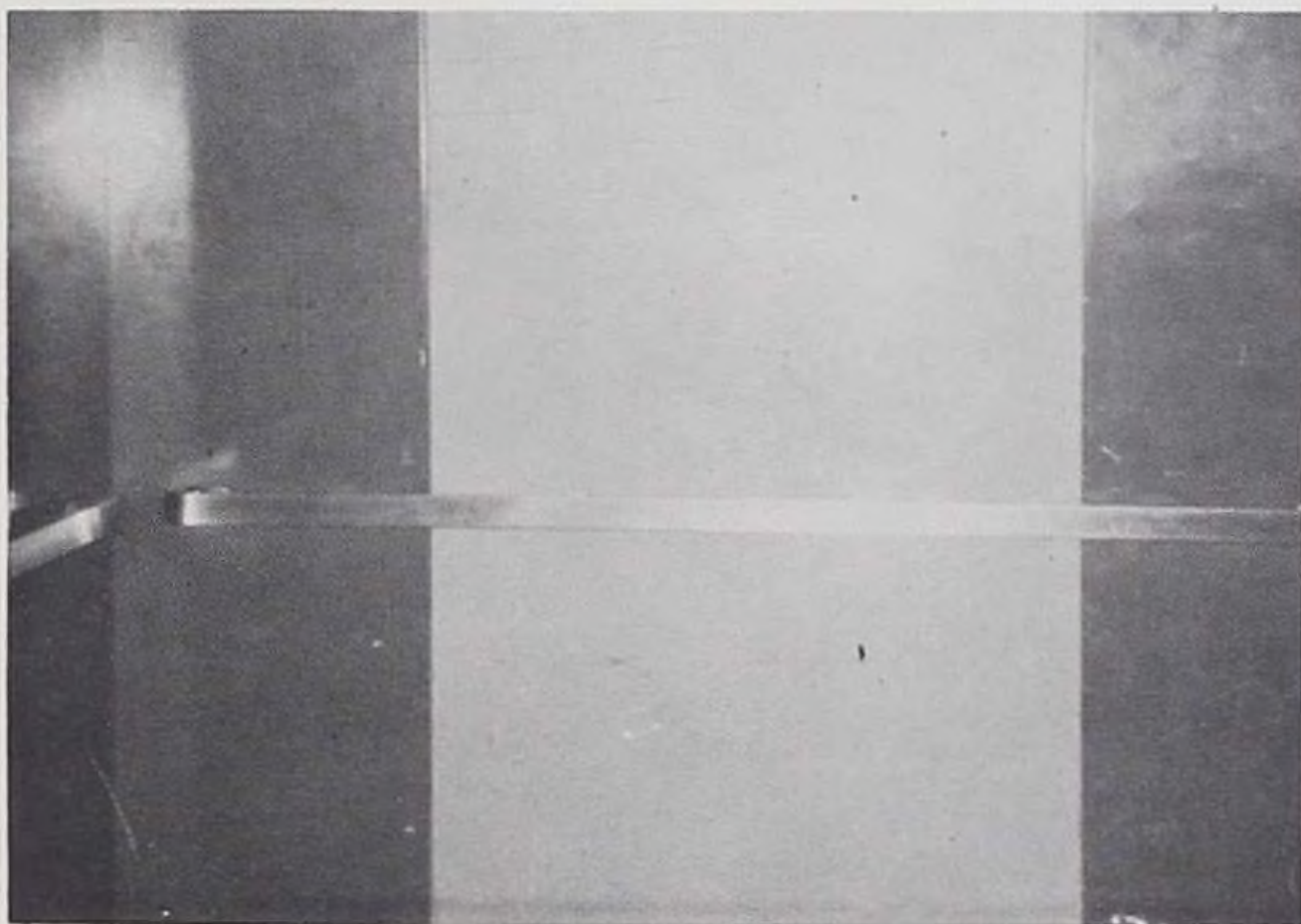
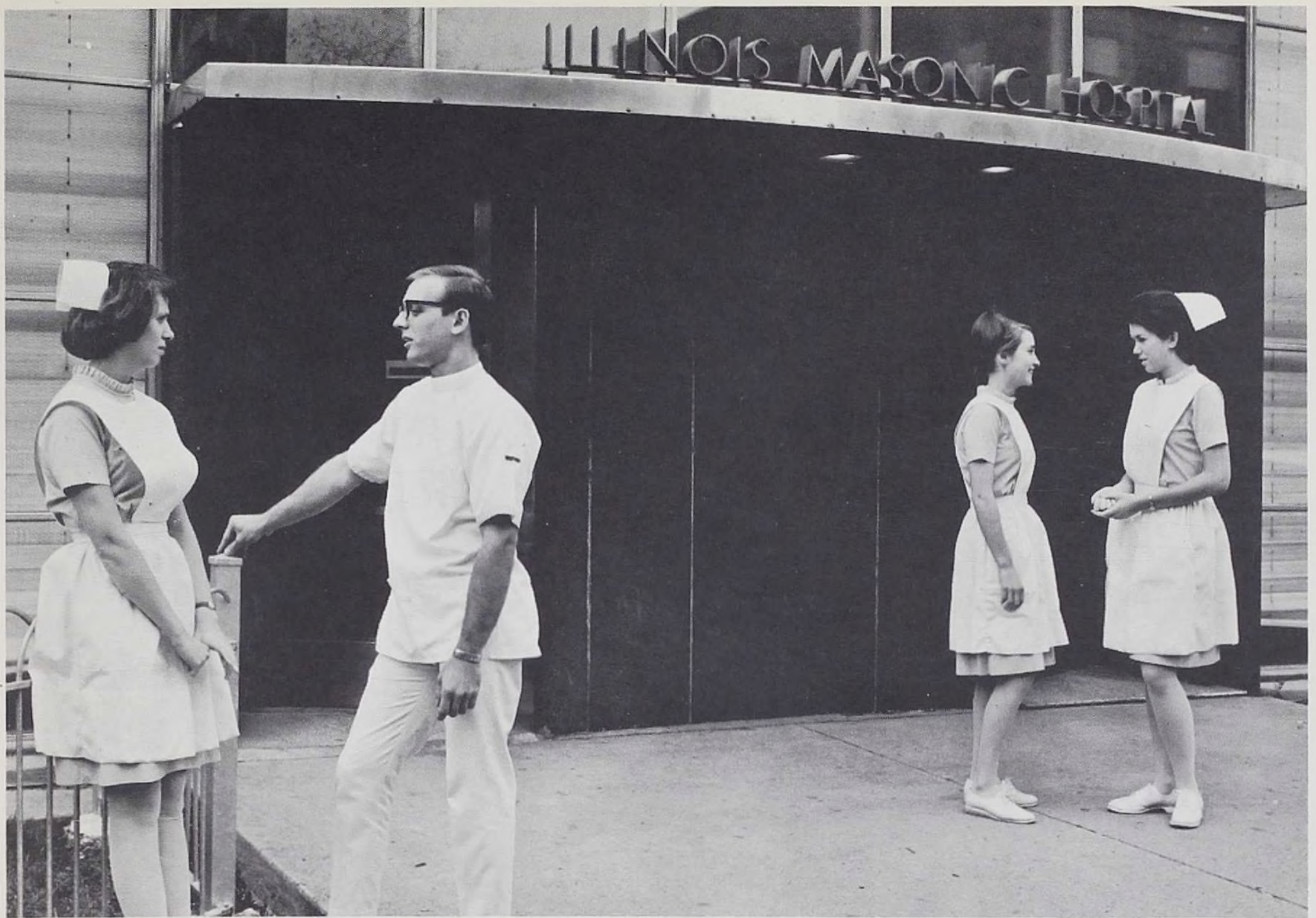


IN CHARGE OF THE FLOOR BRIGADE

sat the 200.

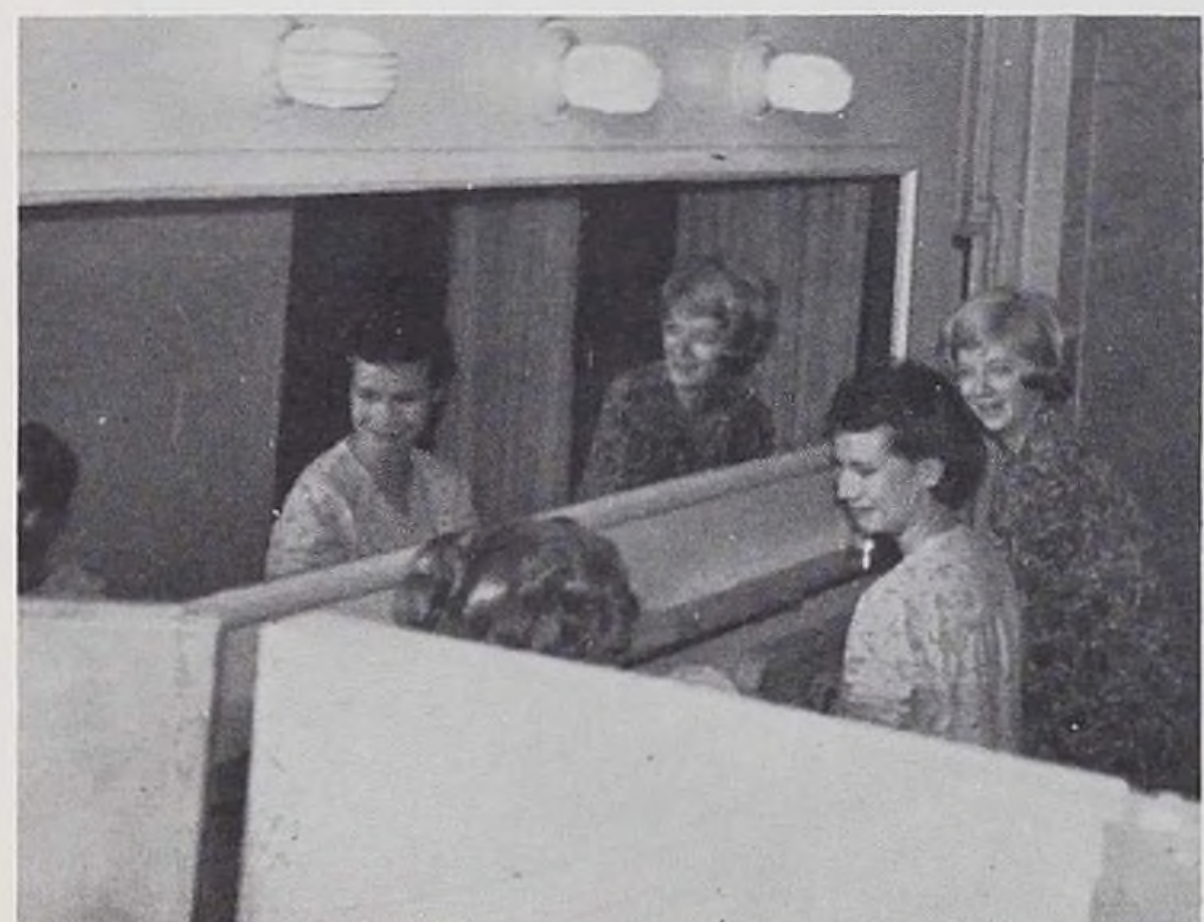
Forward the blue and white

Trod the 200.

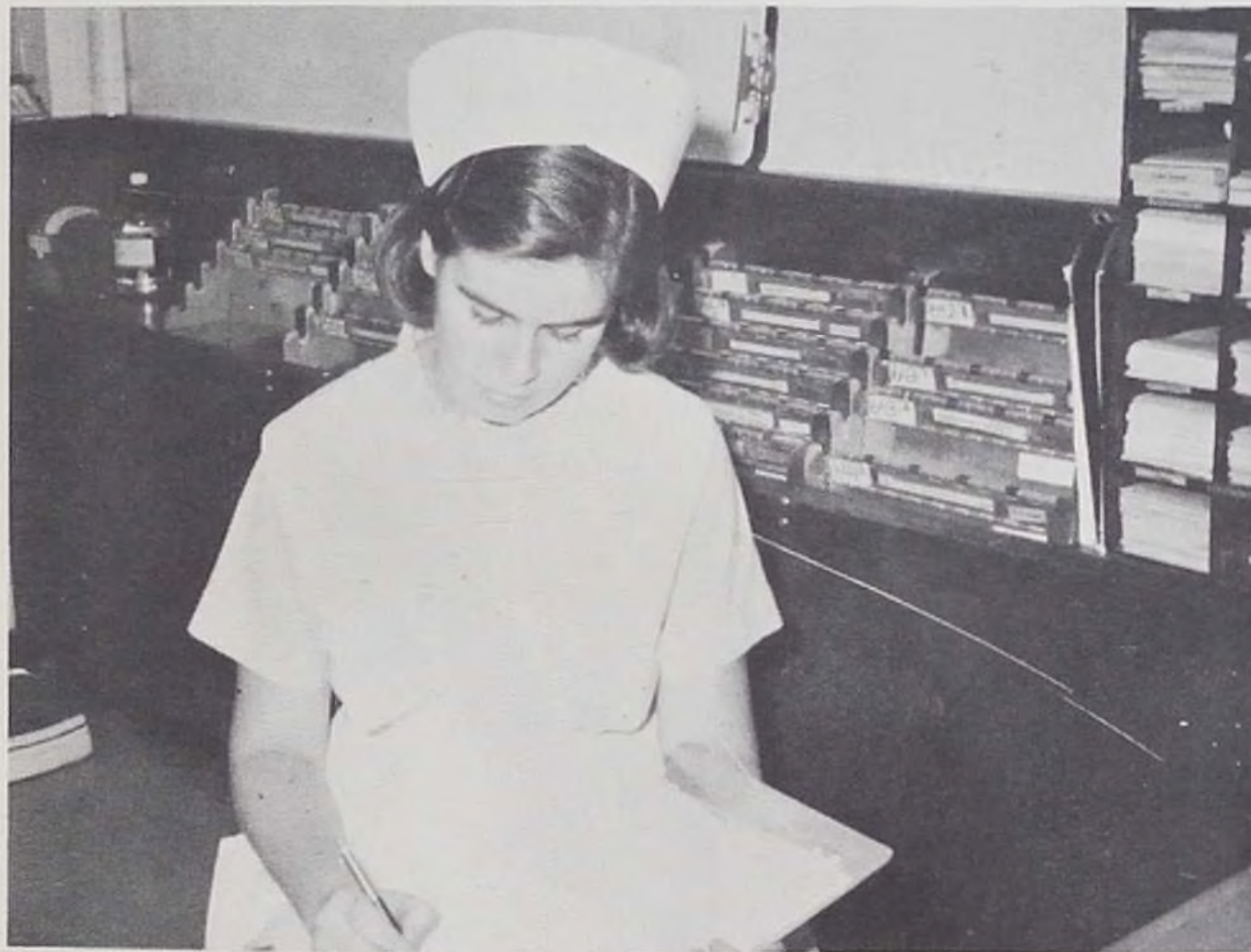






Patients to the right of them

 Not all 200.







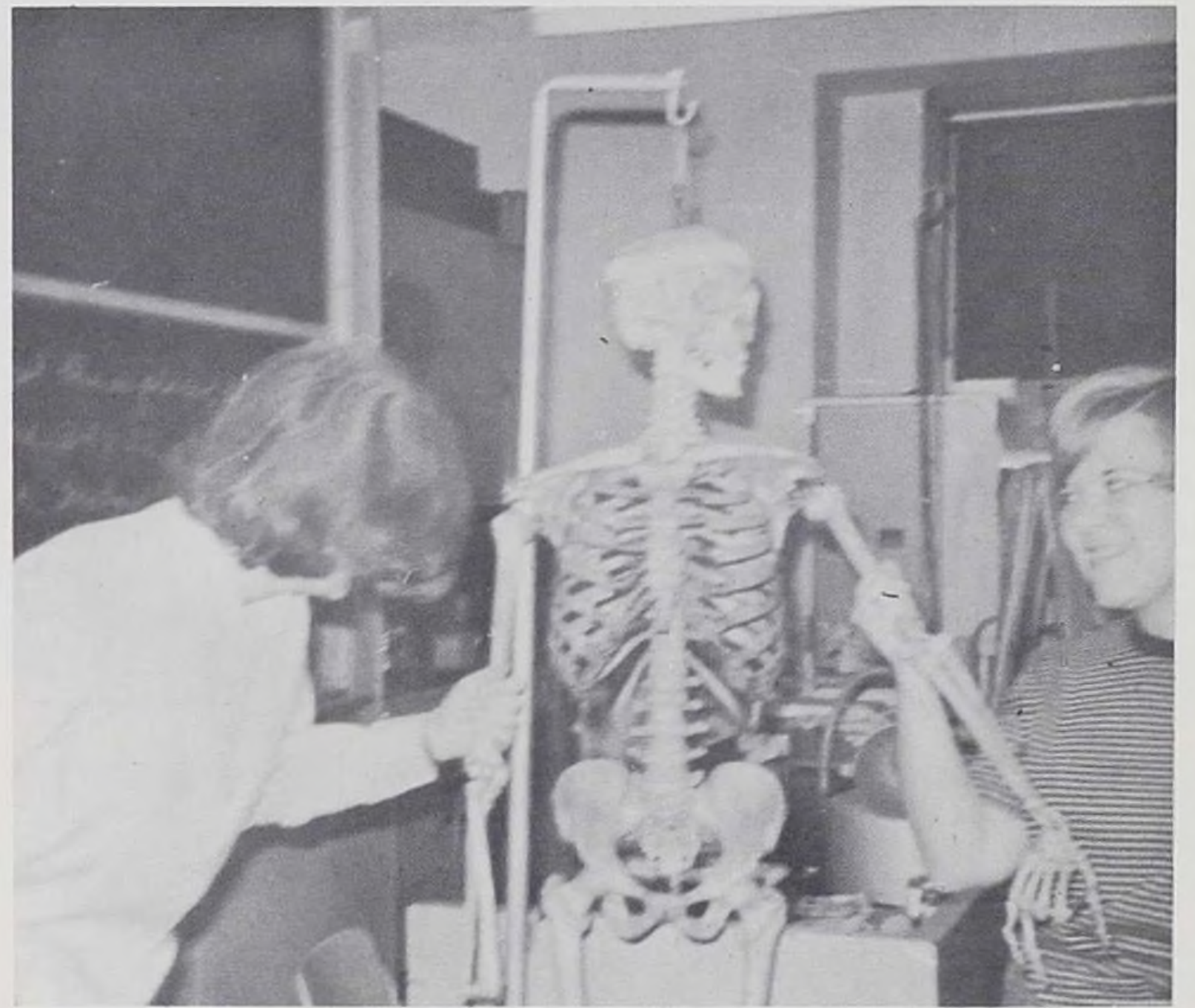
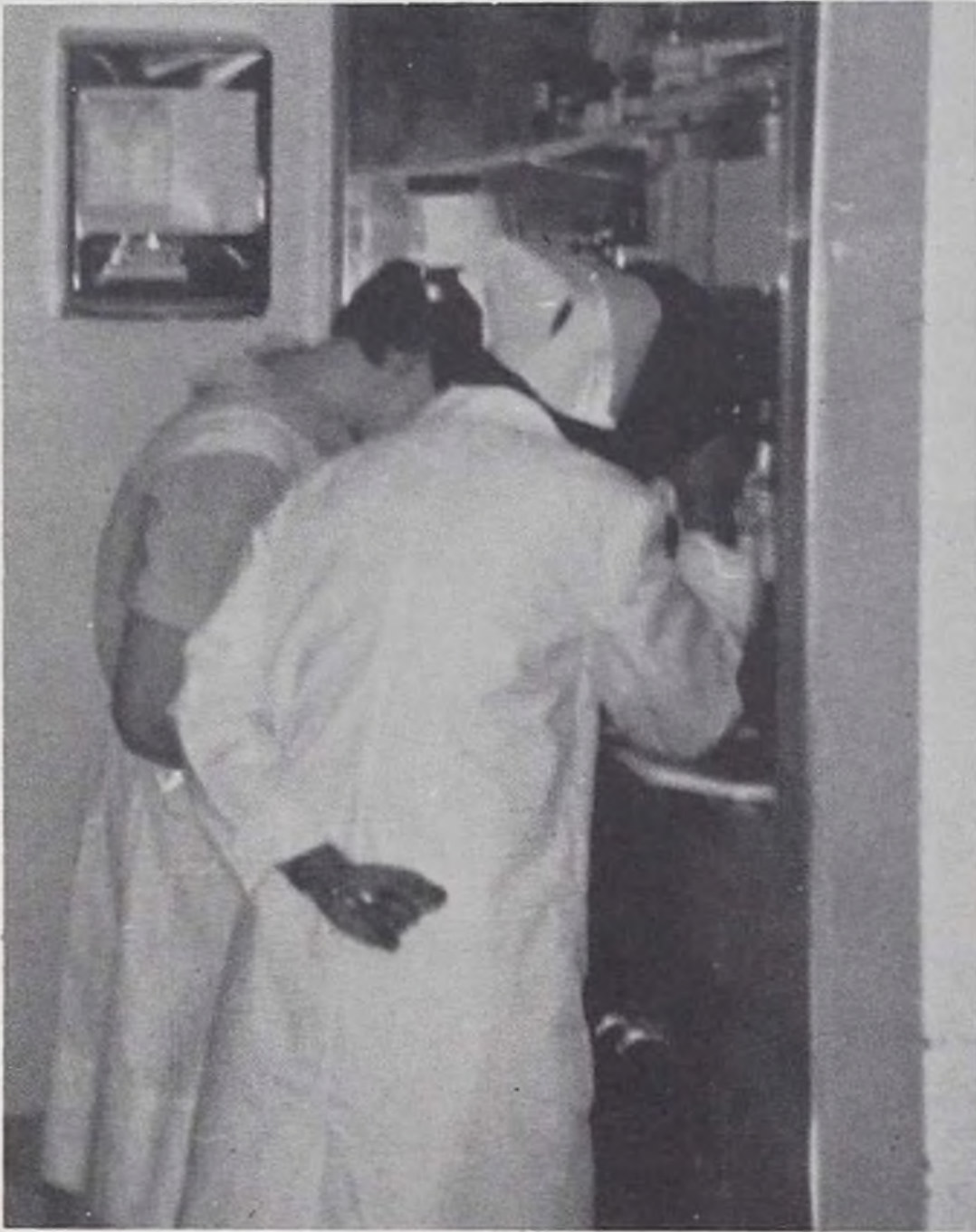


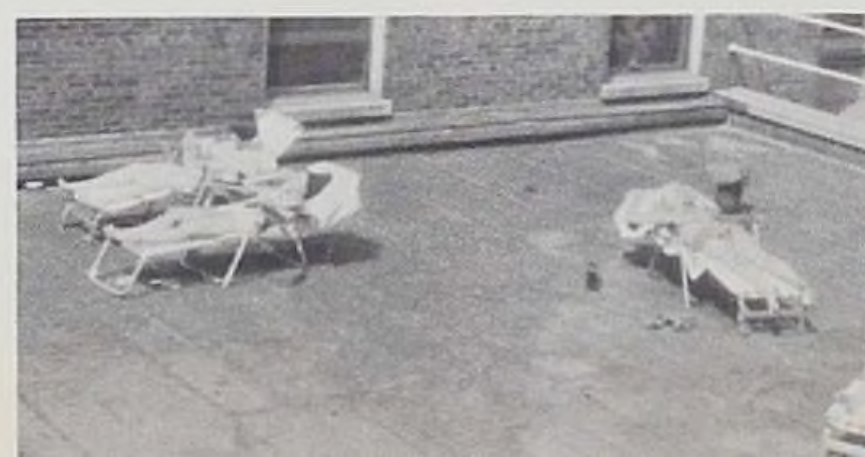
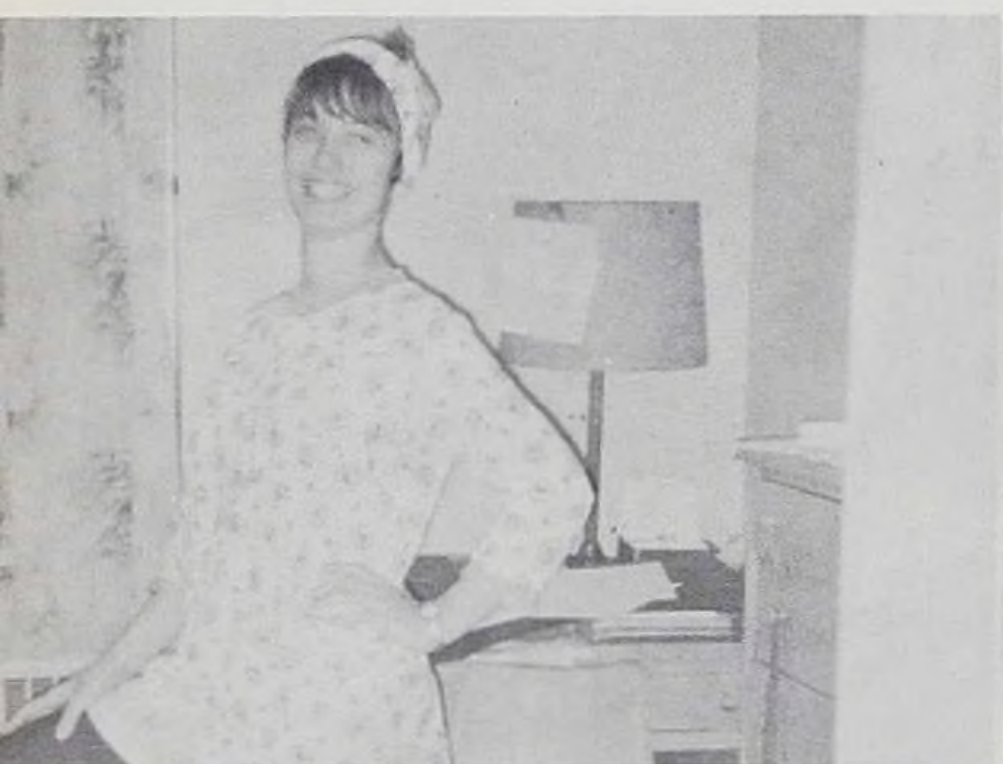
Doctors to the right of them

WHAT IS A STUDENT NURSE?

Student nurses are found everywhere . . . measuring from, pouring into, explaining to, asking for, laughing about, and sympathizing with. Doctors yell at them, residents overlook them, mothers worry about them, boyfriends adore them, patients love them, and heaven protects them.

A student nurse is courage under a cap, a smile in blue, energy that is endless, the best of young womanhood, and a modern Florence Nightengale. Just when she is gaining poise and prestige she drops a glass, breaks a syringe, or steps on a doctors' foot.

A student nurse is a composite. She has the appetite of a horse, the digestion of a sword swallower, the energy of a pocket sized A-bomb, the curiosity of a cat, the lungs of a dictator, the syness of a violet, the enthusiasm of a poker game, the endurance of a flagpole sitter, and the abilities of Florence Nightengale, Clara Barton and Linda Rogers, all rolled into one uniform.

To the head nurse she has the stability of mush, the fleetness of a small snail, the mentality of a mule, and is held together by starch, adhesive tape all strained nerves. To an alumnae she will never work as hard, carry more trays, make more beds, or scrub on more cases than her predecessors.

A student nurse likes: days off, boys her age, the O.R., specialties, certain doctors, pretty clothes, and pizza. She's not much for washing dishes, riding buses, writing nursing care plans, wearing girdles, or eating chicken with a knife and fork. Nobody else gets so much fun out of watching a non-smoker puff on her first Newport or preparing Mrs. Chase for the undertaker. No one else can cram into one uniform pocket a pad of paper, six safety pins, a bandage scissors, a half pack of peppermint lifesavers, eight cigarettes, thirty-two cents in loose change, a roll of adhesive tape, and a catheter clamp. A student nurse is a wonderful creature; you can criticize her, but you can't discourage her. You can hurt her feelings, but she doesn't give up. Might as well admit it . . . she is your personal hospital representative, your living symbol of faith and sympathetic care.

She may not be Elizabeth Taylor, but she is an example of the American way. She is measured by a professional yardstick that evaluates her ability to make a bed, apply a bandage, or sacrifice her time to ease the pain of a patient, simply for the satisfaction of a job well done.

Whenever she becomes discouraged, or the lamp gets heavy, she should remember that there is a reward for her . . . because . . . surely some of God's angels wear white caps instead of halos, and carry medicine trays instead of harps.

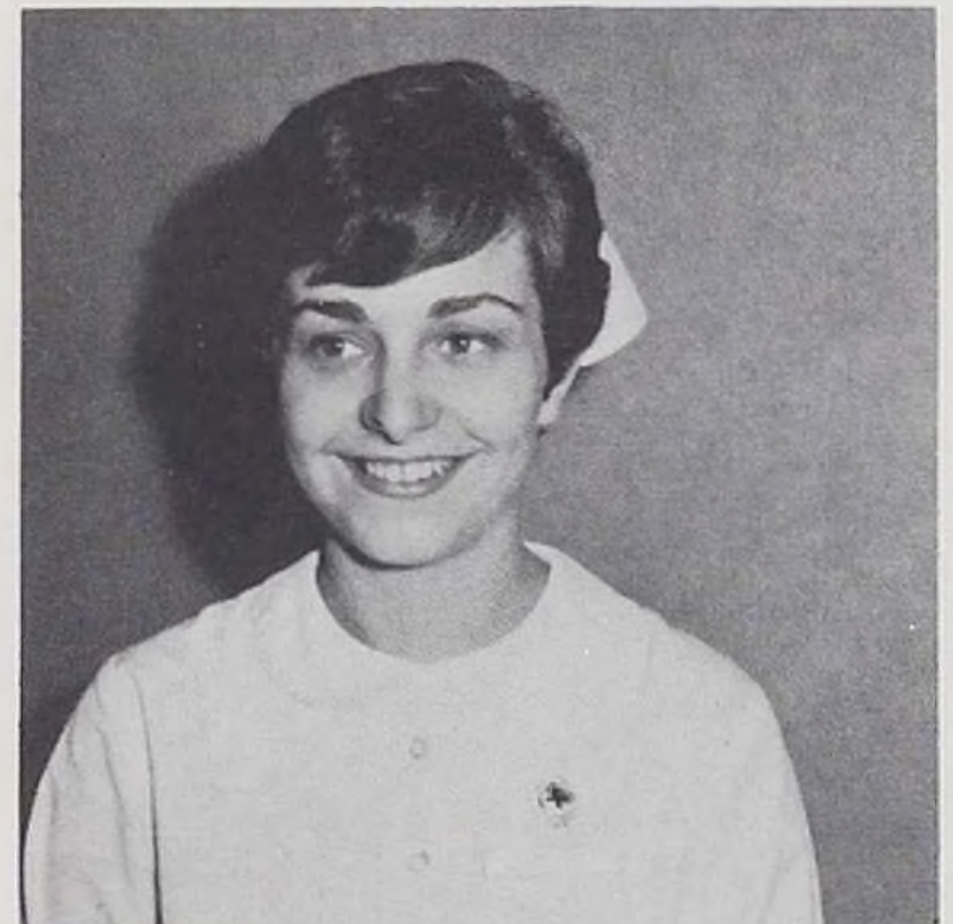

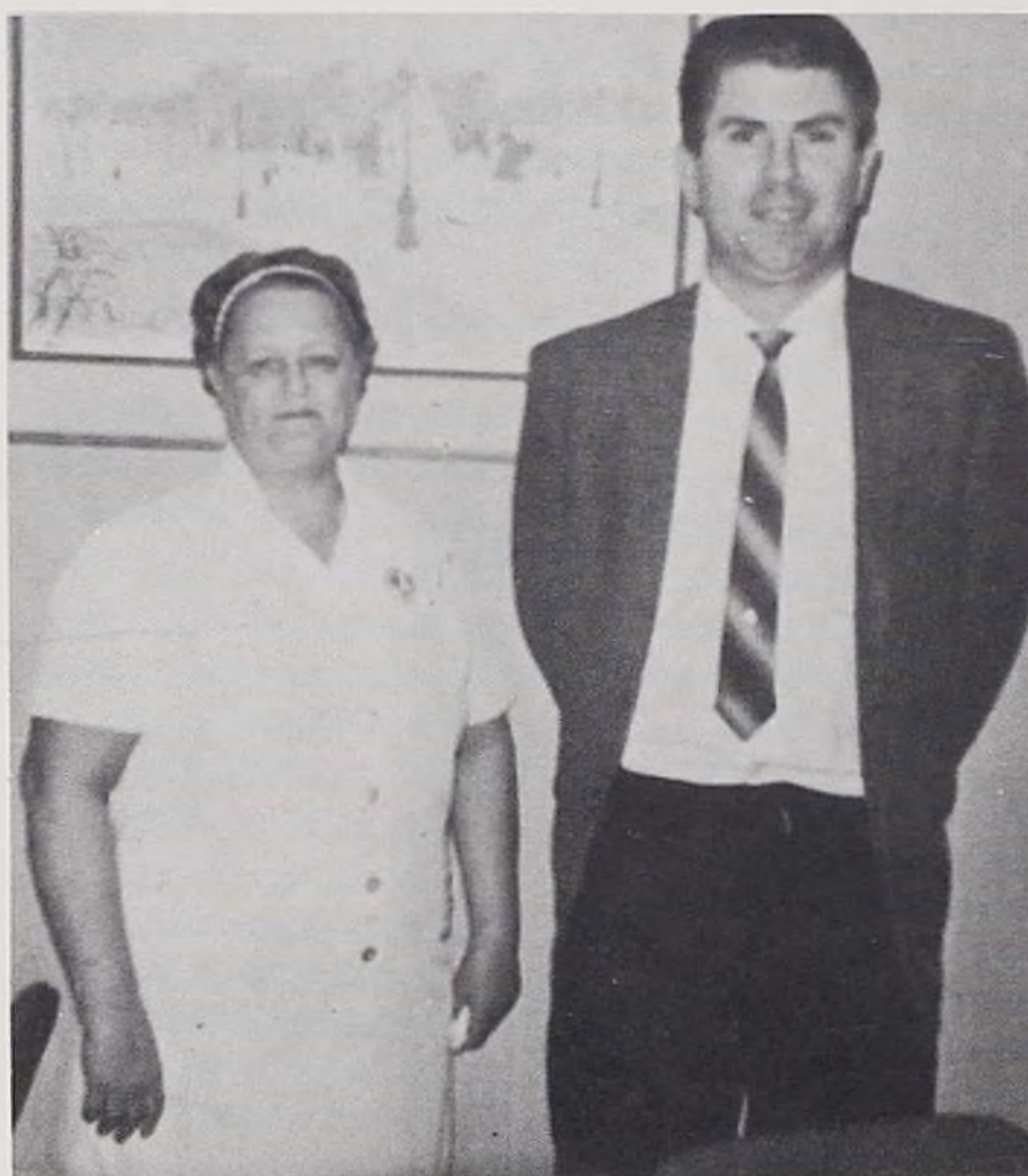
