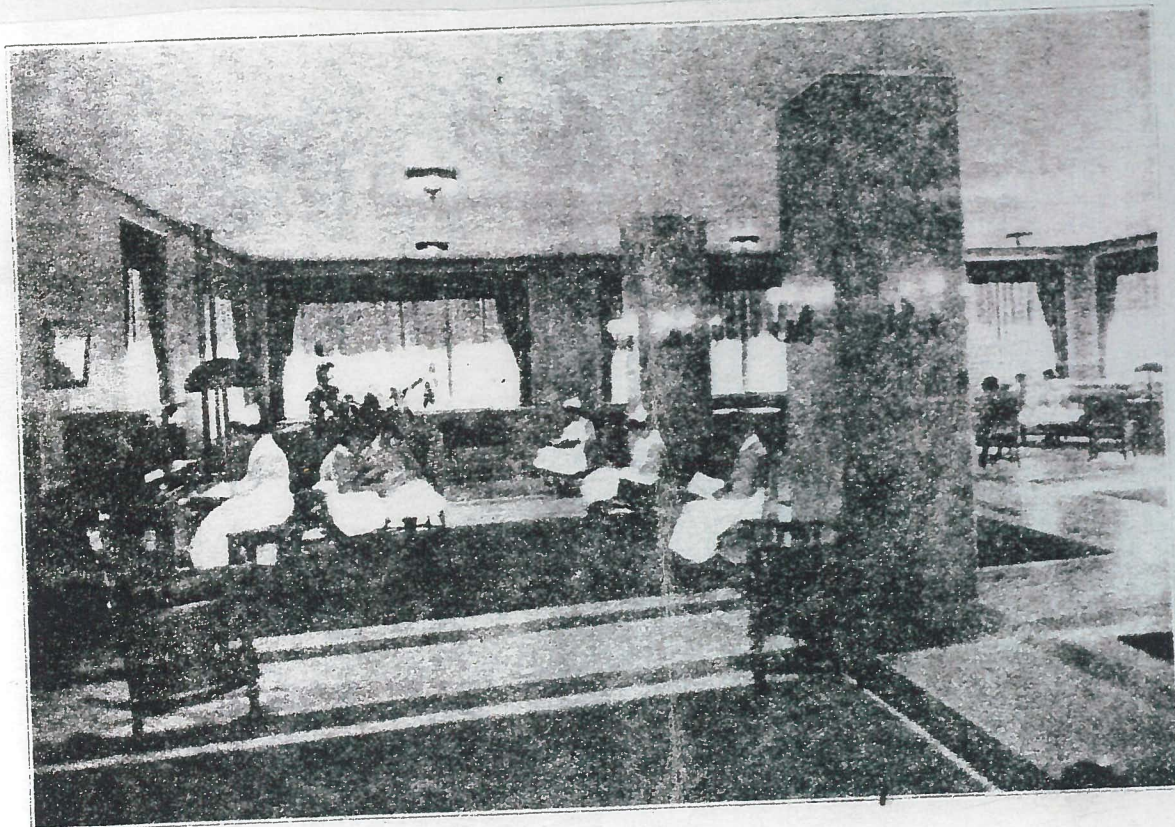

Letter Tells Homecoming Joy That Nurse Knows So Briefly

No one could blame Lt. Georgia Fuksa, an army nurse, for being happy when she returned to the

United States by plane Friday after 32 months in Australia and New Guinea. Although troubled by a severe skin infection, she had another nurse write a letter to her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Lambert Fuksa, 3960 N. 25th st., and her sister, Mrs. Marion Jakus, to express her joy at arriving at

Hamilton field, California. "Don't be troubled by the hospital deal," she wrote, "because everything is pretty much under control." She added that they should not worry because the letter was not in her handwriting, explaining about the skin infection.

"Had a marvelous trip to the good old USA and believe me it's wonderful to land on home soil."

The letter arrived in Milwaukee Monday morning, but it had been preceded by a telegram and a telephone call from Hamilton field. Late Saturday the telegram came, notifying her family that Lt. Fuksa was in "critical condition."

The telephone call, two hours later, reported that she was dead.

Lt. Fuksa, 26 years old, was one of the first Milwaukee nurses to enter the service. A graduate of North Division high school, she completed nurses training at Mount Sinai hospital in 1938. She worked at the soldiers' home until February, 1941, when she entered the army nurse corps.

After serving at Camp Grant, Ill., for a year, Lt. Fuksa volunteered for overseas duty, and was sent to Australia in February, 1942. She later went to New Guinea.

Funeral arrangements have been delayed pending the arrival of the body from California.



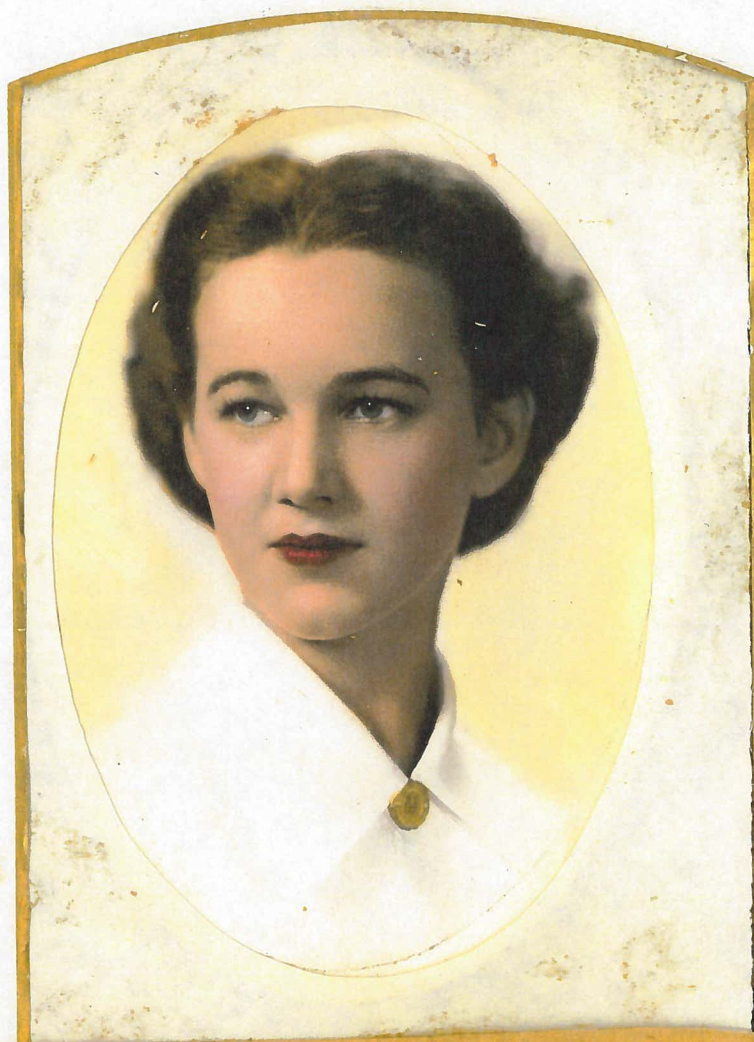
