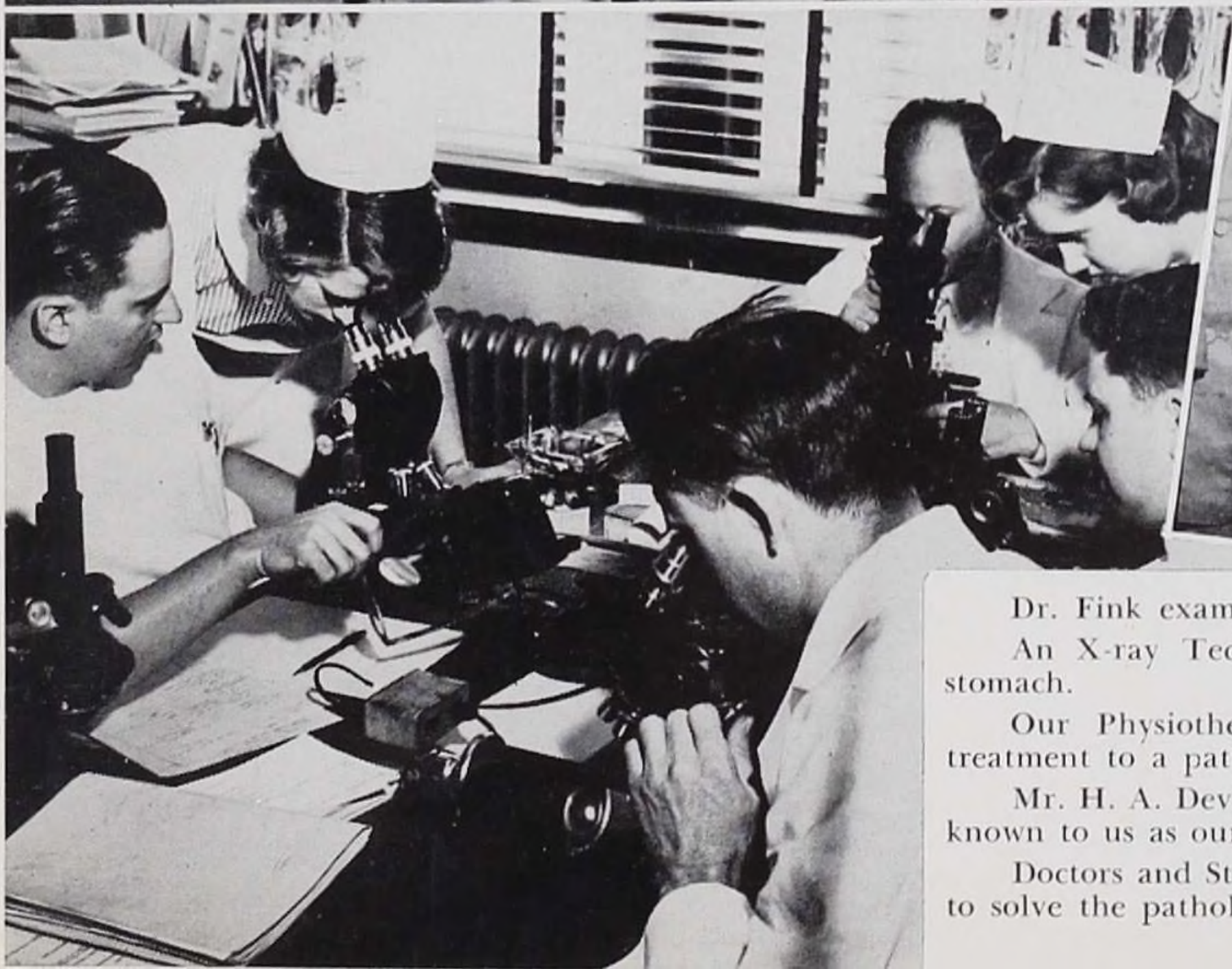
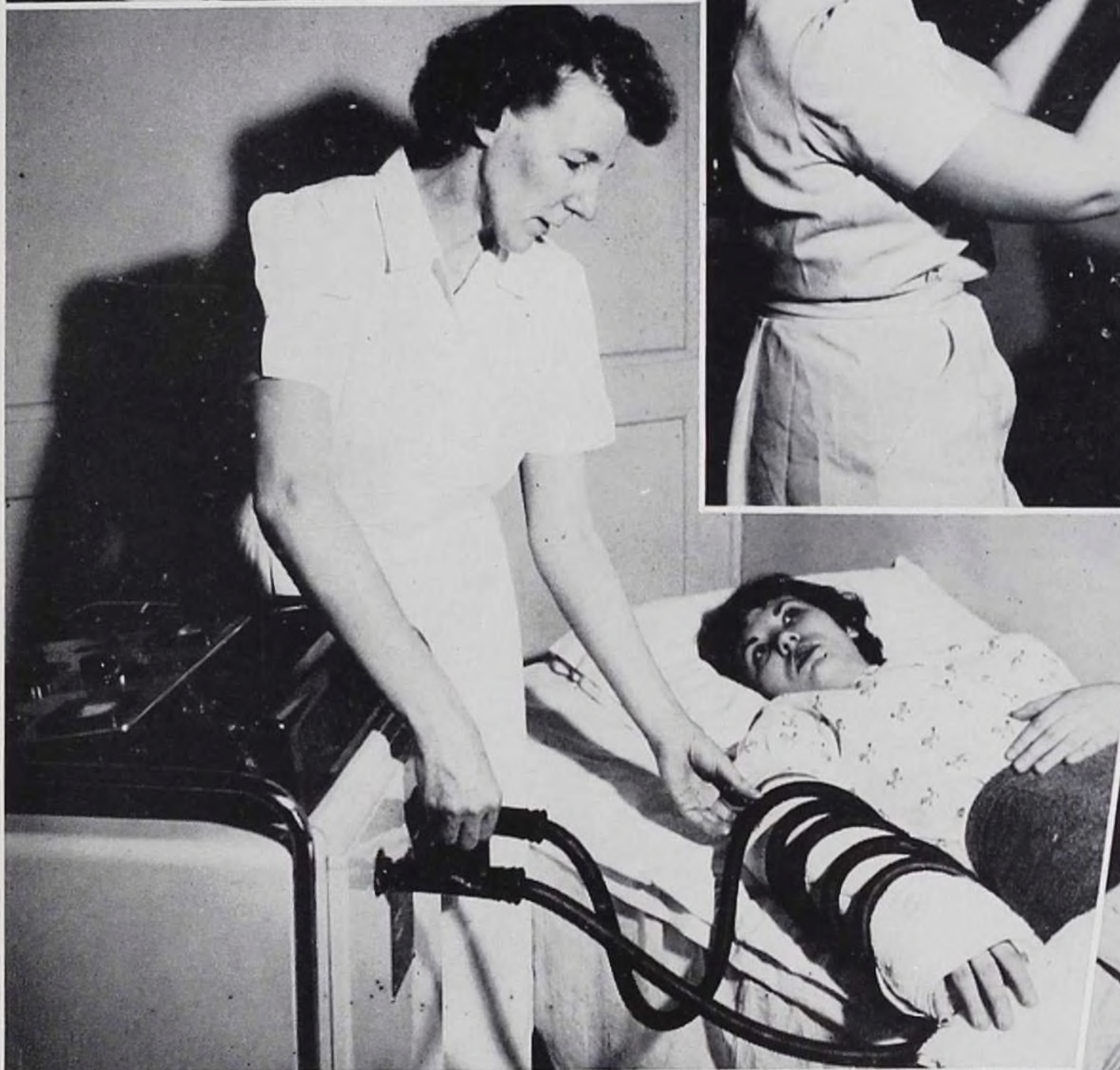
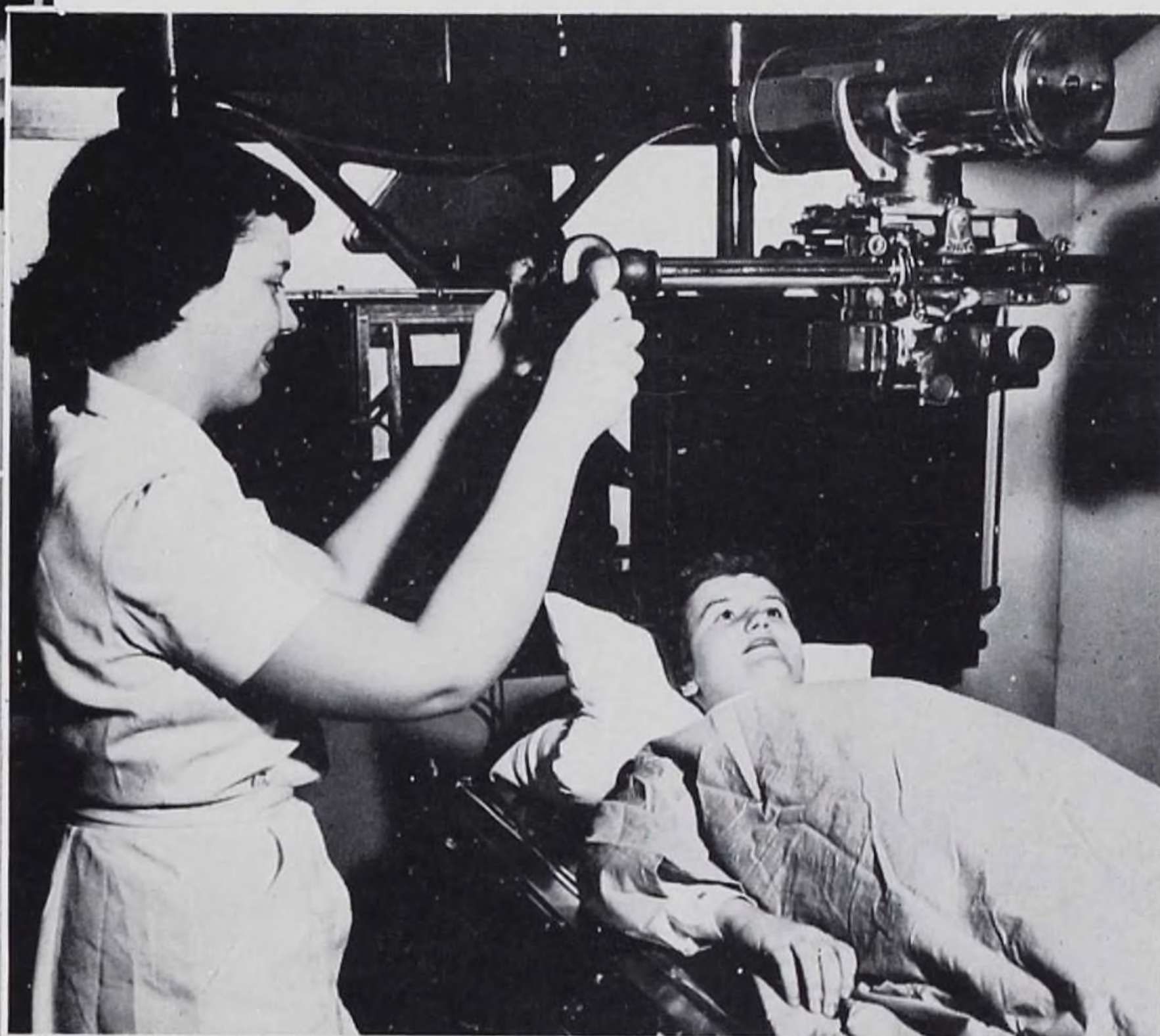
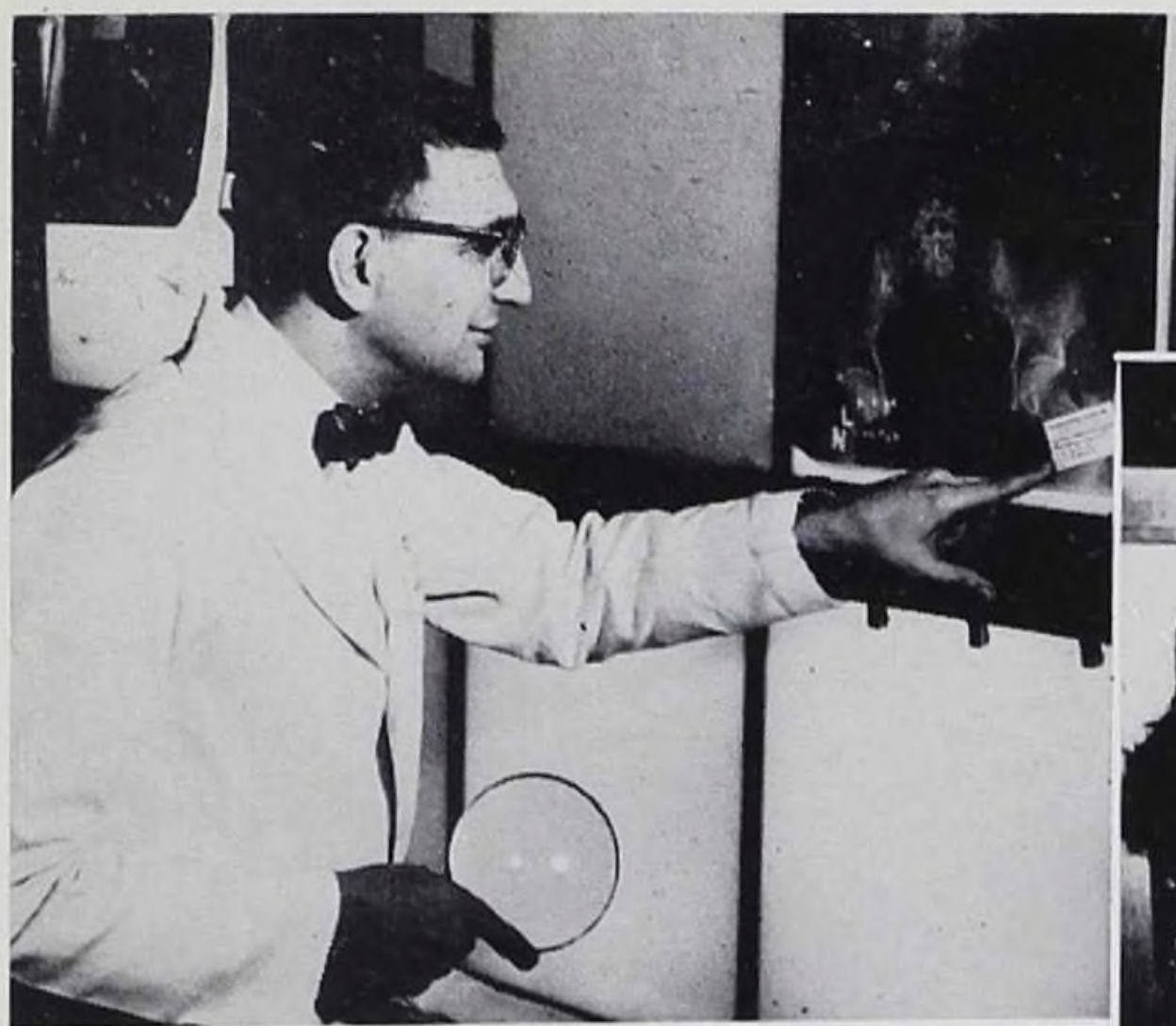
In Central Supply, the nucleus of many patients' services, needle preparation which you see here plays a major part in the daily program.

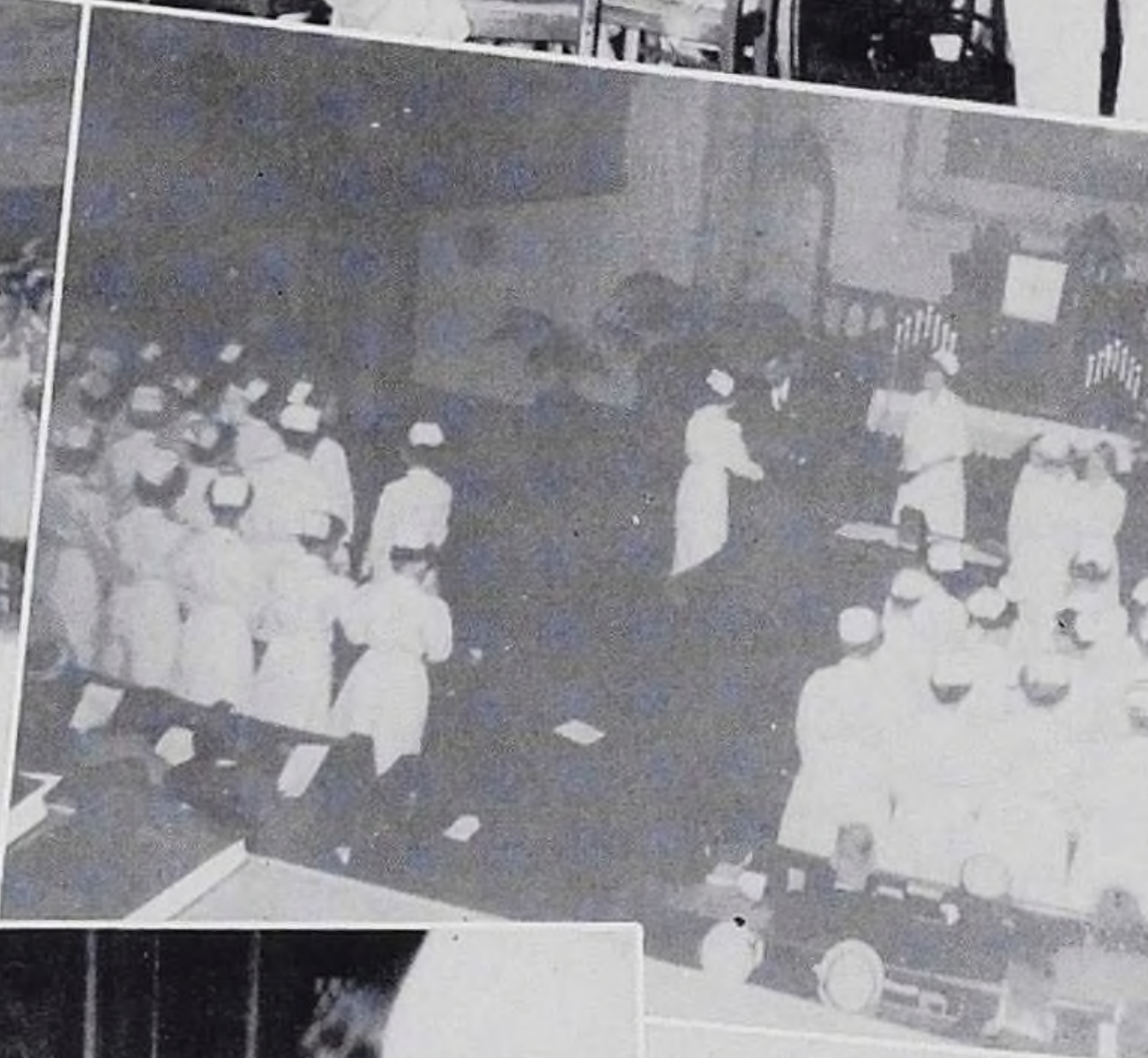

When a graceful classmate fell over backwards in a chair during an exam.

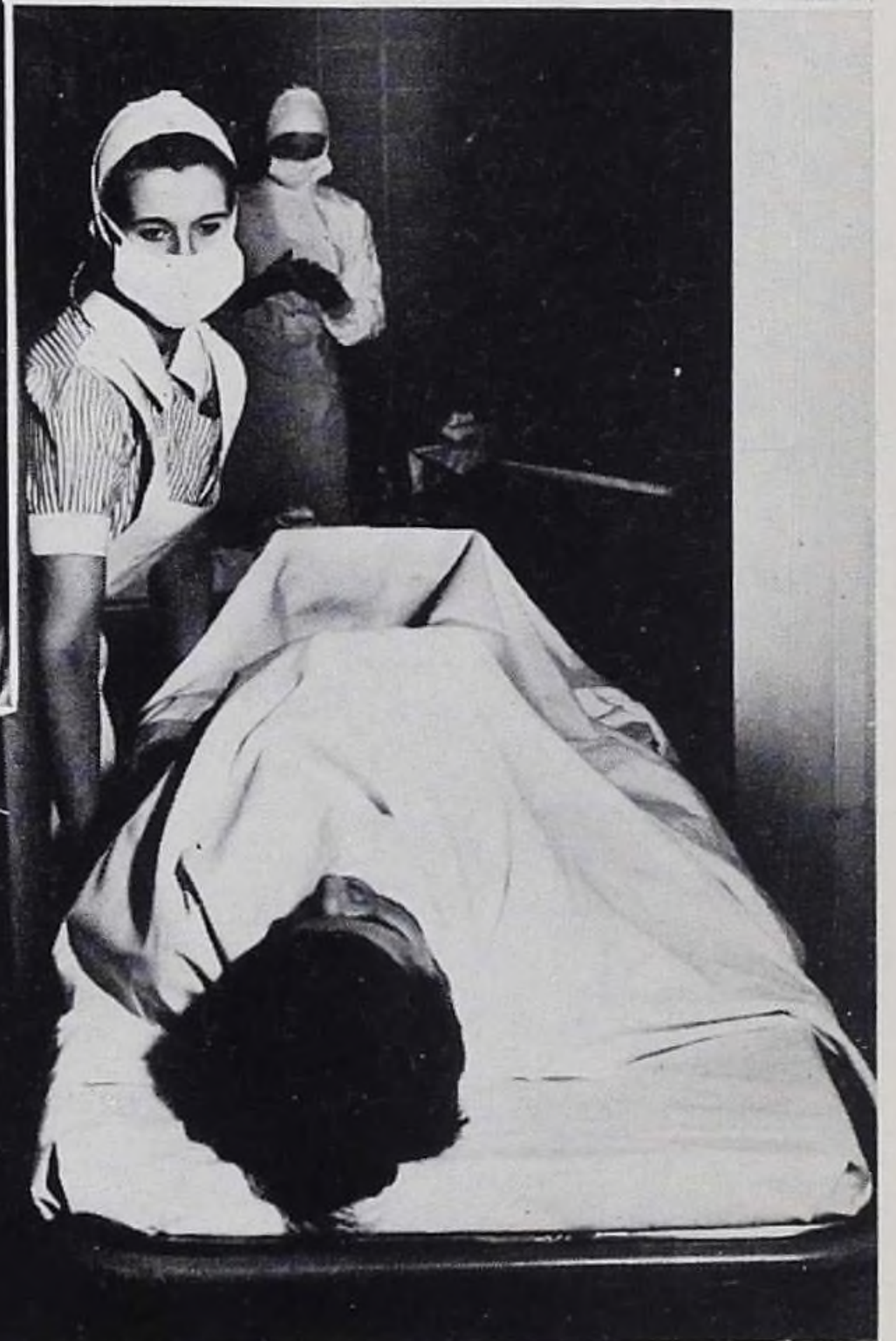
The first time we were on the floors and Jackie Hayes mistook the dinner plate cover for the top of a urinal.

The friendship, kindness and encouragement given us by Miss Schwan.





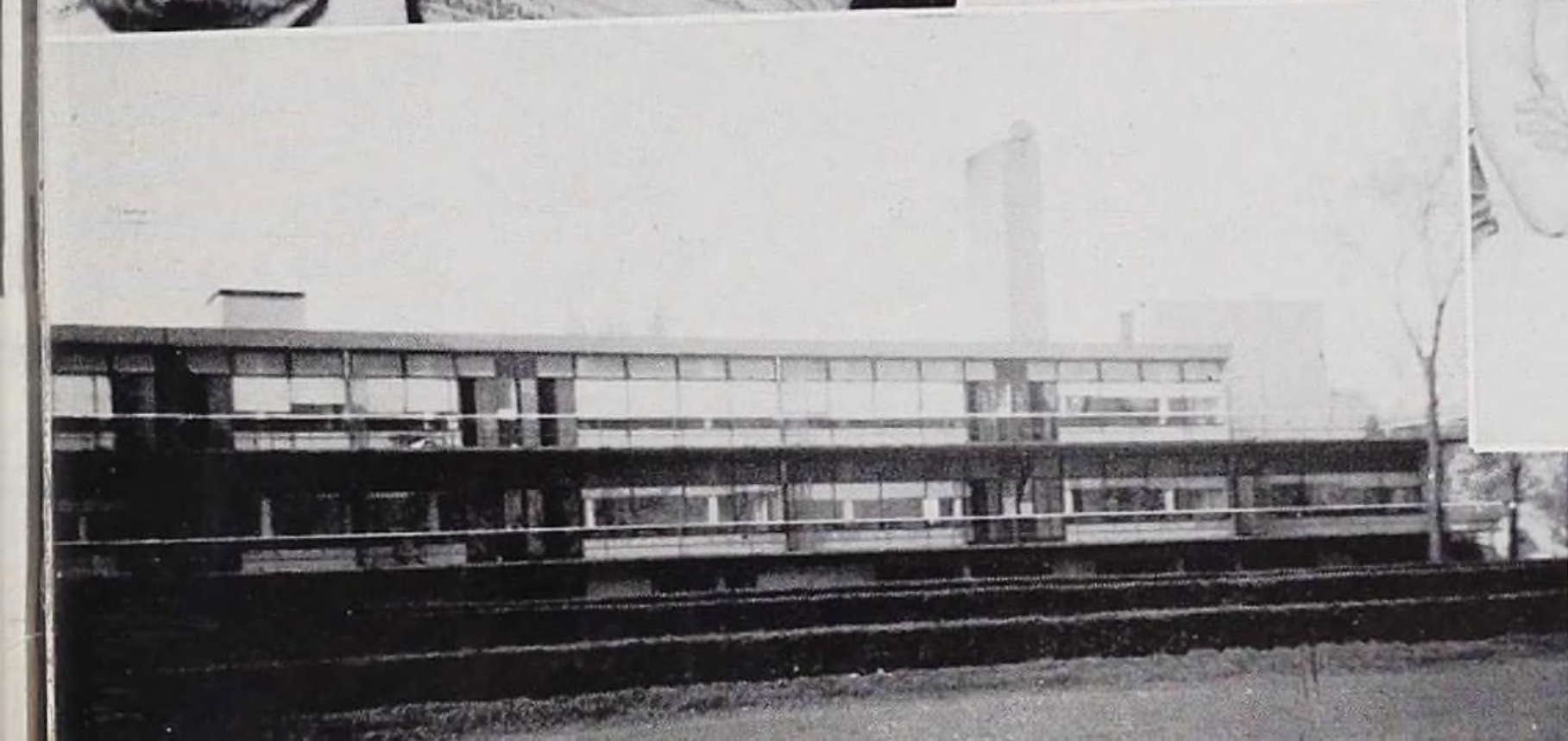
