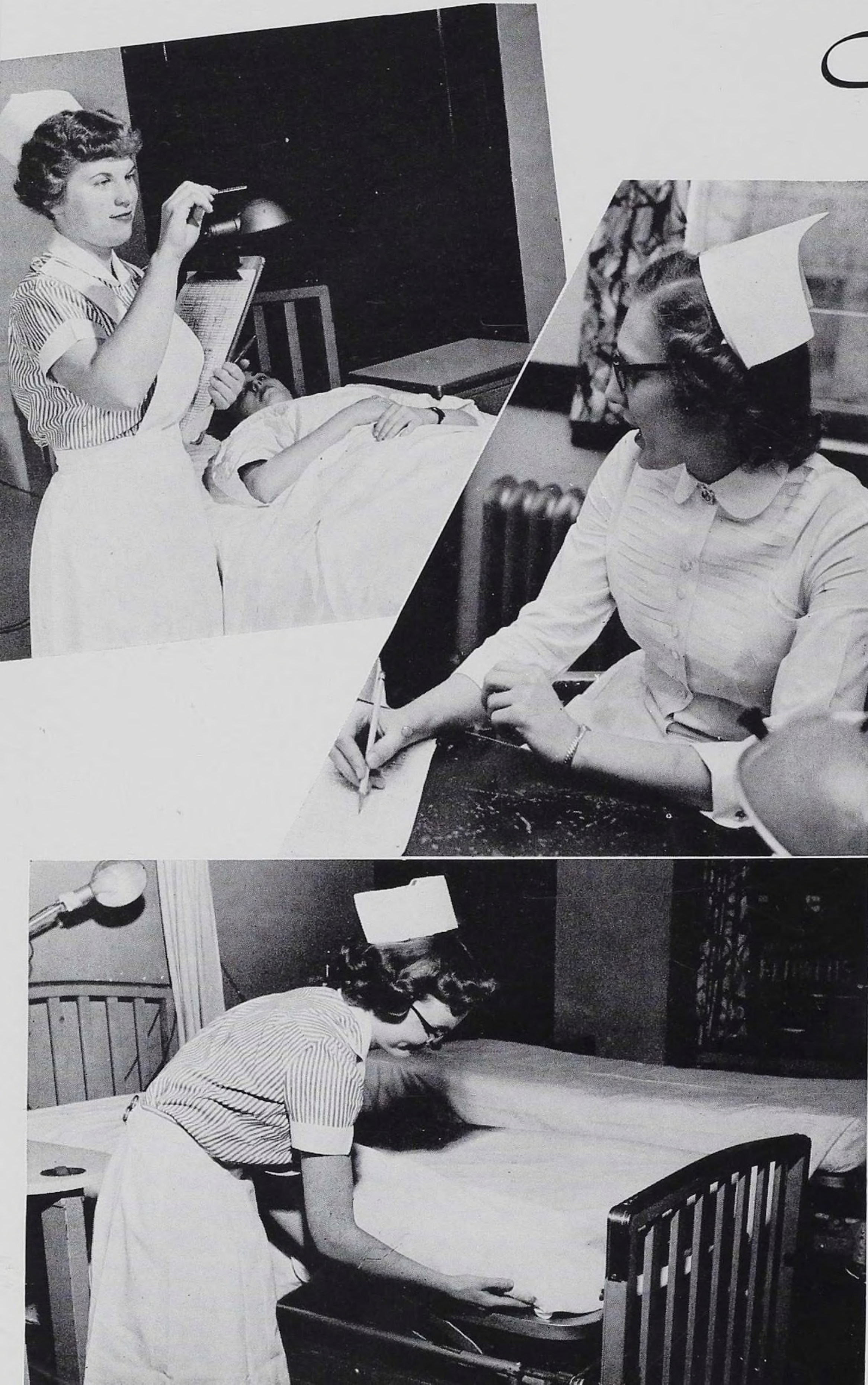
FRESHMAN CLASS HISTORY

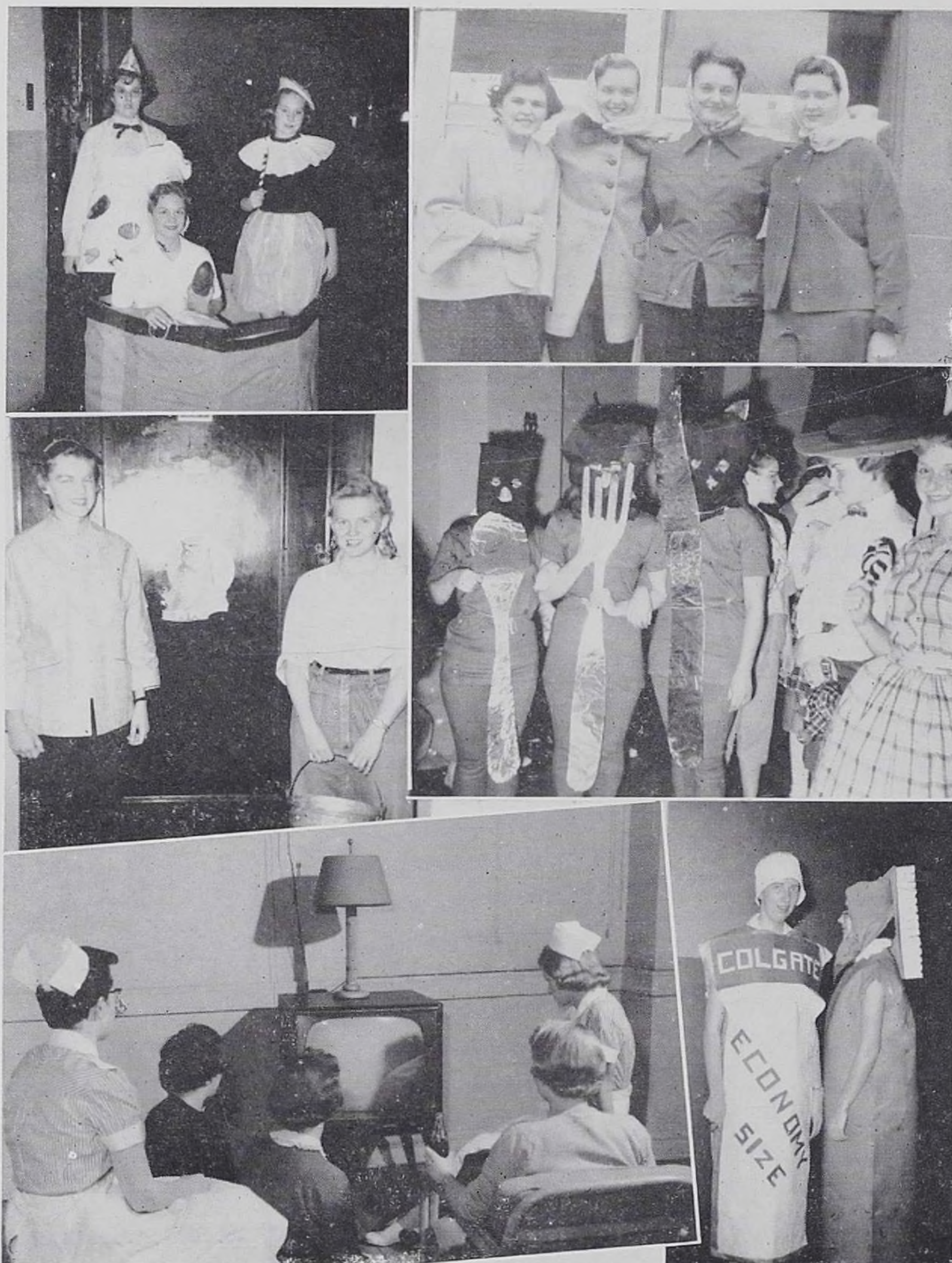

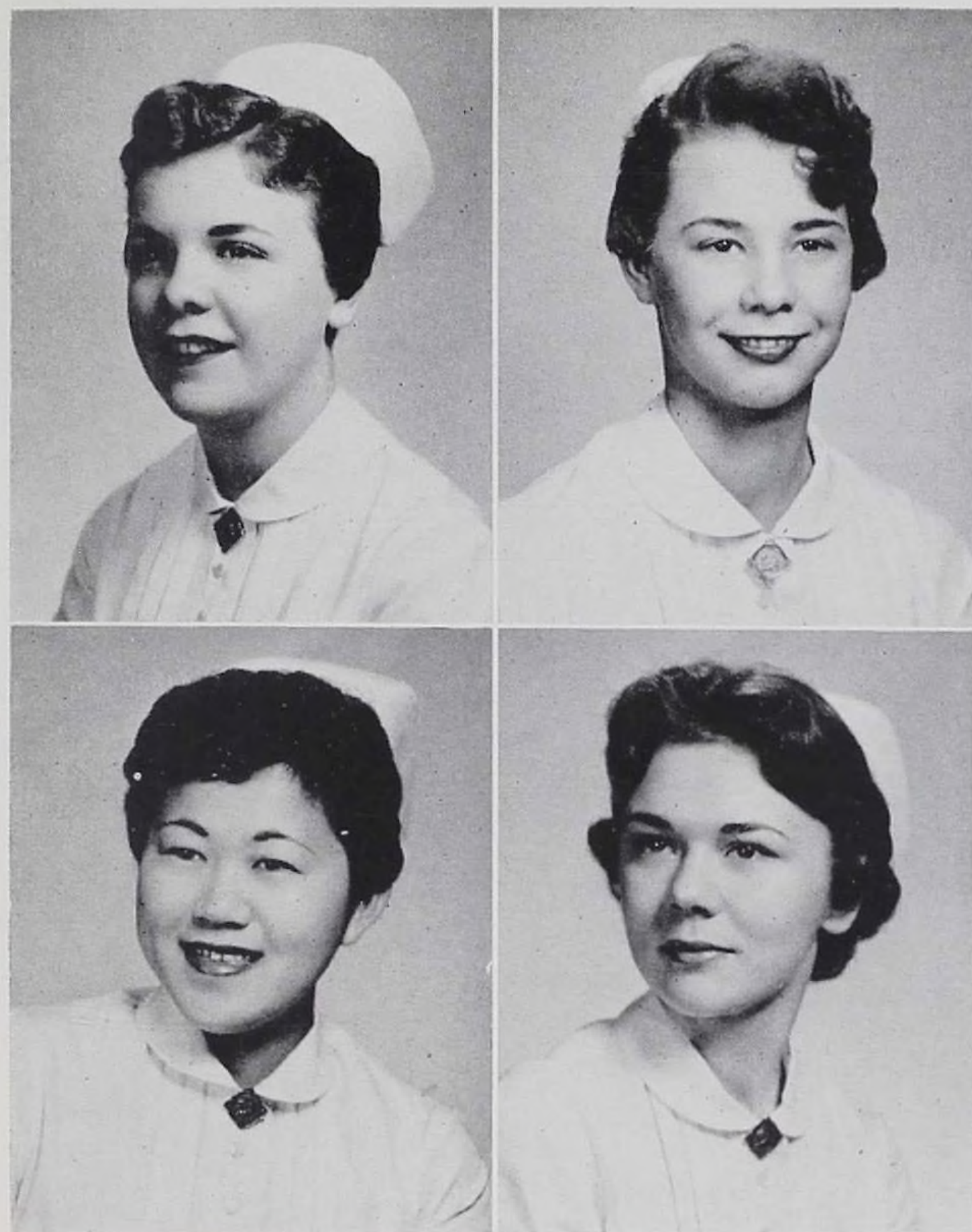
