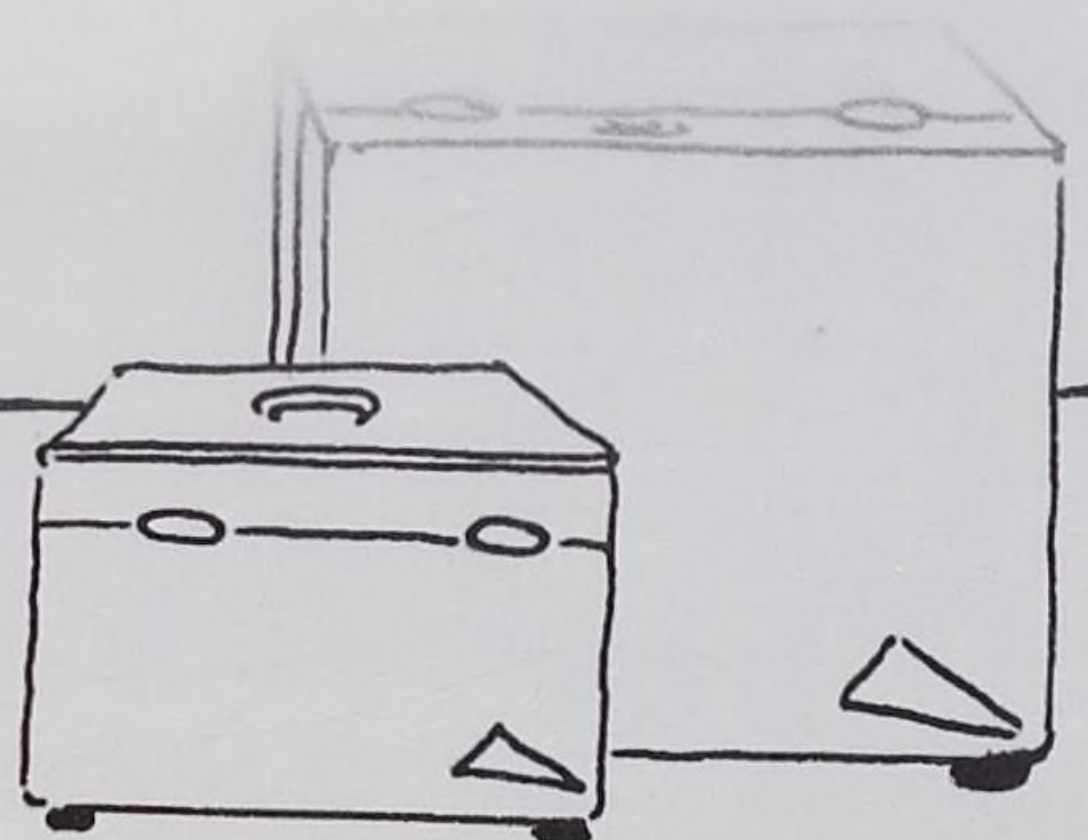
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# DEAR DIARY,

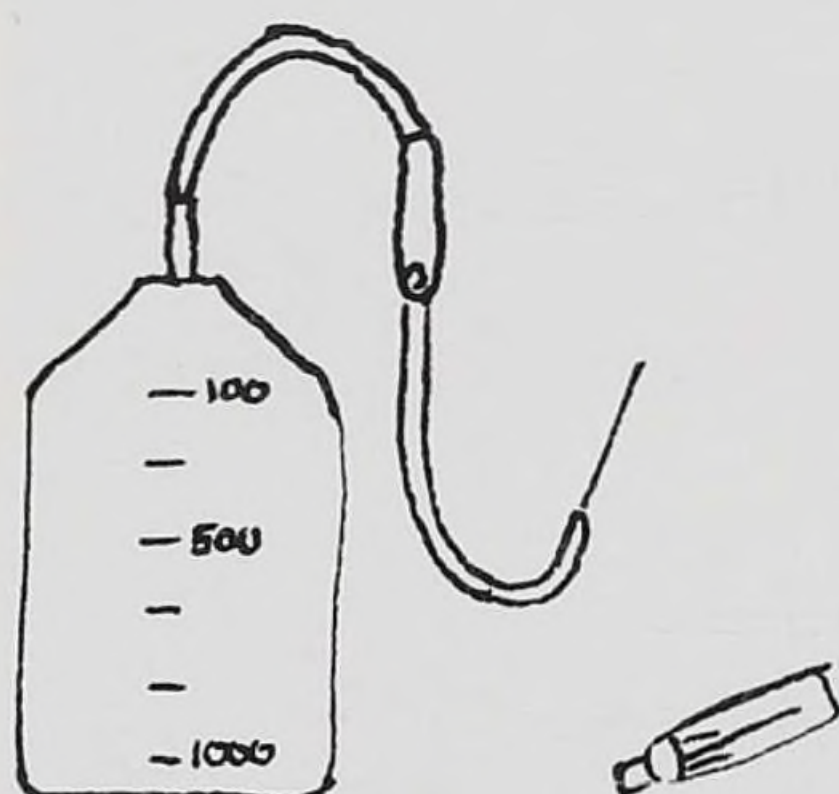
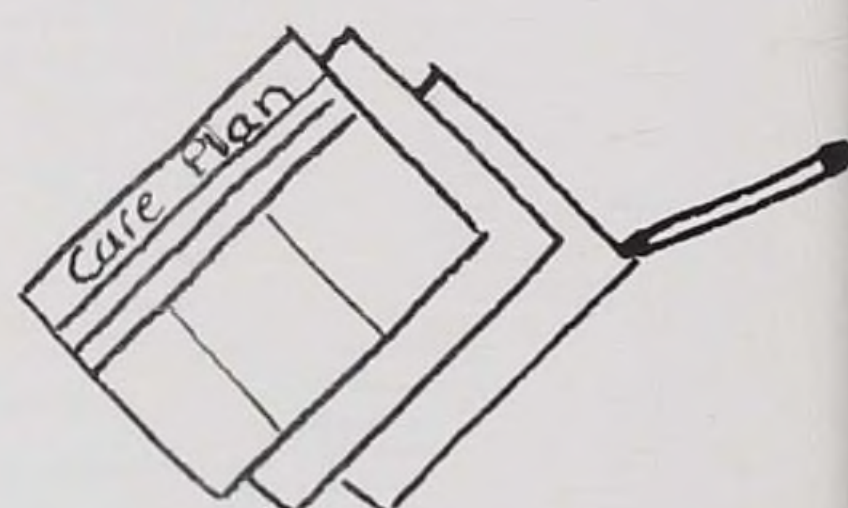
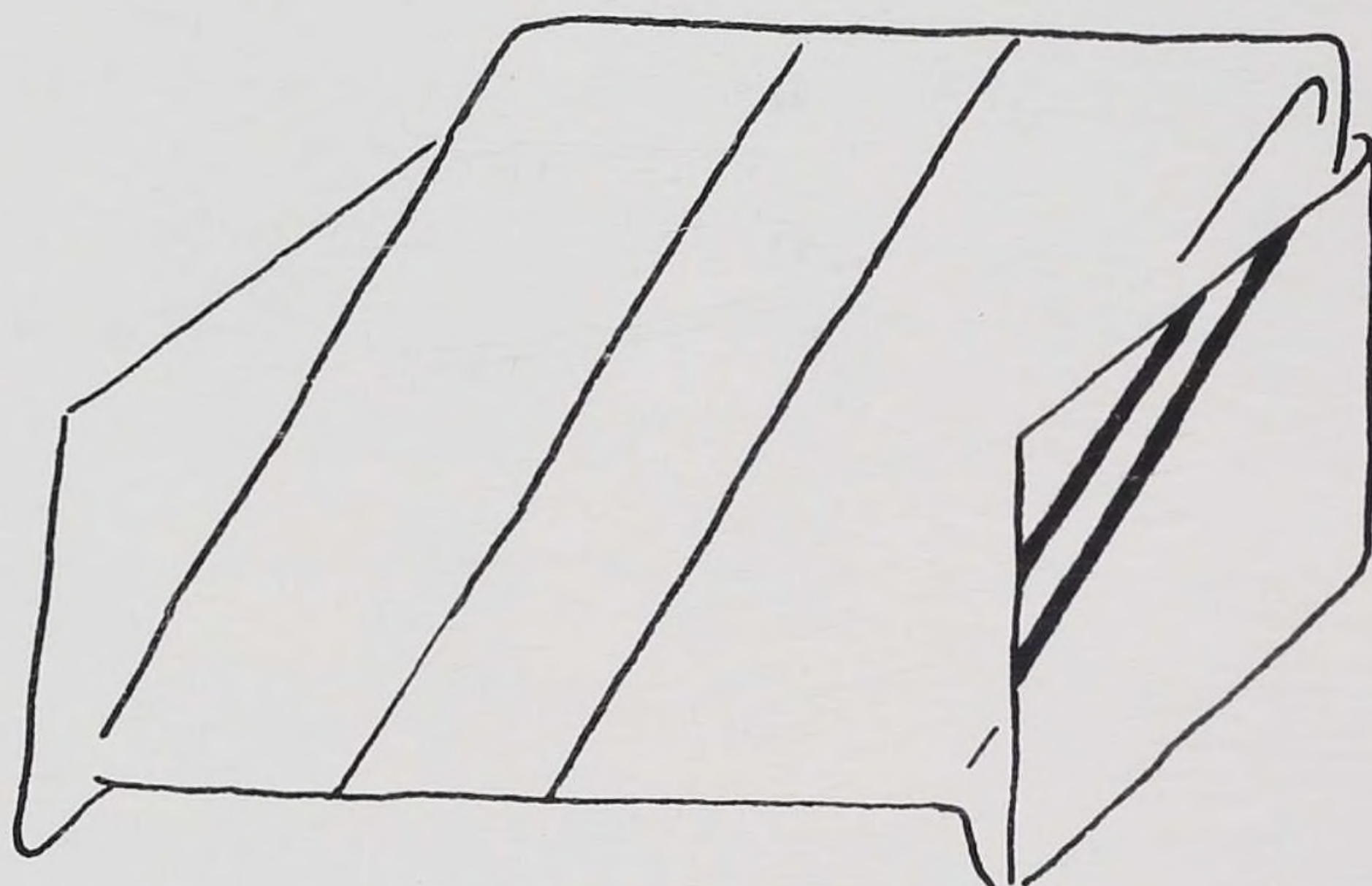
May 21--It's spring! Everything feels alive and fresh. Except me! I think I'm suffering from chronic fatigue. Will I ever get enough sleep?
