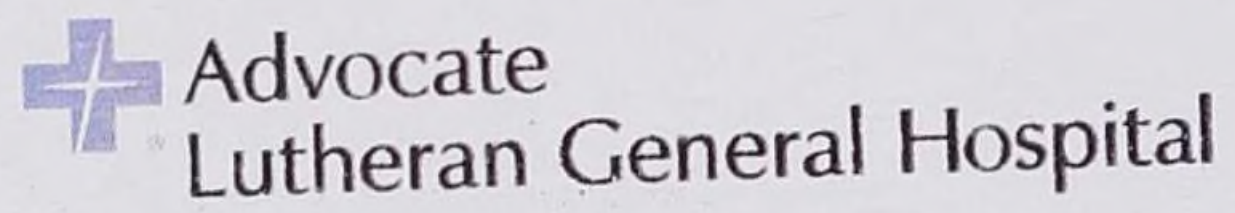

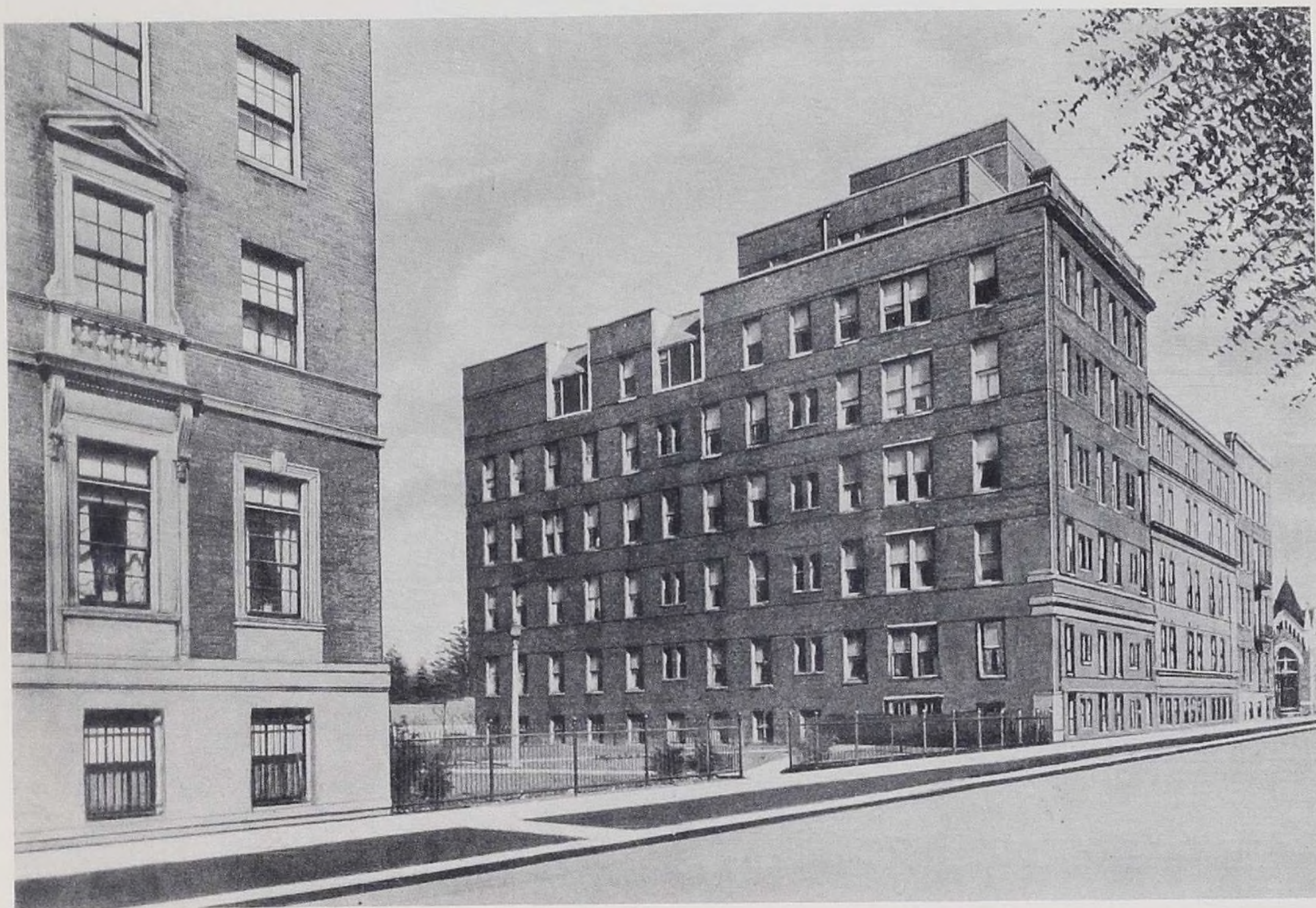

OUR NURSES' HOME

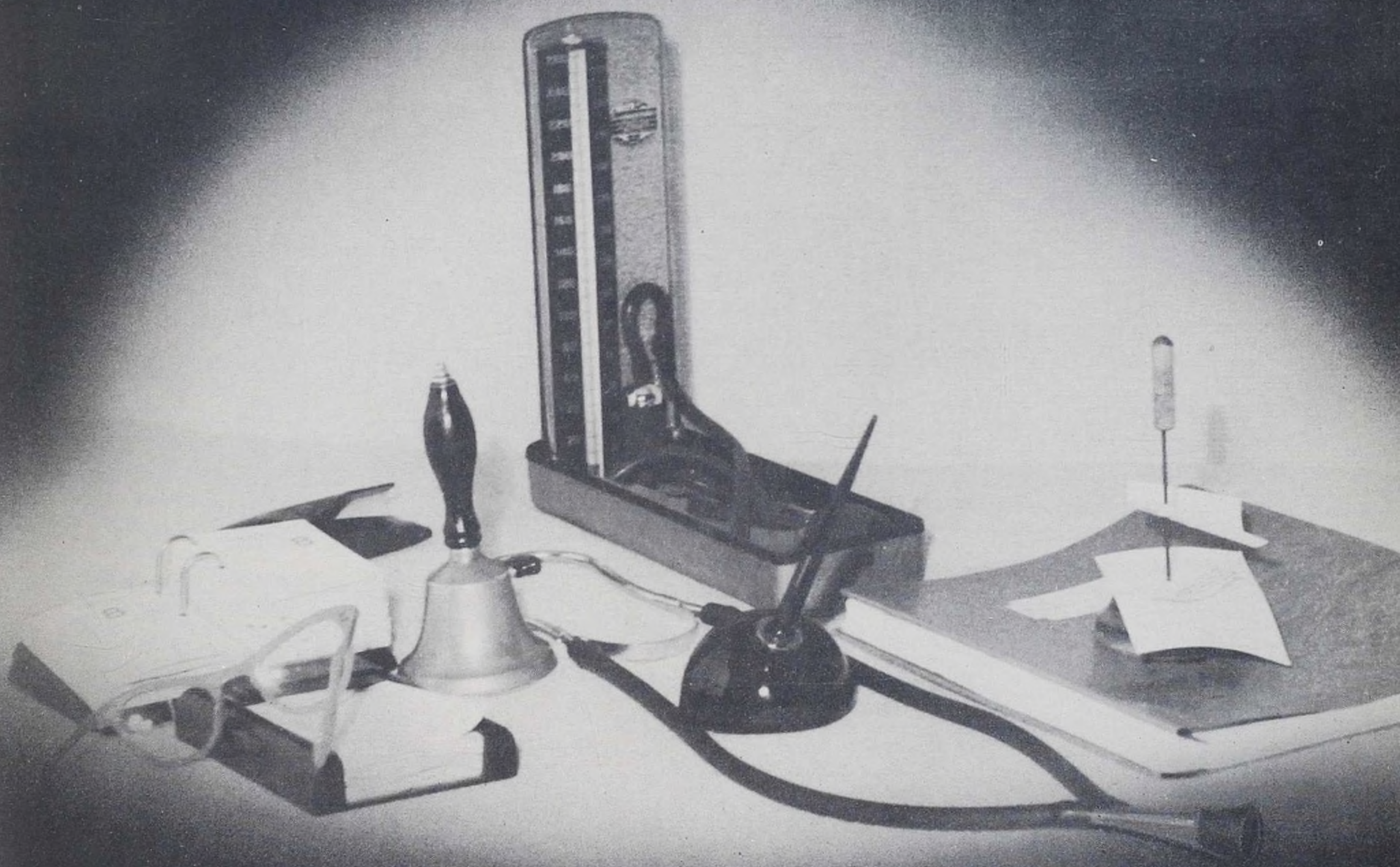


Many nurses trod down these steps daily on their way to duty, denoting new experiences and new knowledge in order that patients may receive the care they sorely need.

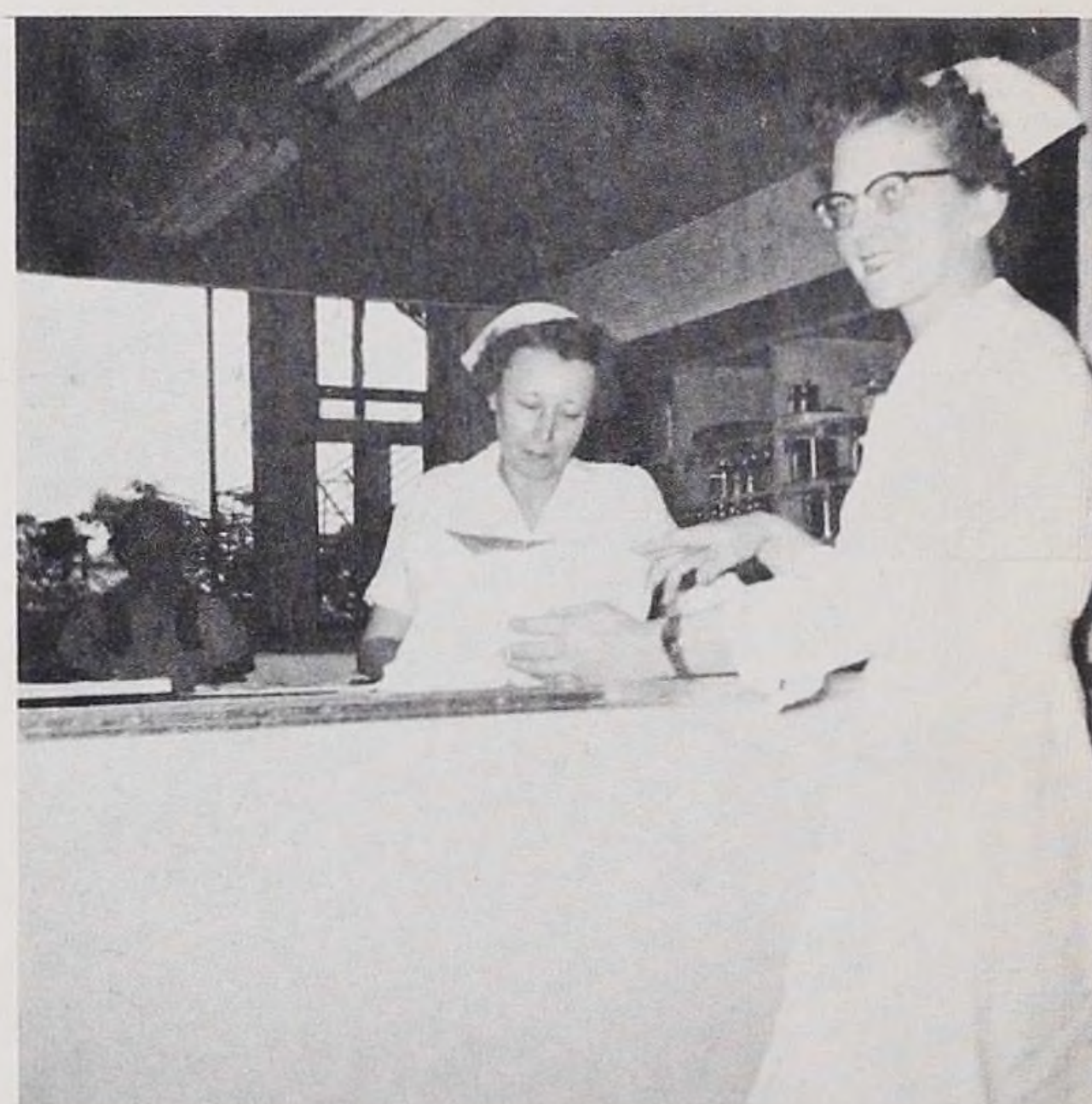


OUR NURSES AIDS AND THEIR INSTRUCTOR, MISS NORA.

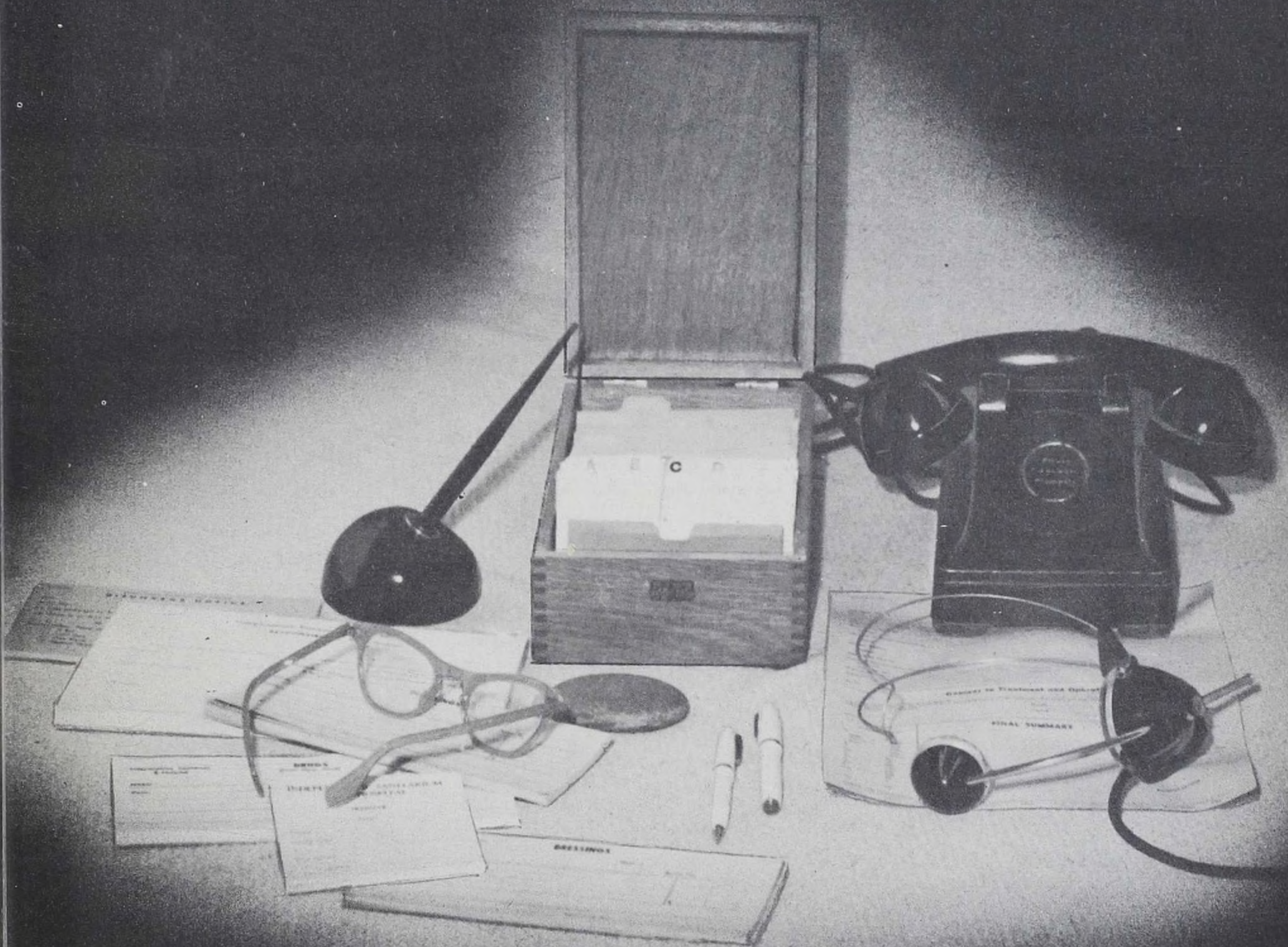
