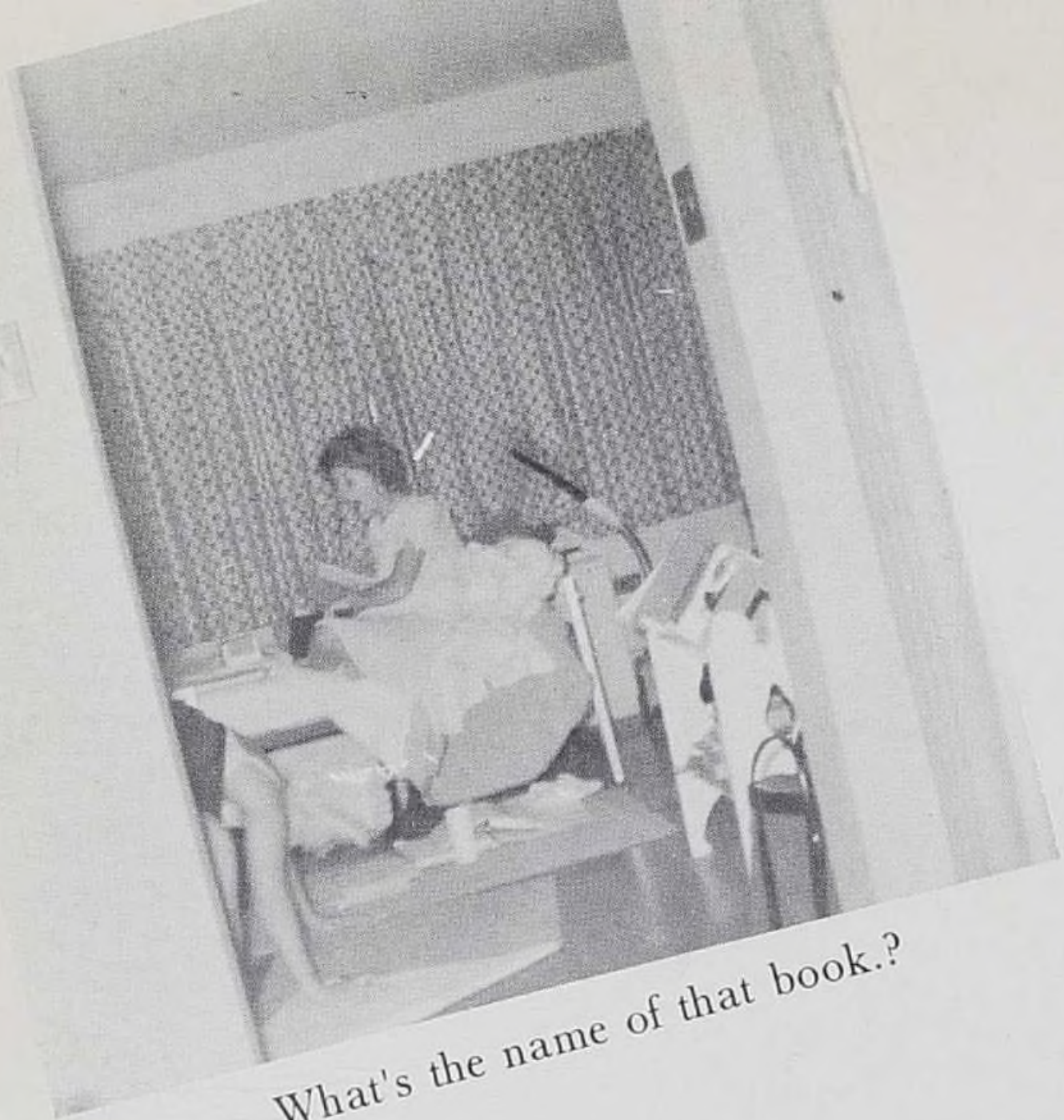
A NEW DAY
