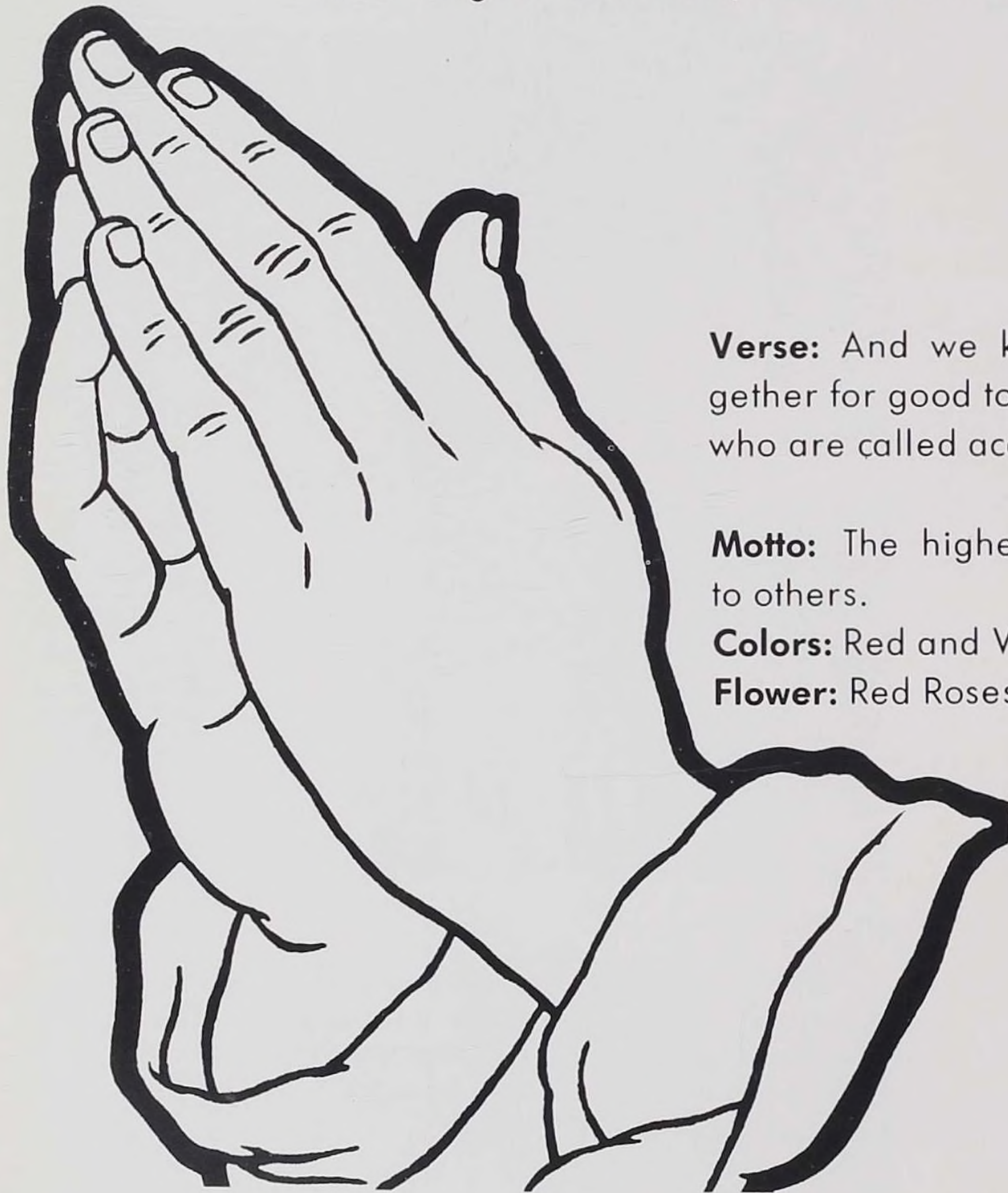
STUDENT NURSE OF THE YEAR
