Intensive Care

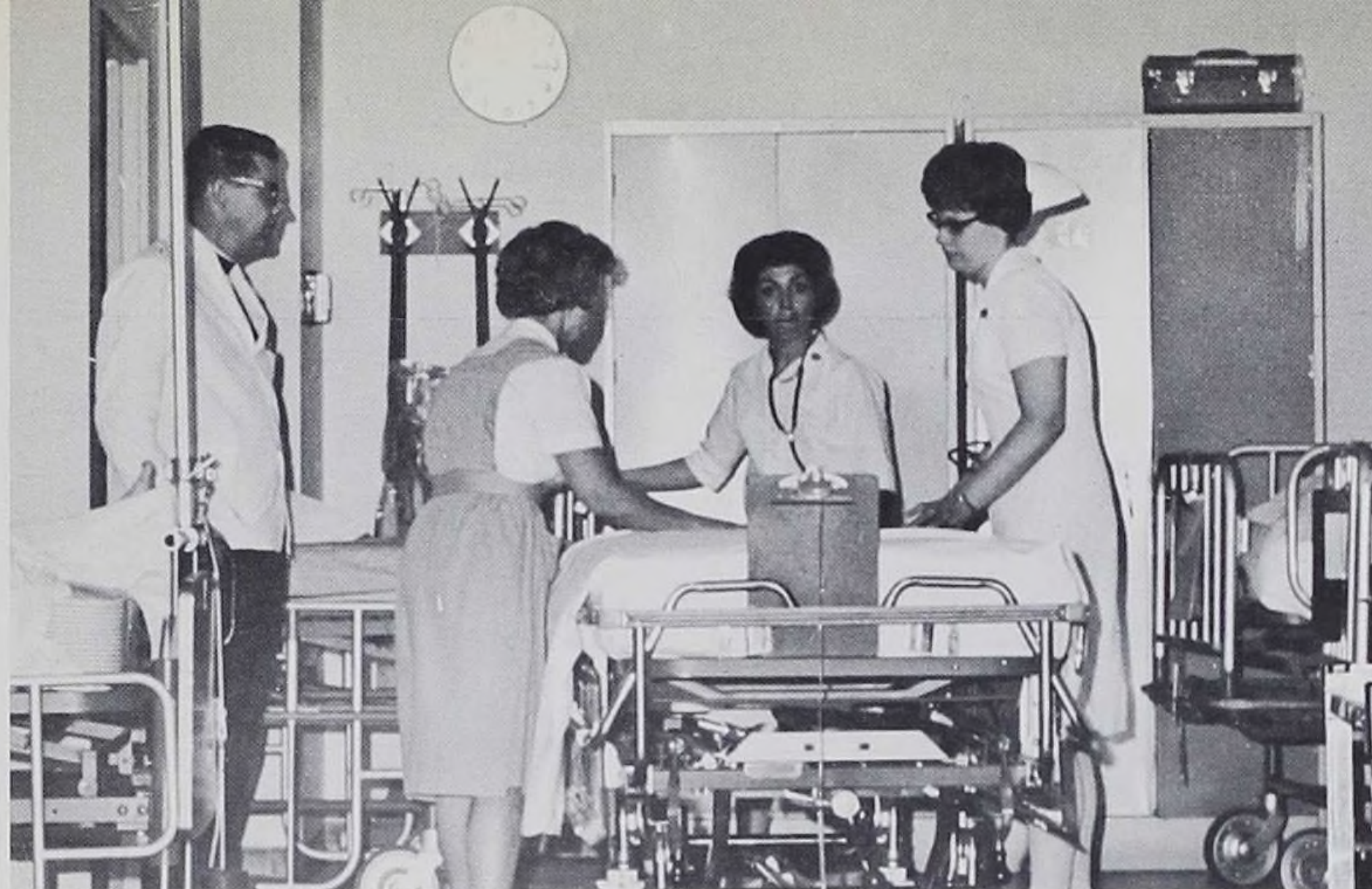

It's a rough life, even for one so young. Here Mrs. E. Doud demonstrates how easily a nursery crib can be made; and with only one hand!

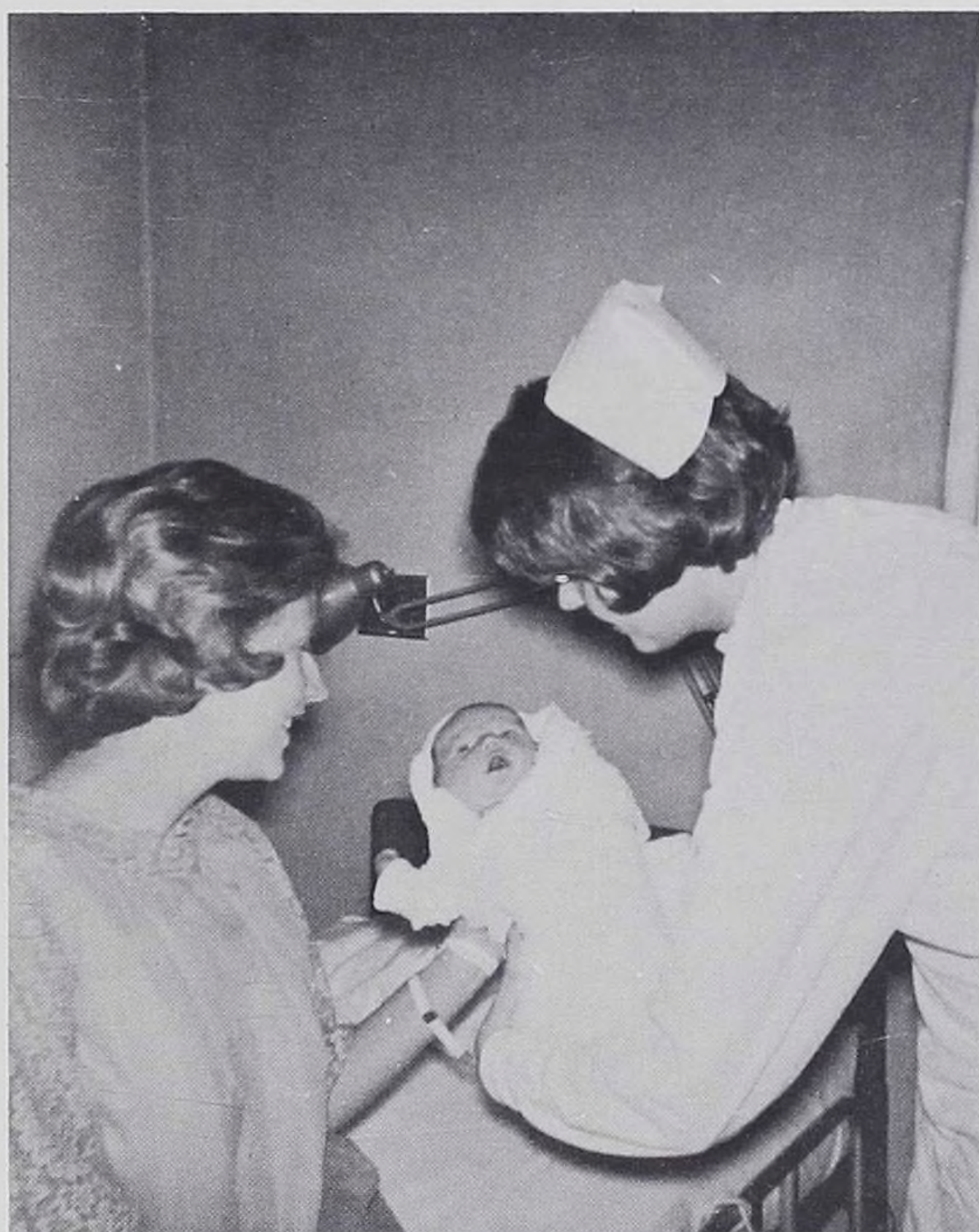

3 West

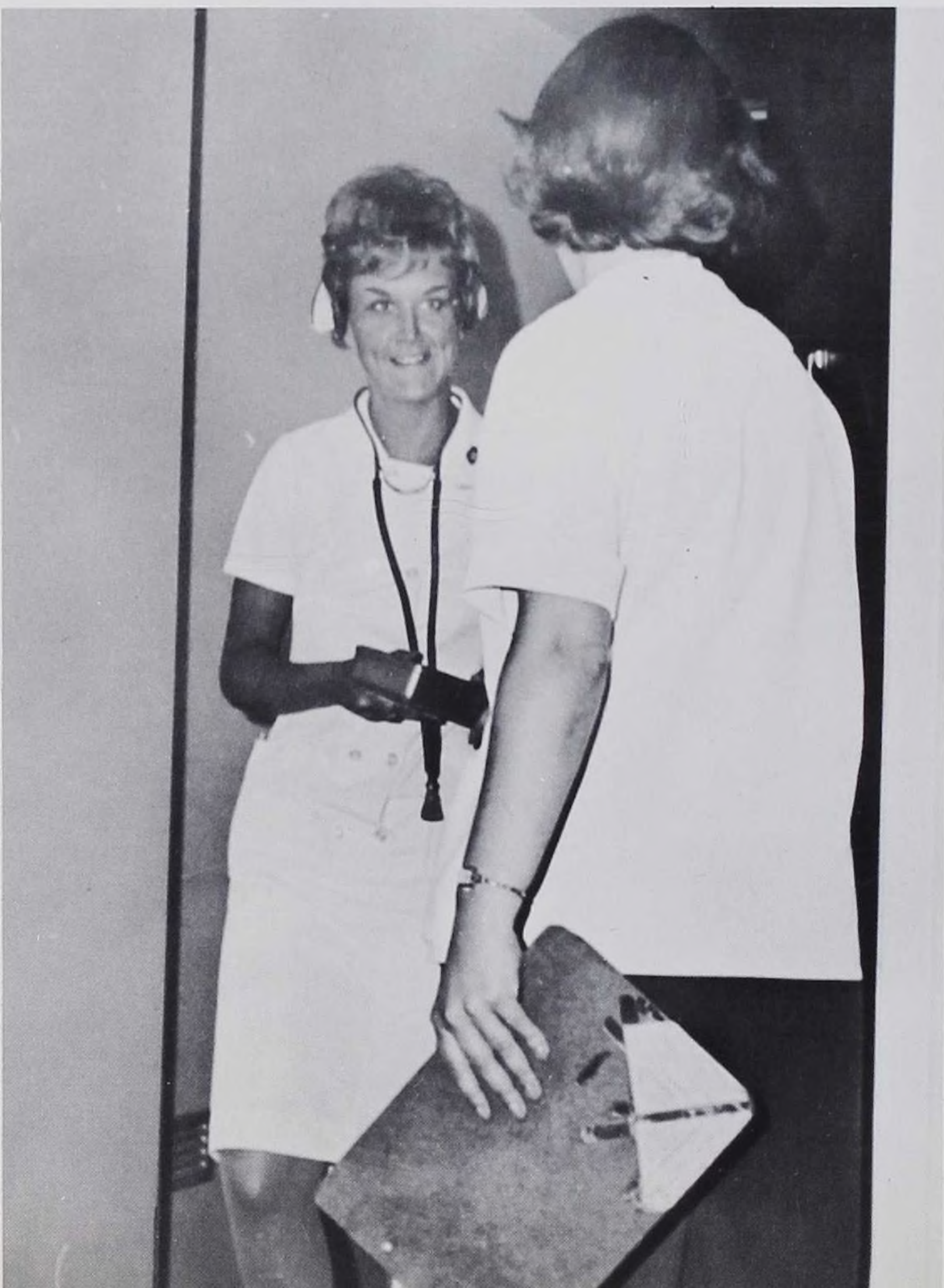
3 West is one of our two surgical units. General and specific surgical nursing care is given to the patients. Close observation is practiced for the welfare of patient.

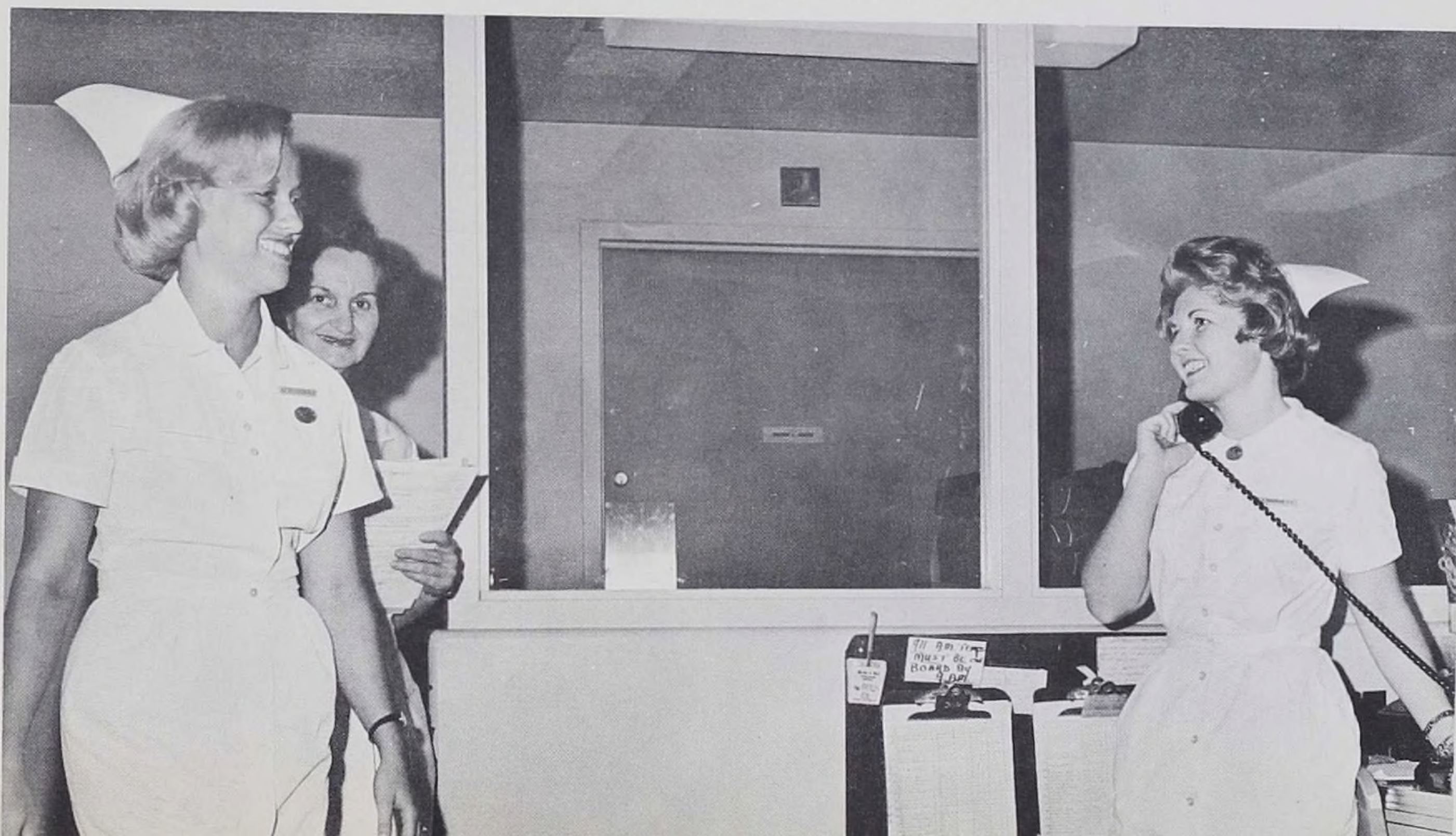

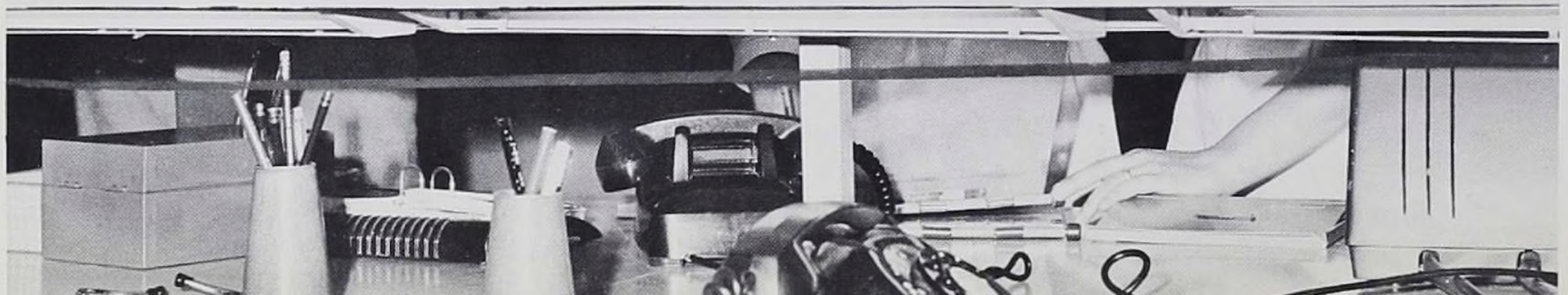
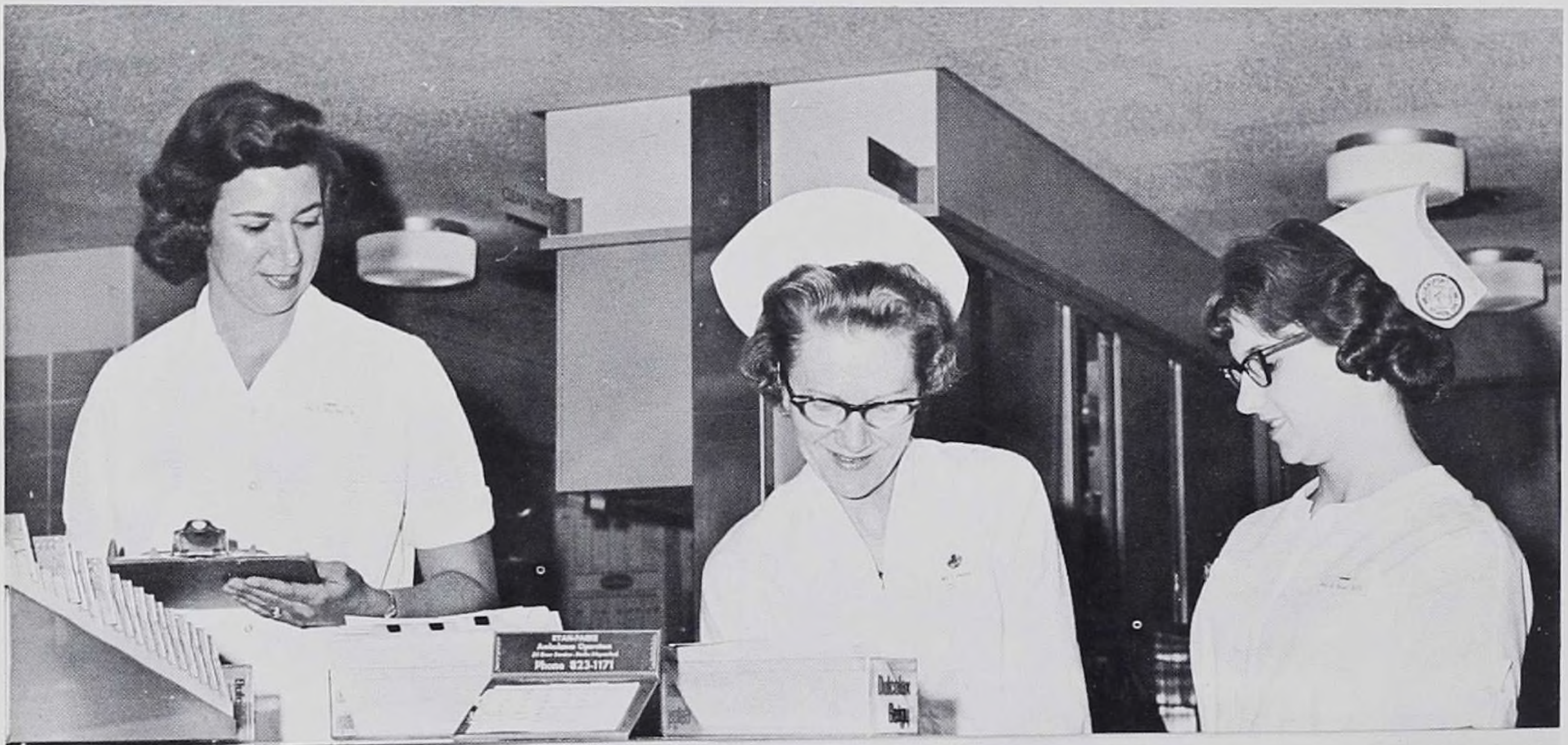
7 East & 7 West

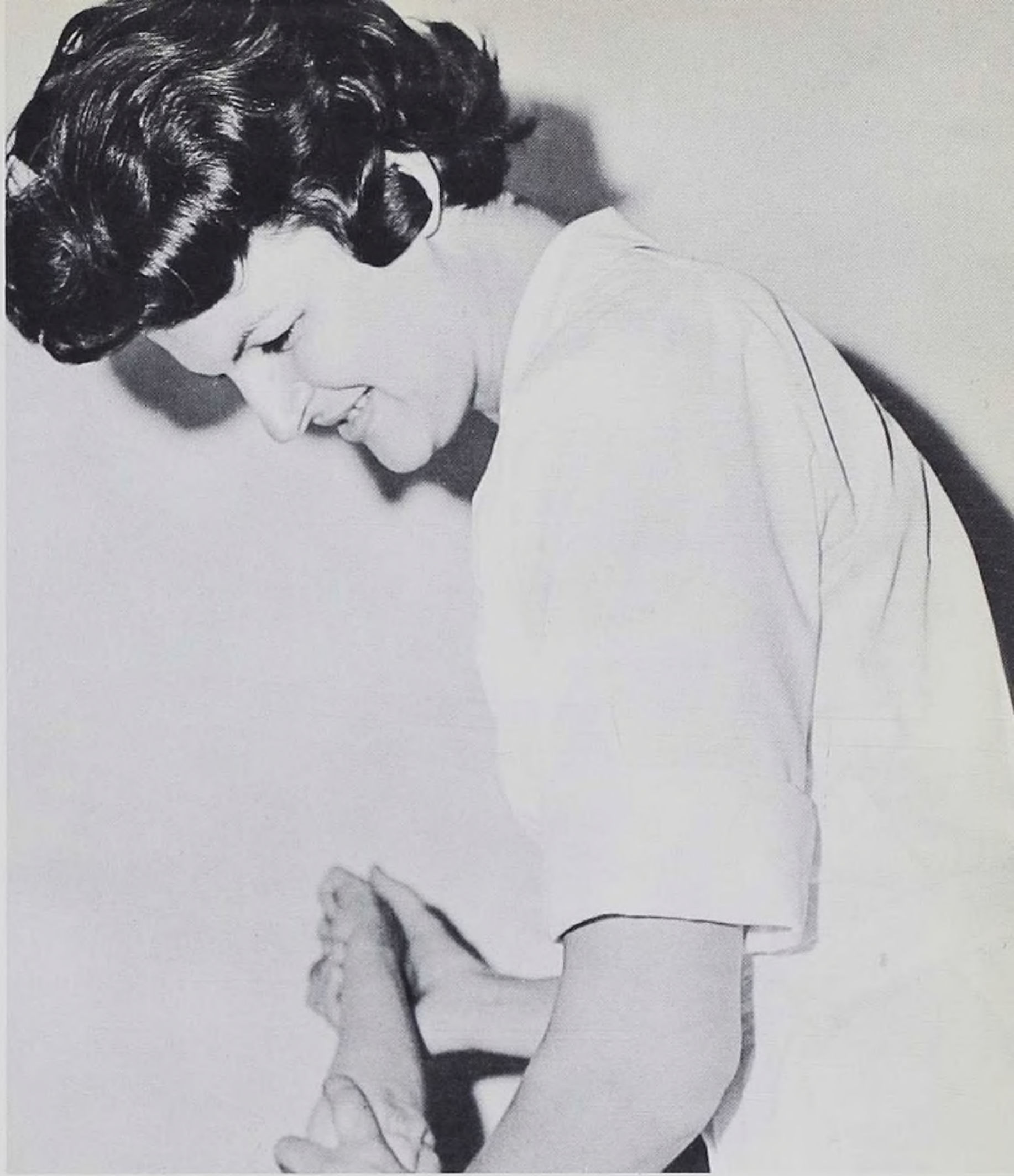

X-ray, soon to be expanded to include 5 additional x-ray rooms, will enable more care for hospital,

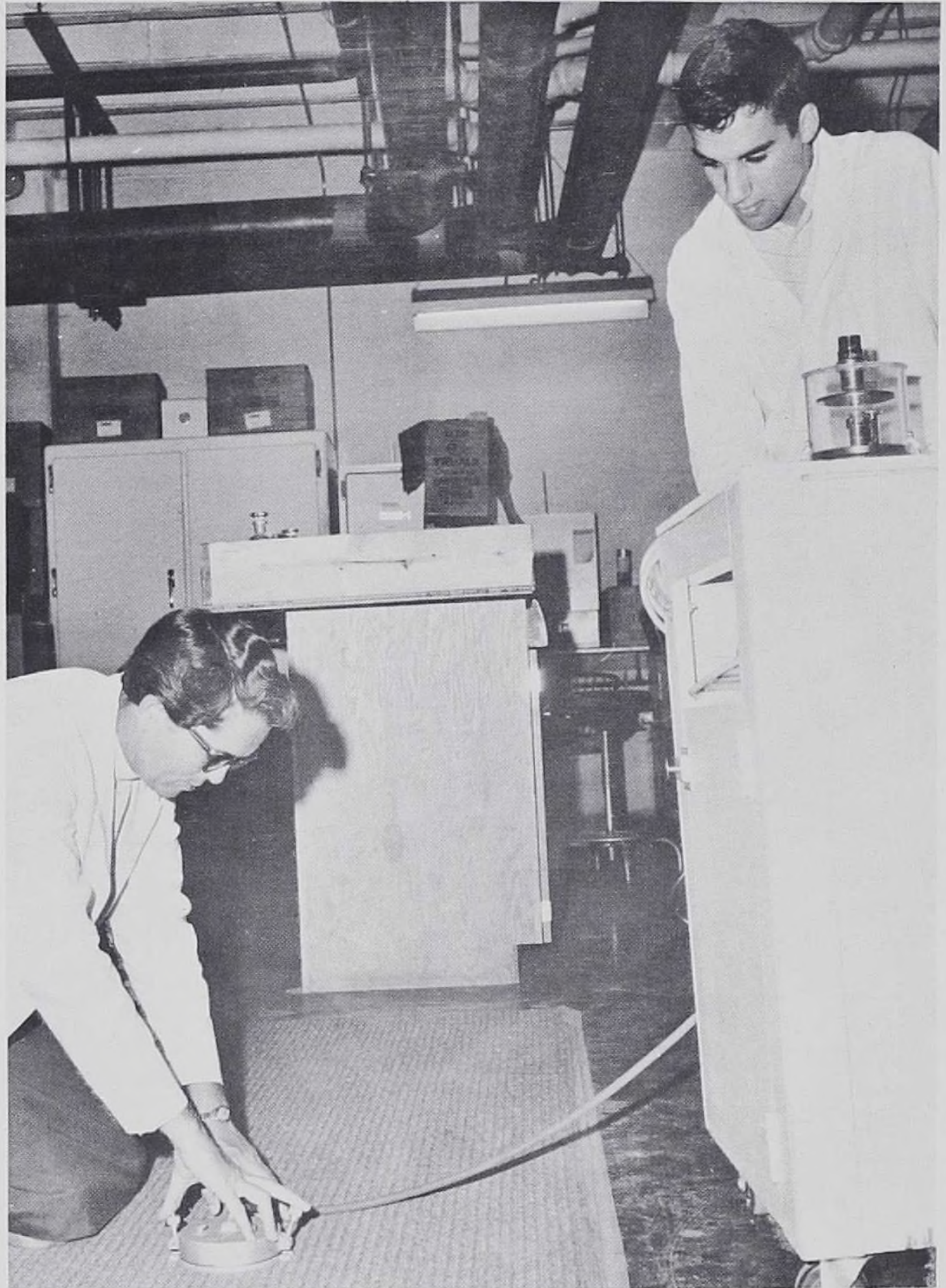
Five staff radiologists supervise some 22 x-ray technicians and students in the use of radiographic, flourescopic, or cobalt therapy.

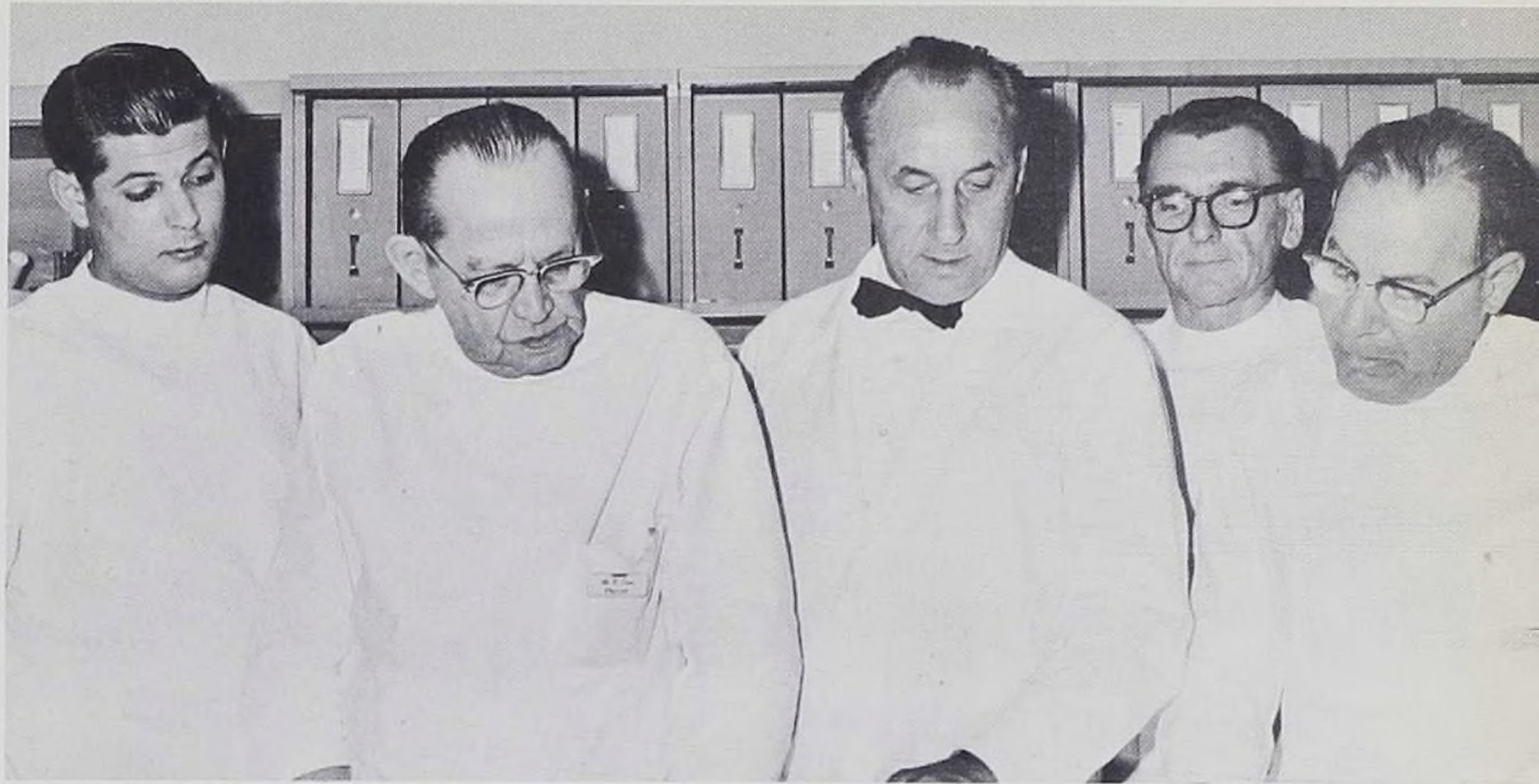
Bacteriology

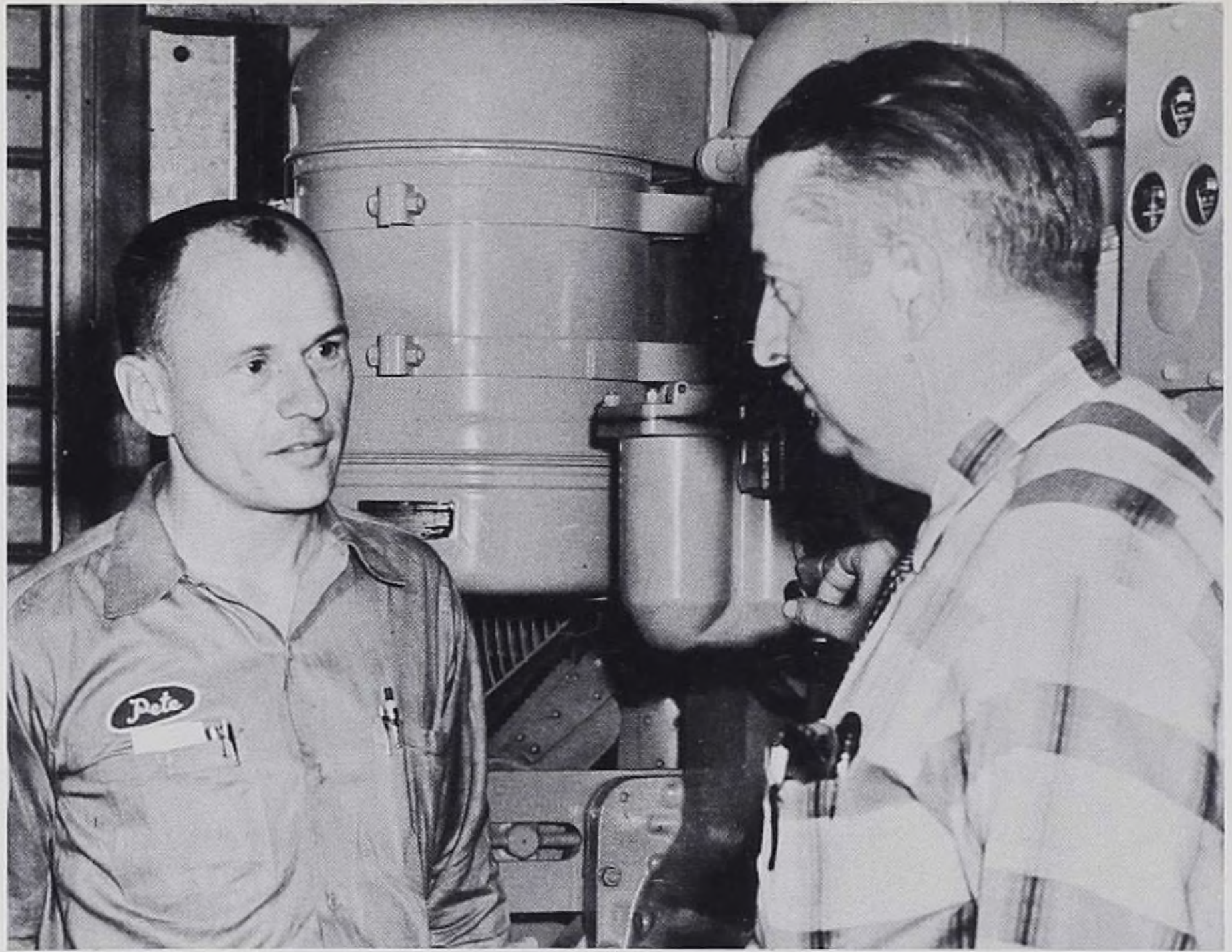

Therefore, it is with great pleasure that we bestow the title of Student Nurse of 1965 upon - Donna Rae Jester.

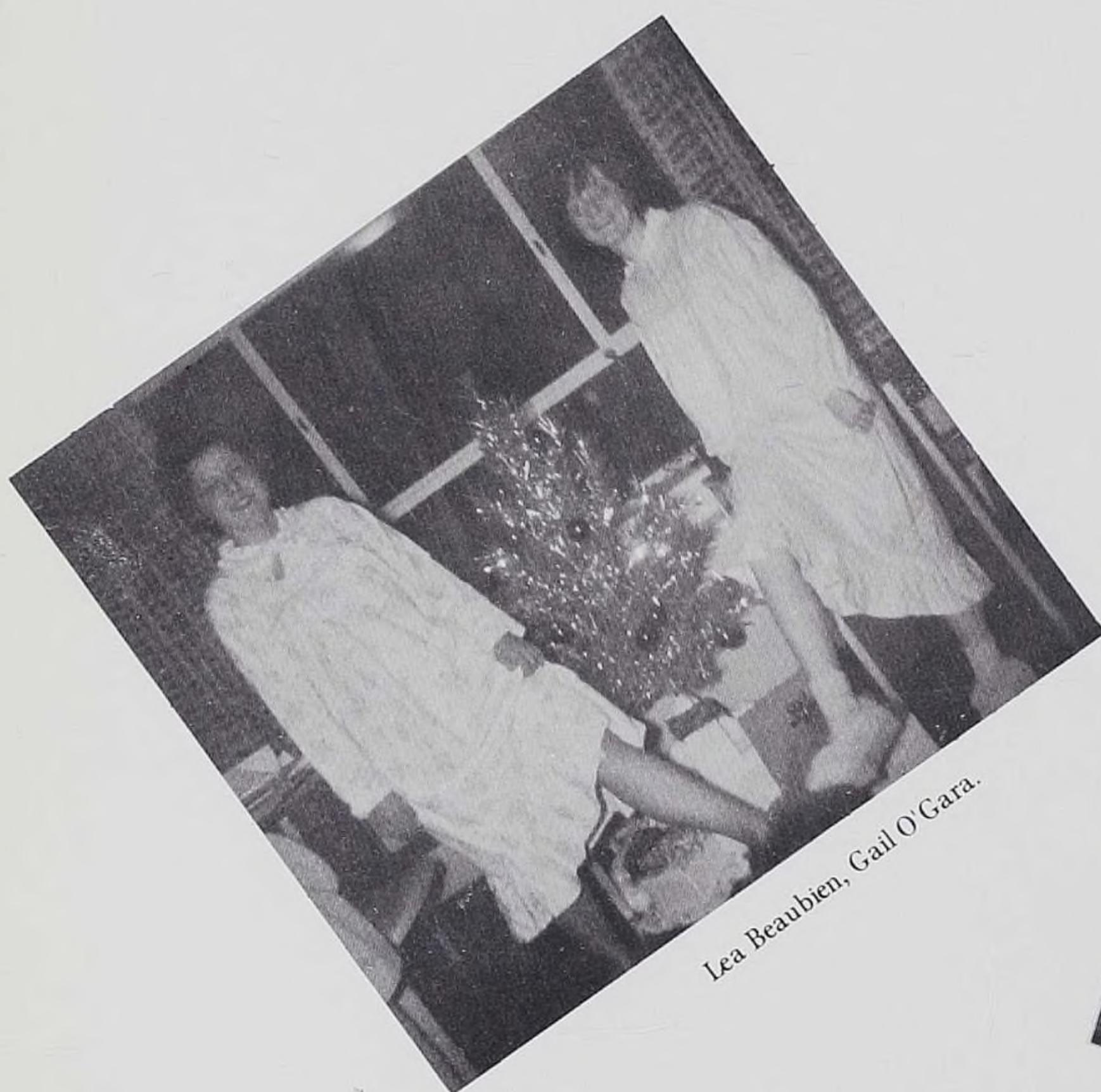
