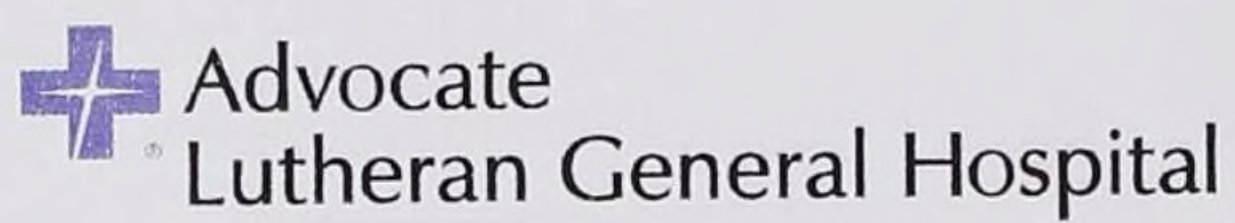

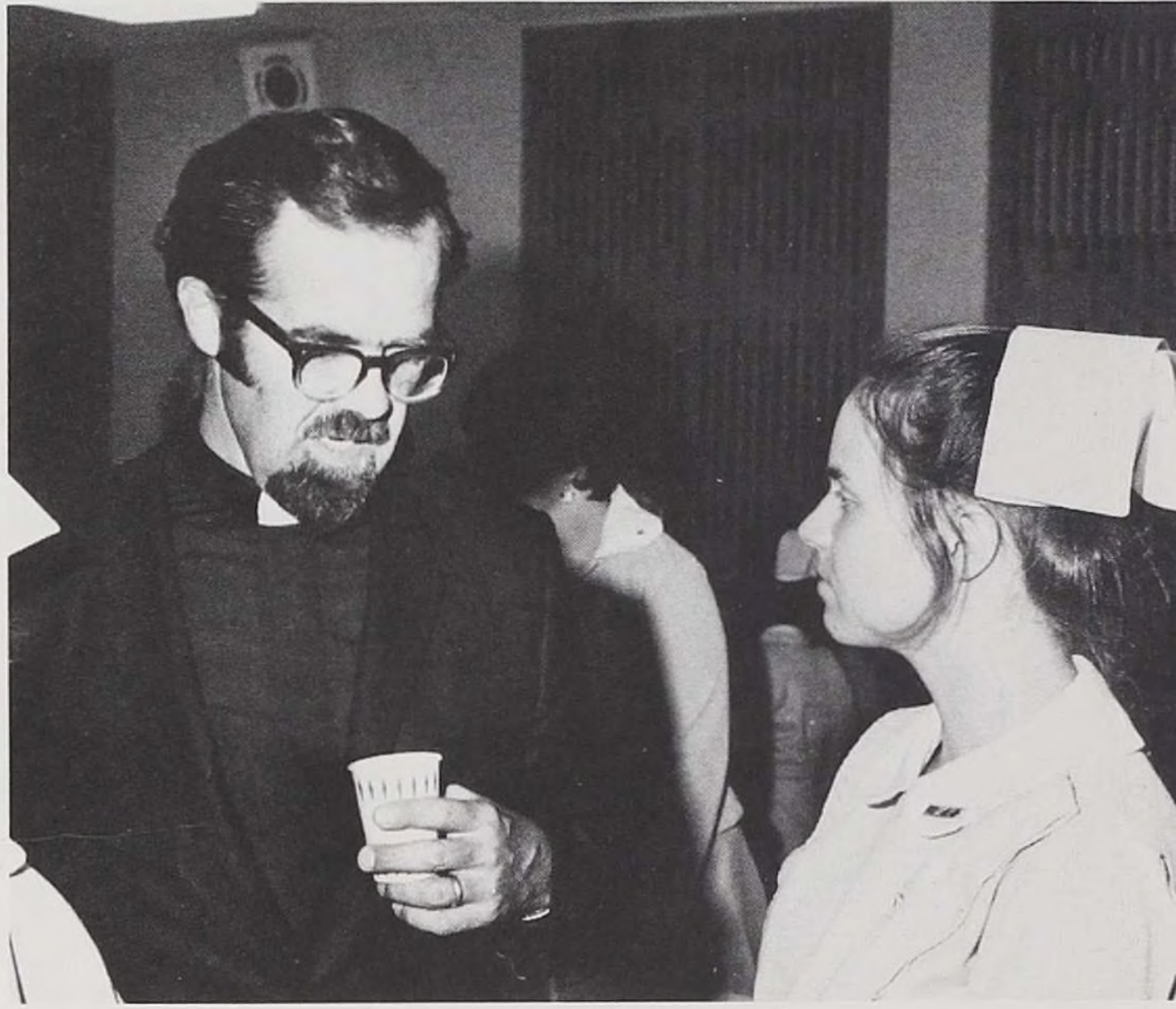

SOUL

Once we realize this, we can try to understand our fluctuating emotions and return to controlling our emotions again. But this is only part of what makes you, YOU.

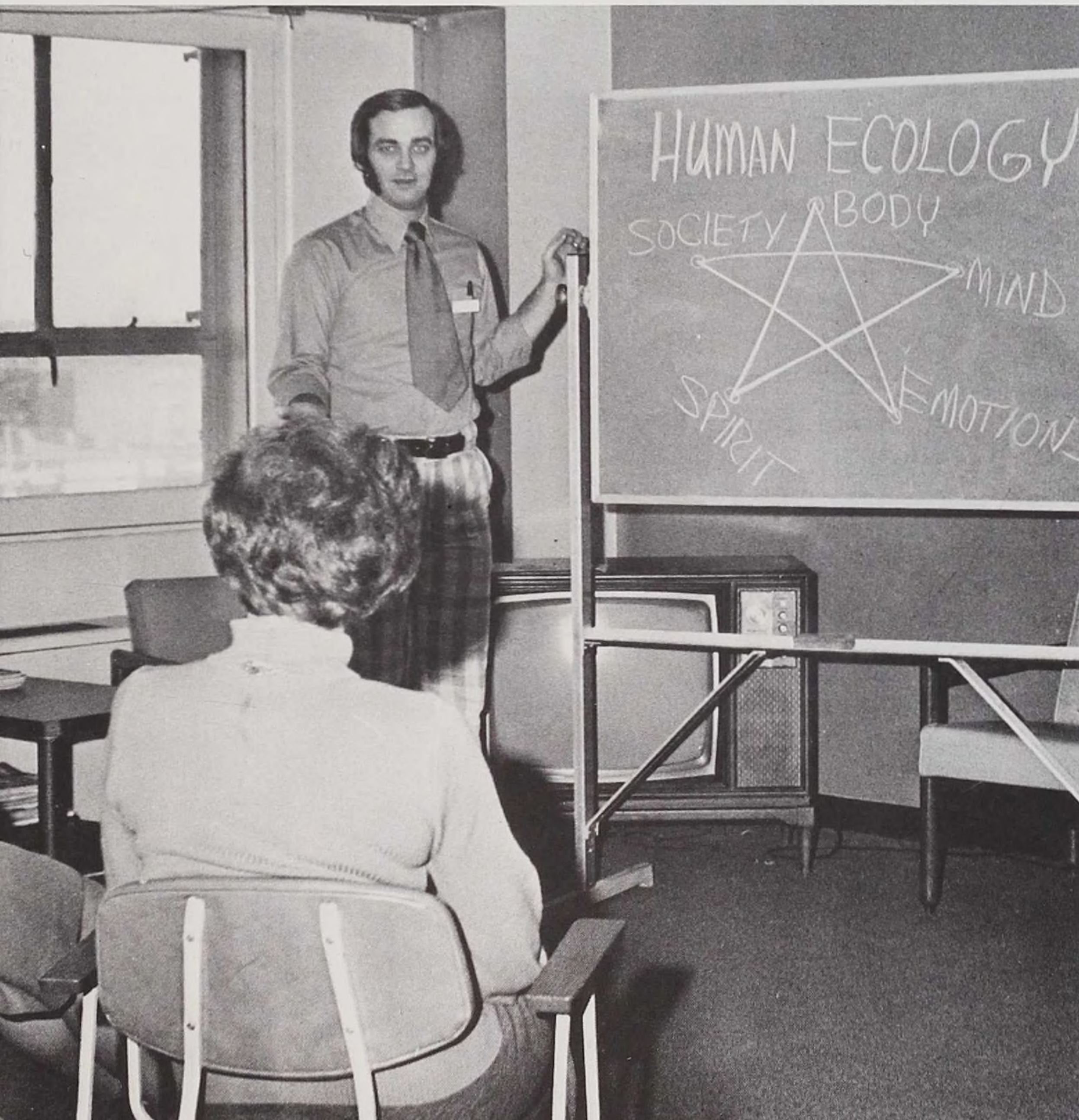




FAMILY

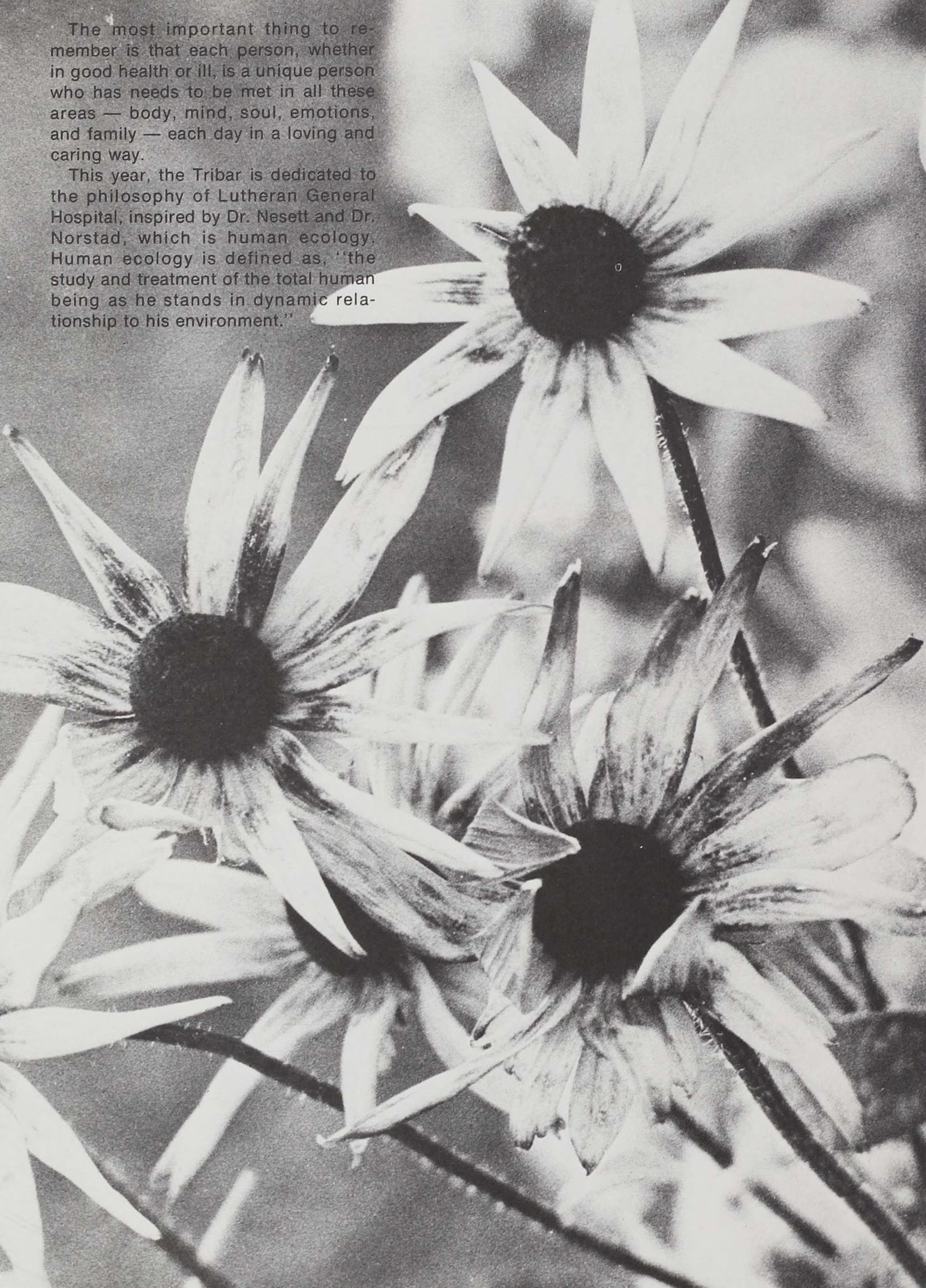
MIND

In the strong and lovely name of Jesus Christ, our Lord, Amen.

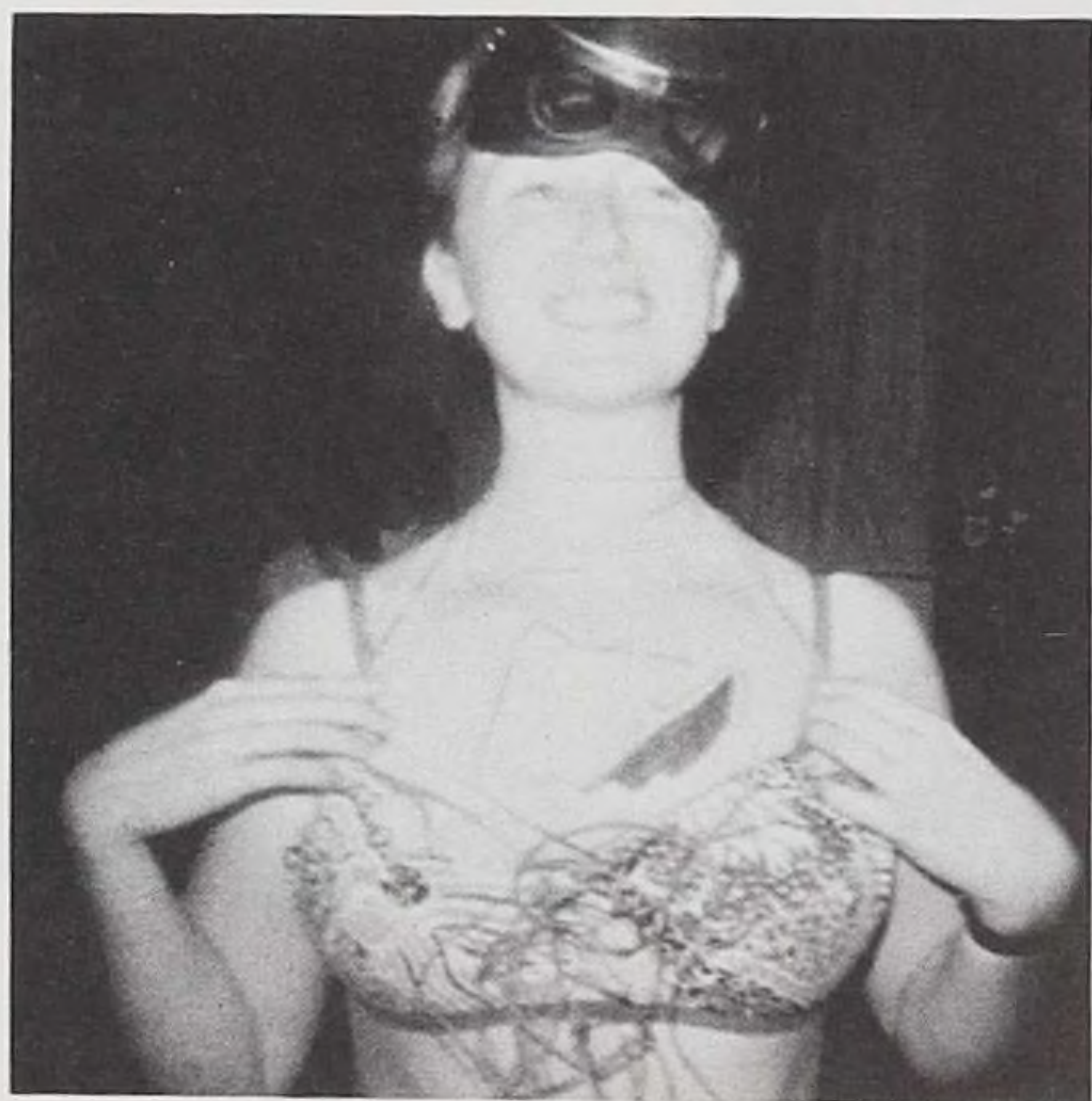


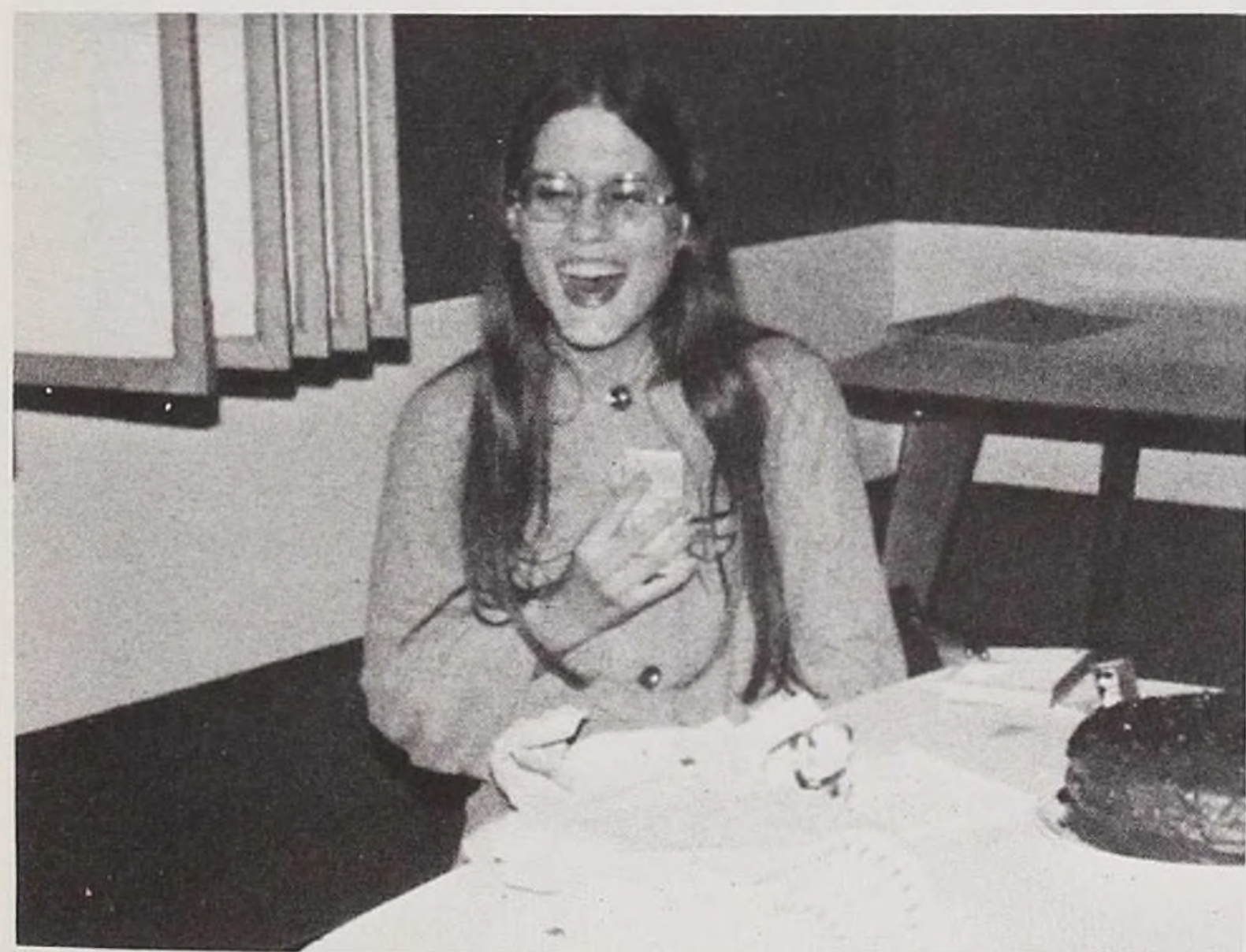
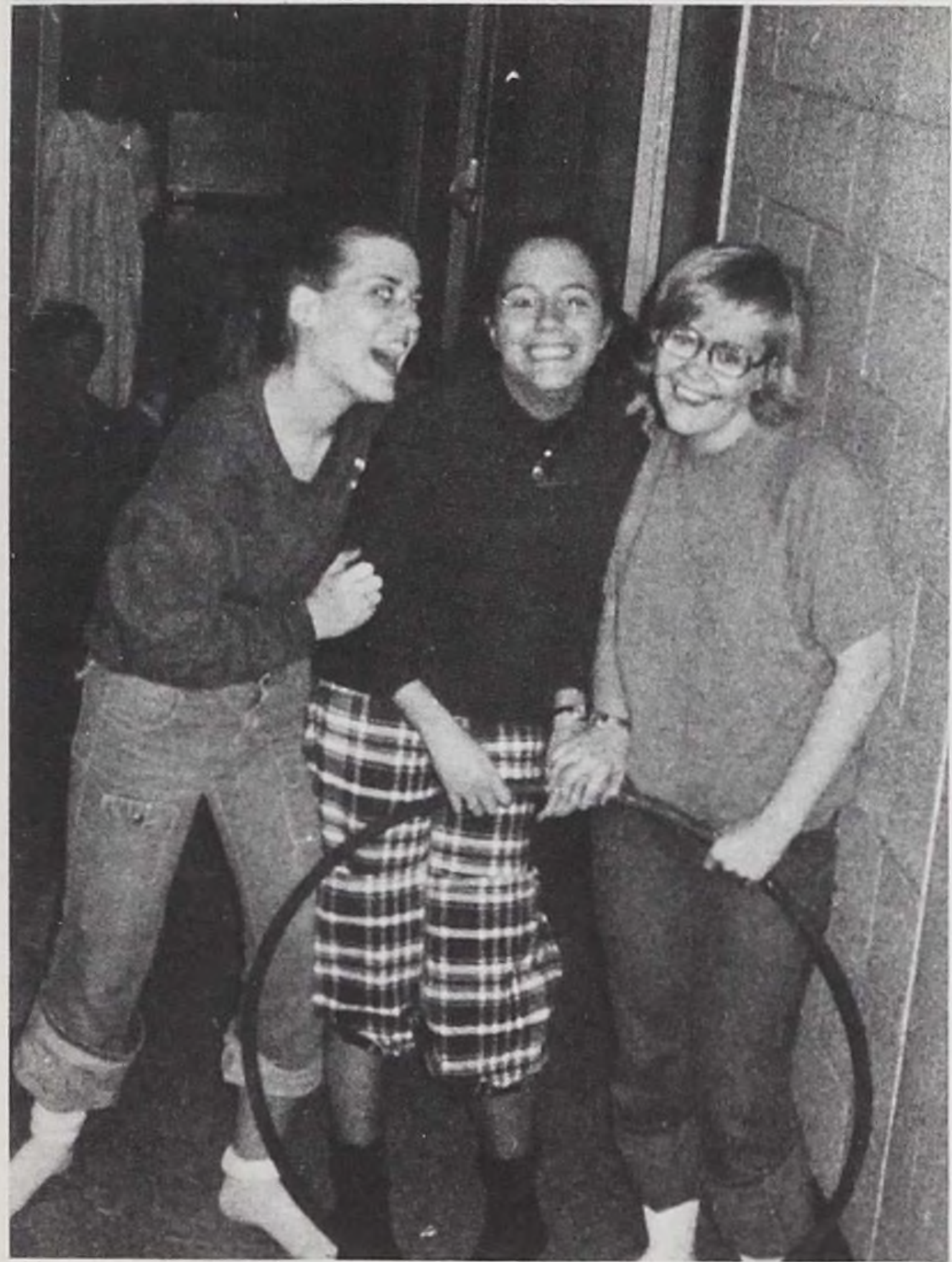
