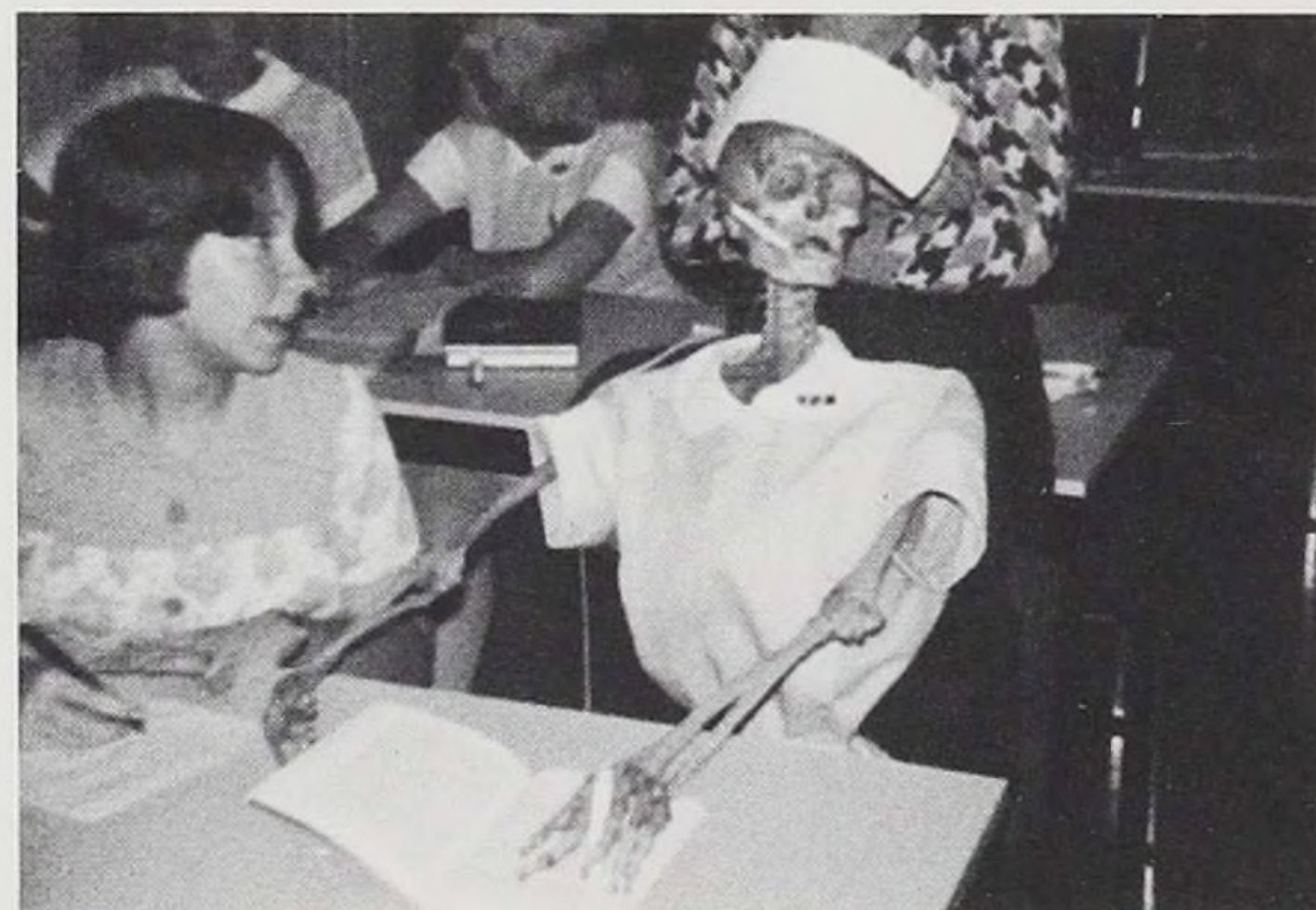

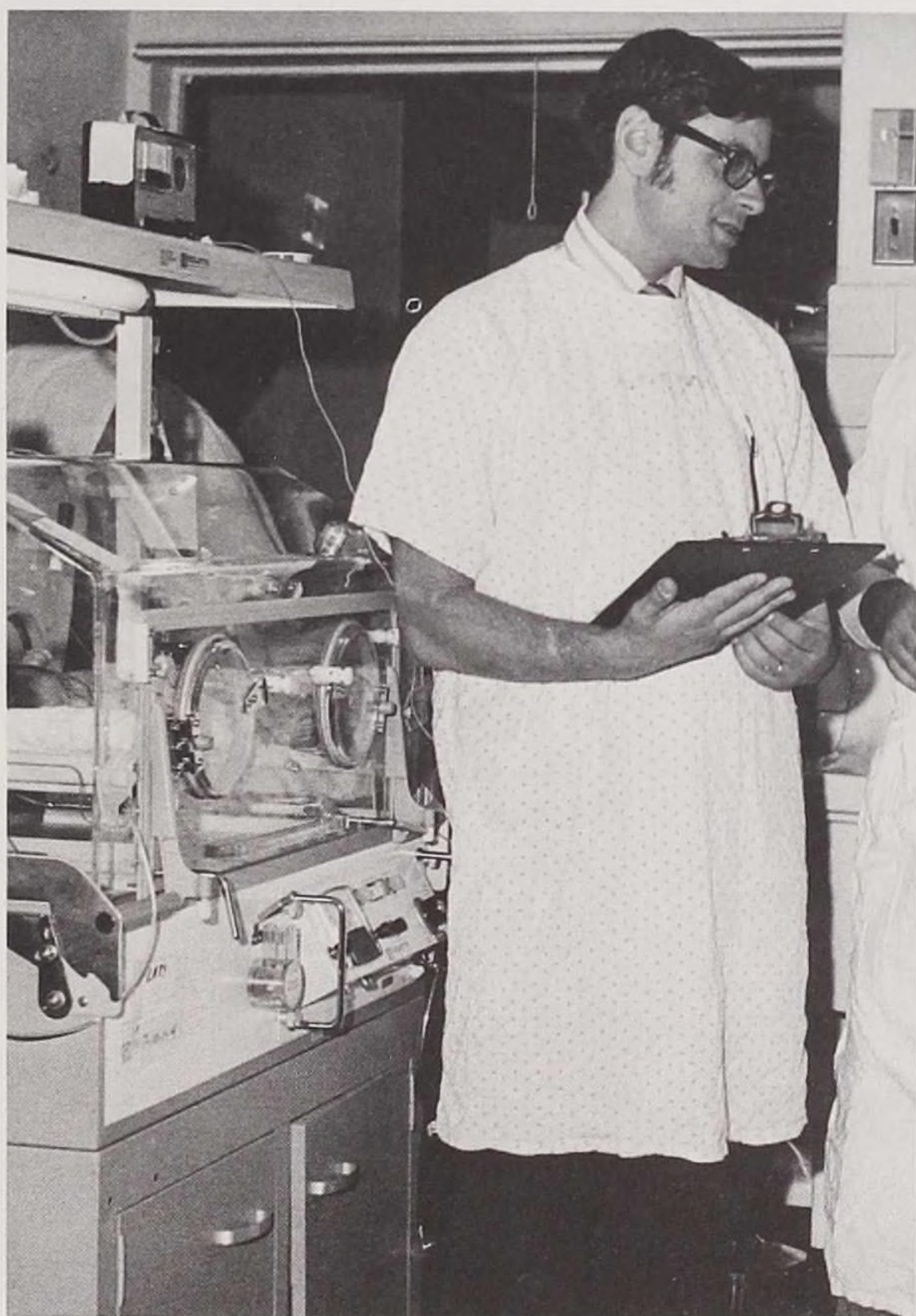
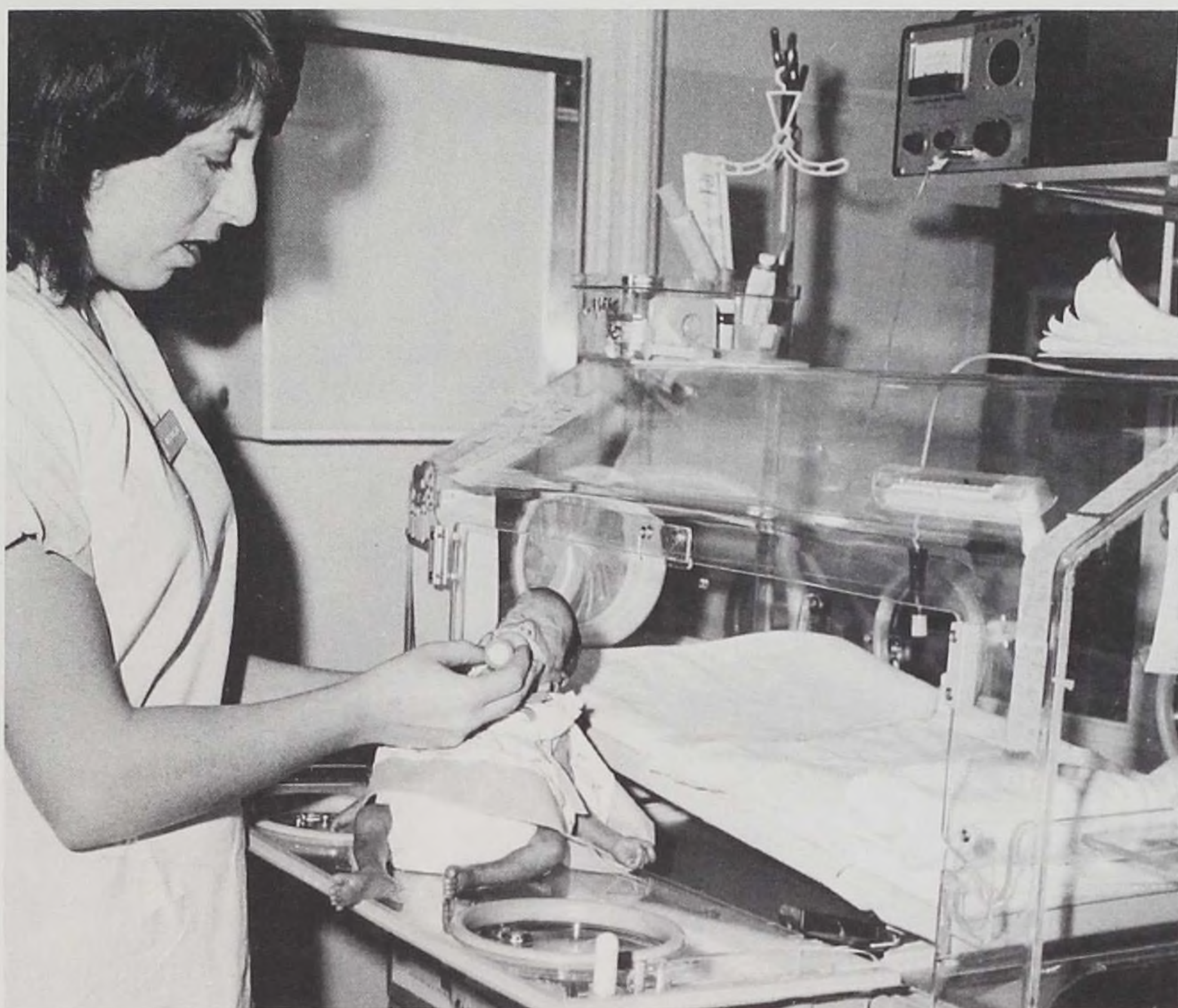

a new beginning.

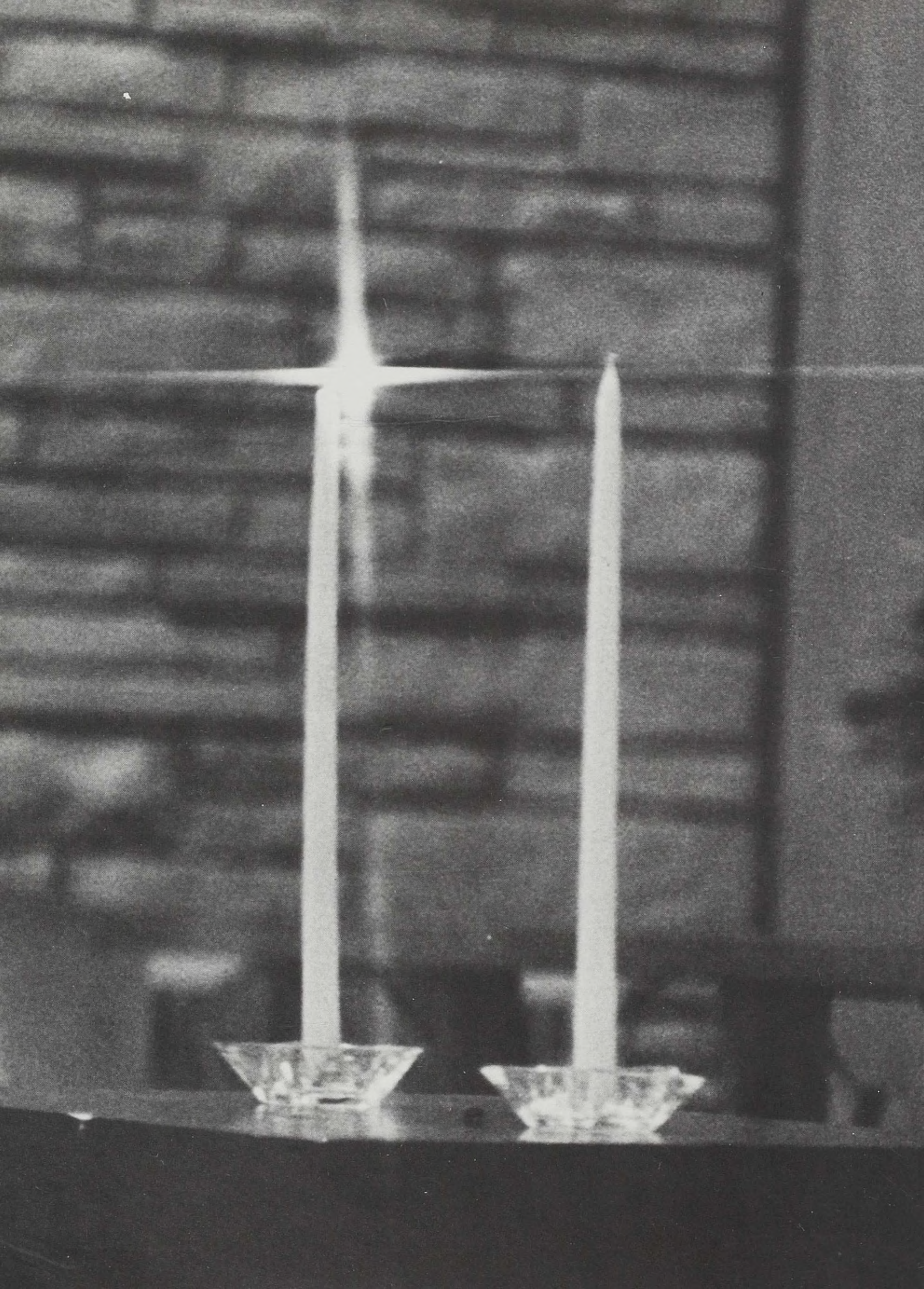
