mantle. ¹⁸ And alas for those who are with child and for those who give suck in those days! ¹⁹ Pray that your flight may not be in winter or on a sabbath. ²⁰ For then there will be great tribulation, such as has not been from the beginning of the world until now, no, and never will be. ²¹ And if those days had not been shortened, no human being would be saved; but for the sake of the elect those days will be shortened. ²² Then if any one says to you, 'Lo, here is the Christ!' or 'There he is!' do not believe it. ²³ For false Christs and false prophets will arise and show great signs and wonders, so as to lead astray, if possible, even the elect. ²⁴ Lo, I have told you beforehand. ²⁵ So, if they say to you, 'Lo, he is in the wilderness,' do not go out; if they say, 'Lo, he is in the inner rooms,' do not believe it. ²⁶ For as the lightning comes from the east and shines as far as the west, so will be the coming of the Son of man. ²⁷ Wherever the body is, there the eagles will be gathered together.

²⁸ Immediately after the tribulation of those days the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will fall from heaven, and the powers of the heavens will be shaken. ²⁹ Then will appear the sign of the Son of man in heaven, and then all the tribes of the earth will mourn, and they will see the Son of man coming on the clouds of heaven with power and great glory. ³⁰ And he will send out his angels with loud trumpet call, and they will gather his elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other.

³¹ From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. ³² So also, when you see these things, know that the kingdom of heaven is near.

³³ But of that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only. ³⁴ As were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of man. ³⁵ For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, and they did not know until the flood came and swept them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of man. ³⁶ Then two men will be in the field; one is taken and one is left. ³⁷ Two women will be grinding at the mill; one is taken and one is left. ³⁸ Watch therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. ³⁹ But know this, that if the householder had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have watched and would not have let his house be broken into. ⁴⁰ Therefore you also must be ready; for the Son of man is coming at an hour you do not expect.

⁴¹ Who then is the faithful and wise servant, whom his master has set over his household, to give them their food at the proper time? ⁴² Blessed is that servant whom his master when he comes will find so doing. ⁴³ Truly, I say to you, he will set him over all his possessions. ⁴⁴ But if that wicked servant says to himself, 'My master is delayed,' and begins to beat his fellow servants, and eats and drinks with the drunken, the master of that servant will come on a day when he does not expect him and at an hour he does not know, and will punish him, and put him with the hypocrites; there men will weep and gnash their teeth.

⁴⁵ Then the kingdom of heaven shall be compared to ten maidens who took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. ⁴⁶ Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. ⁴⁷ As they went to buy, the bridegroom came, and they who were ready entered with him to the marriage feast. ⁴⁸ And after they had shut the door, other maidens came, and said, 'Lord, open to us.' ⁴⁹ But he replied, 'Truly, I say to you, I do not know you.' ⁵⁰ Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour.

¹ But at midnight there was a cry, 'Behold, the bridegroom! Come out to meet him.' ² Then all those maidens rose and took their lamps. ³ And some said to the others, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' ⁴ They replied, 'No, for we have no more.' ⁵ Then they went to buy, but the door was shut. ⁶ Afterward the other maidens came also, saying, 'Lord, lord, open to us.' ⁷ But he replied, 'Truly, I say to you, I do not know you.' ⁸ Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour.

⁹ For it will be as when a man going on a journey called his servants and entrusted to them his property; ¹⁰ to one he gave five talents, to another two, to another one, to each according to his ability. Then he went away. ¹¹ He who had received the five talents went and traded with them, and he made five talents more. ¹² So also, he who had the two talents made two talents more. ¹³ But he who had received the one talent went and dug in the ground and hid his master's money. ¹⁴ Now after a long time the master of those servants came and settled accounts with them. ¹⁵ And he who had received the five talents came forward, bringing five talents more, saying, 'Master, you delivered to me five talents; here I have made five talents more.' ¹⁶ His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant; you have been faithful over a little, I will set you over much; enter into the joy of your master.' ¹⁷ And he who had the two talents came forward, saying, 'Master, you delivered

to me two talents; here I have made two talents more.' ¹⁸ His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant; you have been faithful over a little, I will set you over much; enter into the joy of your master.' ¹⁹ And he who had the one talent came forward, saying, 'Master, you delivered to me one talent; here I have kept it hidden in the ground, for I was afraid, for I knew that you were a hard man, and that I would lose my talent if I had put it out, and I was afraid, and I hid it.' ²⁰ His master replied, 'You wicked and slothful servant! You knew that I reap where I have not sown, and gather where I have not winnowed? ²¹ Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and at my coming I should have received what was my own with interest. ²² So take the talent from him, and give it to him who has the ten talents. ²³ For to every one who has will more be given, and he will have abundance; but from him who has not, even what he has will be taken away. ²⁴ And cast the worthless servant into the outer darkness; there men will weep and gnash their teeth.'

²⁵ When the Son of man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on his glorious throne. ²⁶ Before him will be gathered all the nations, and he will separate them one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. ²⁷ And he will place the sheep at his right hand, but the goats at the left. ²⁸ Then the King will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, O blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; ²⁹ for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you clothed me, I was in prison and you came to me.' ³⁰ Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see thee hungry and feed thee, or thirsty and give thee drink? ³¹ And when did we see thee a stranger and welcome thee, or naked and clothe thee? ³² And when did we
