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# IN MEMORY OF LOIS MAY HORTON, R.N., M.S. 1928-1983



Lois Horton was born in Angola, Africa, December 10, 1928, the daughter of missionaries. She lived in Africa for 17 years where she attended school and acquired knowledge of various languages. She came to the United States in 1945 and attended high school while she lived with relatives.

She received her diploma in nursing from Millard Fillmore Hospital School of Nursing, Buffalo, New York in 1950. She received a B.S. in 1956 from the State University of New York, Buffalo, New York. In 1973 she received a M.S. in Nursing from Northern Illinois University, DeKalb, Illinois.

Her professional nursing experiences included staff nursing in medical nursing, on-call in acute poliomyelitis nursing, part-time camp nursing, staff nurse and supervisor in Maternity nursing, instructor in nursing at Millard Fillmore Hospital School of Nursing for five years, and medical-surgical instructor at Buffalo General Hospital School of Nursing for two years. Her residence in the Chicago area began in 1957 as Director of Nursing Service at Berhesda Hospital, Chicago for ten years.

She came to Luthern General and Deaconess Hospitals School of Nursing as an instructor in medical-surgical nursing December 4, 1967. From 1968-1977 she was Assistant Director-Administration, and from 1977-1983 she was Multimedia Coordinator, Instructor in Pharmacology and integration of the subject in the clinical curriculum and instructor in medical-surgical nursing. She held the appointment of visiting Assistant Professor in Natural Science at Concordia College, River Forest, Illinois.

Lois was a member of the American Nurses Association since 1951 and the National League for Nursing since 1952. She was active in Nurses Christian Fellowship for ten years and currently active member of Arlington Countryside Chapel in Arlington Heights, Illinois since 1974. She had a number of hobbies which she pursued from childhood. These included gardening, needle work of all kinds, and more recently, photography.

Lois was a valued colleague, and her work was characterized by thoroughness as well as promptness. She read widely in professional and general literature and her work as a teacher reflected both her reading, experience as a nurse, and consistent objectivity.

\*Students will remember her as a helpful teacher — challenging the ablest and giving kindly assistance to puzzlement and confusion, and, also, as a valued advisor.

\*Alumni appreciated the friendly warmth and openness afforded them on visits — drop-in or in continuing education classes.

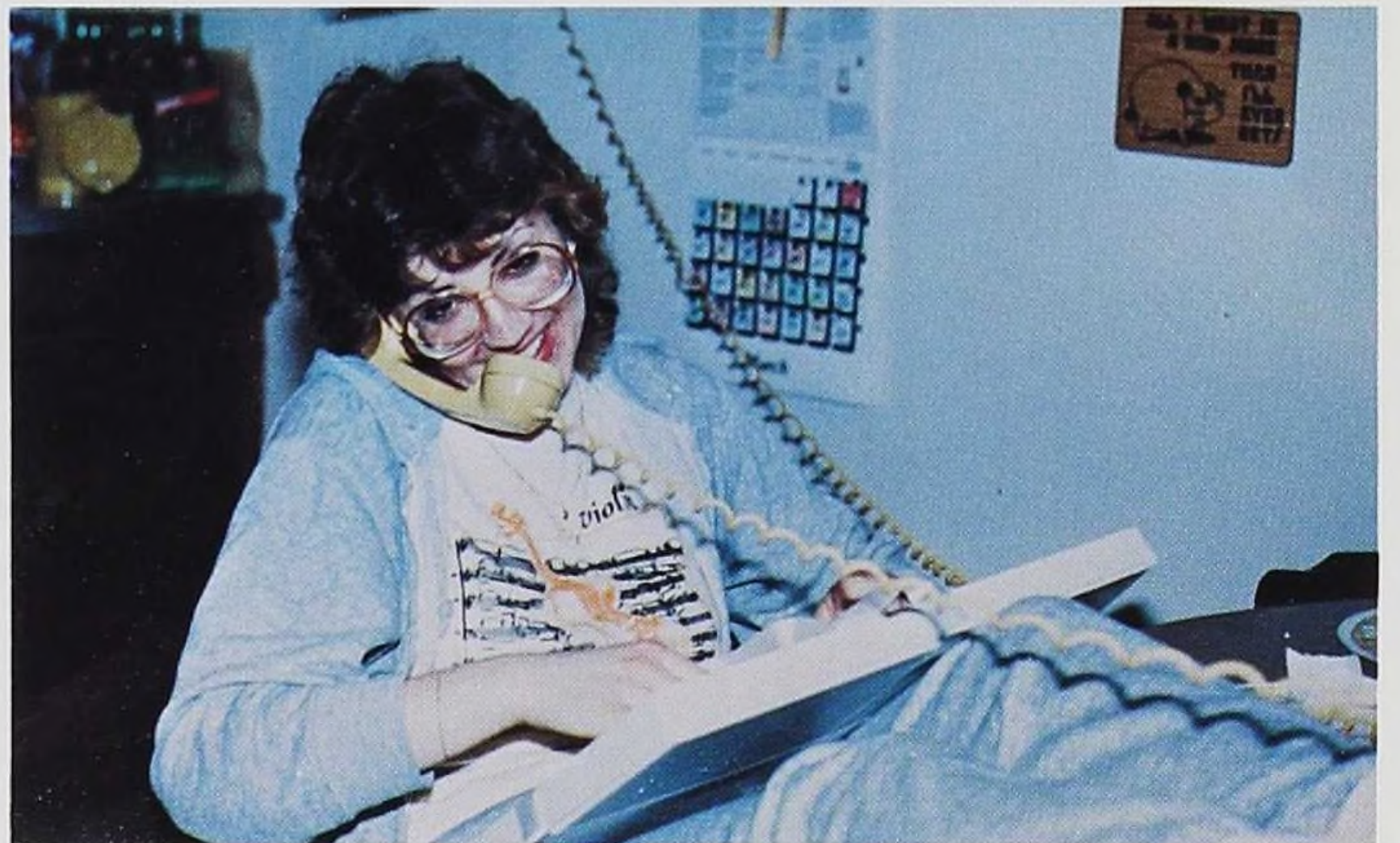
\*Faculty remember her knowledge, competency and the concern which a true love and appreciation of teaching sharpens.

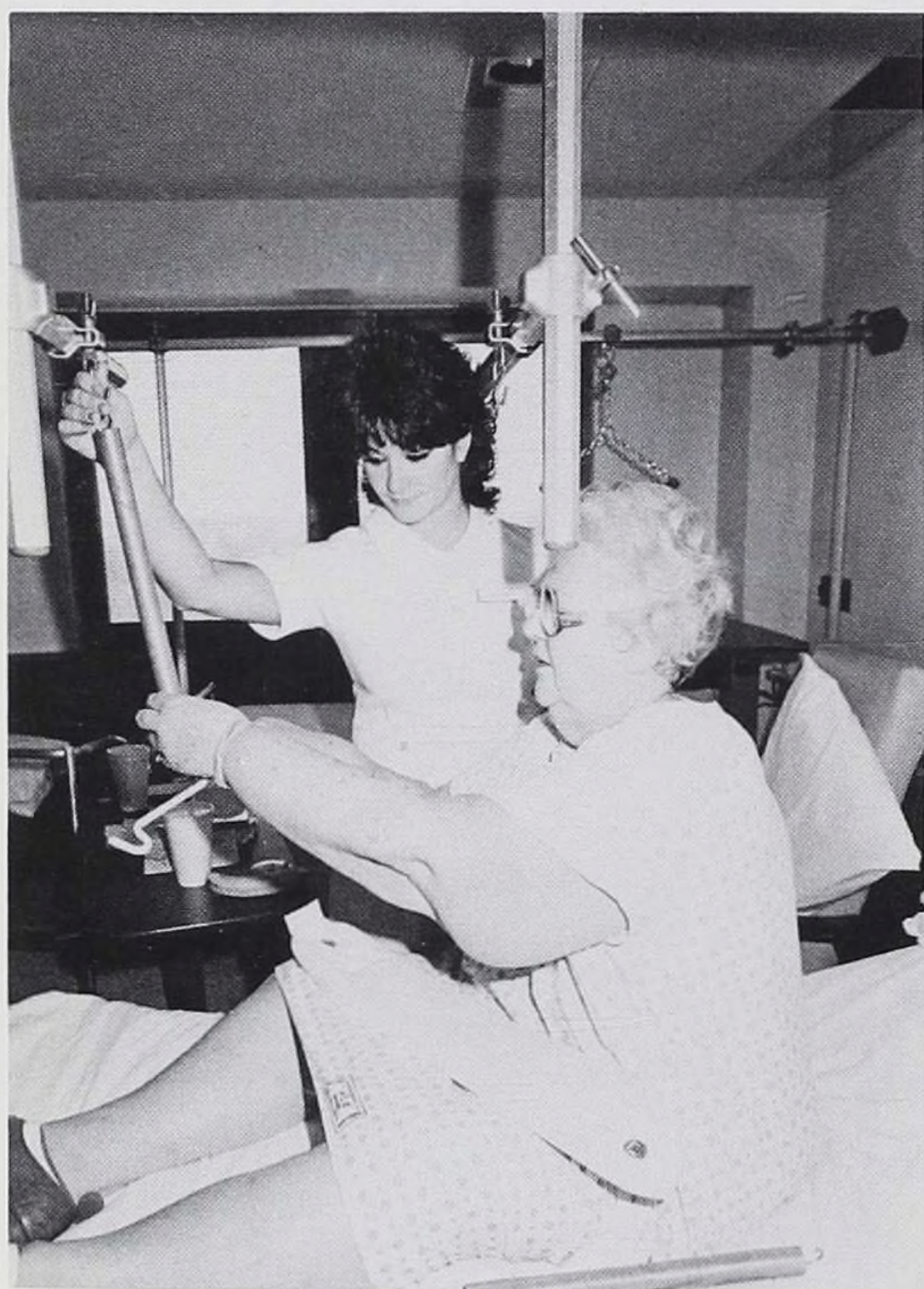


# C.A.P. IA AND IB

Nursing Care of the Adult Patient I consists of two courses, C.A.P. IA and IB. In the first course the student is introduced to medical-surgical nursing. Principles from the behavioral, physical and social science are applied. The nursing process, and the concepts of wholistic nursing and stress and adaptation are introduced. Patient care experiences are provided in medical and surgical units and selected community facilities. C.A.P. IB continues to expand the concepts previously presented. Emphasis is placed on promoting adaptation to stressors affecting selected body functions. Discussion of community health aspects in related areas is included. Patient care experiences include the presurgical holding area, operating room, recovery room, and the ambulatory surgery center.

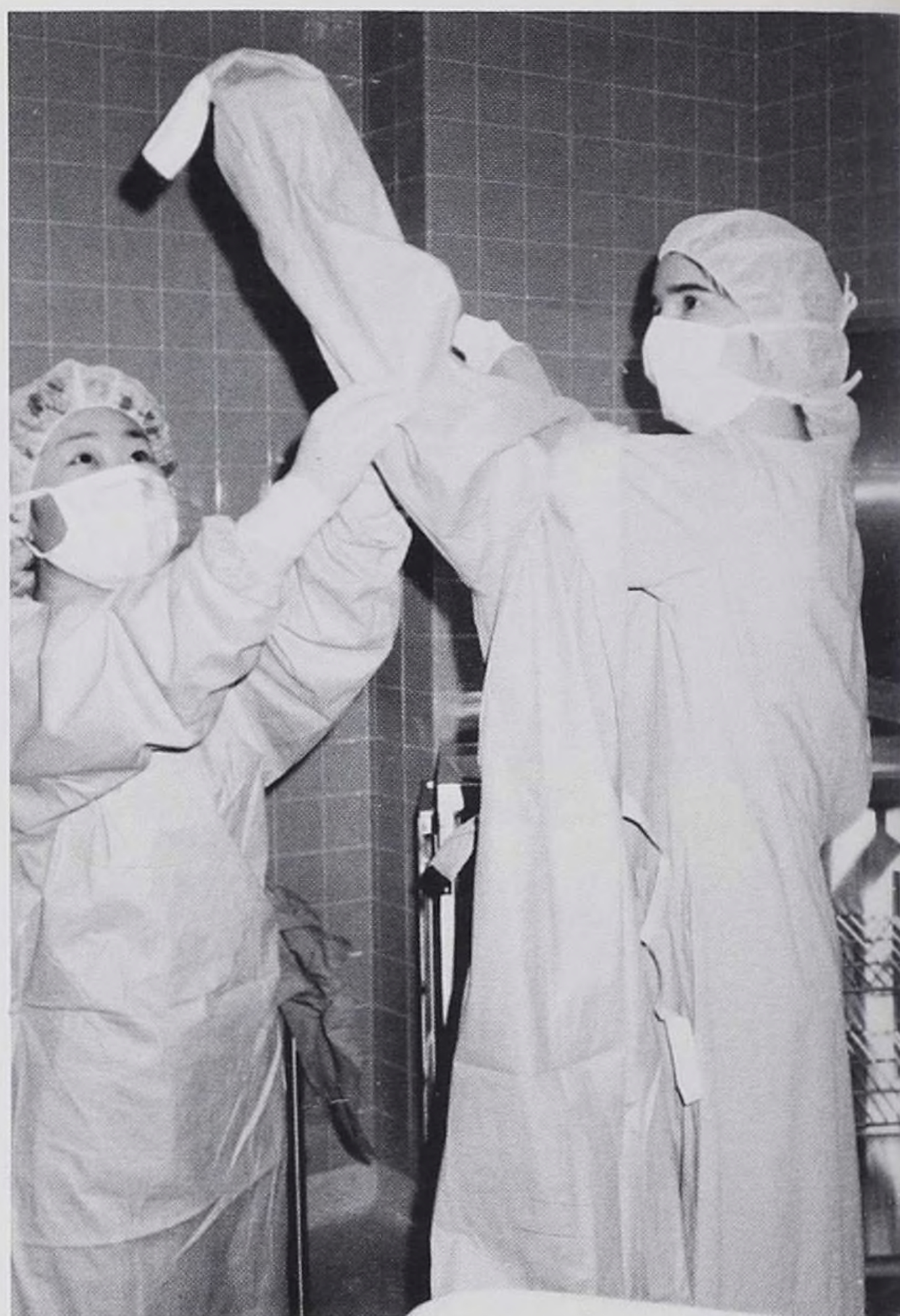


# MATERNITY NURSING

This course focuses on wholistic nursing care during the childbearing and initial childrearing phases of life. Special emphasis is placed on childbirth as a family-centered event. Nursing assumes the responsibility for assisting families to achieve their own goals within the concept of high-level wellness. Other concepts relevant to selected high risk mothers, infants and families are included and applied. The basic principles of family planning as they relate to nursing are explored. Various gynecologic alterations that may arise in the adult female throughout the reproductive cycle are studied. Clinical nursing experiences occur in the hospital, in obstetricians' offices, in community agencies, and in the home.

# NURSING OF CHILDREN

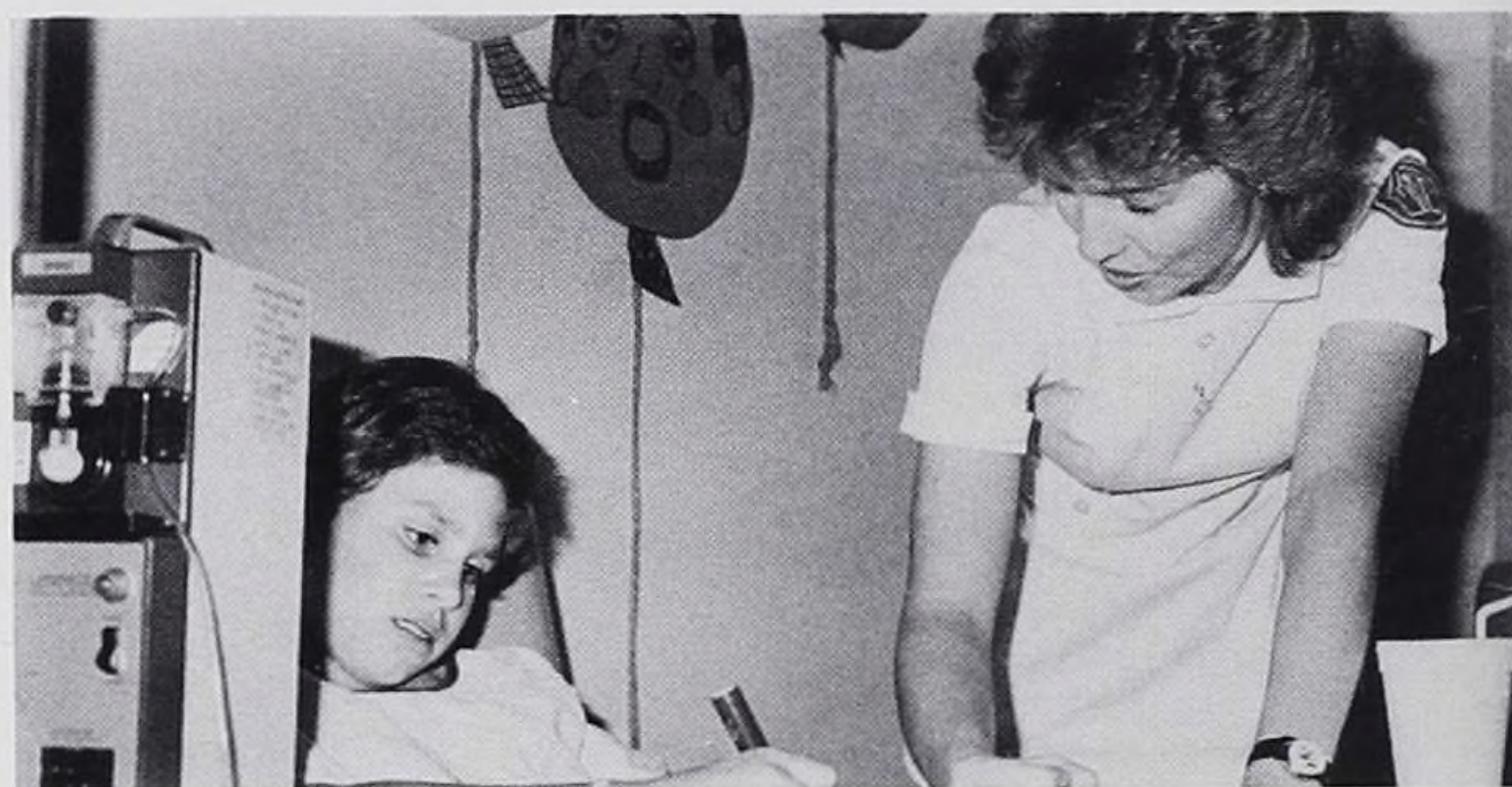
This course provides a wholistic approach to the nursing care of the child and family. Interaction with children at various points along the health-illness continuum is provided. Emphasis is placed on the child and family undergoing stress and adaptation in physical, psychological, intellectual, spiritual, and social modes. Principles and concepts from physical-biological and psychosocial sciences are employed to provide a rational basis for the nursing process. Patient care experiences occur on the pediatric units, adolescent unit, neonatal intensive care and the ambulatory care clinics.

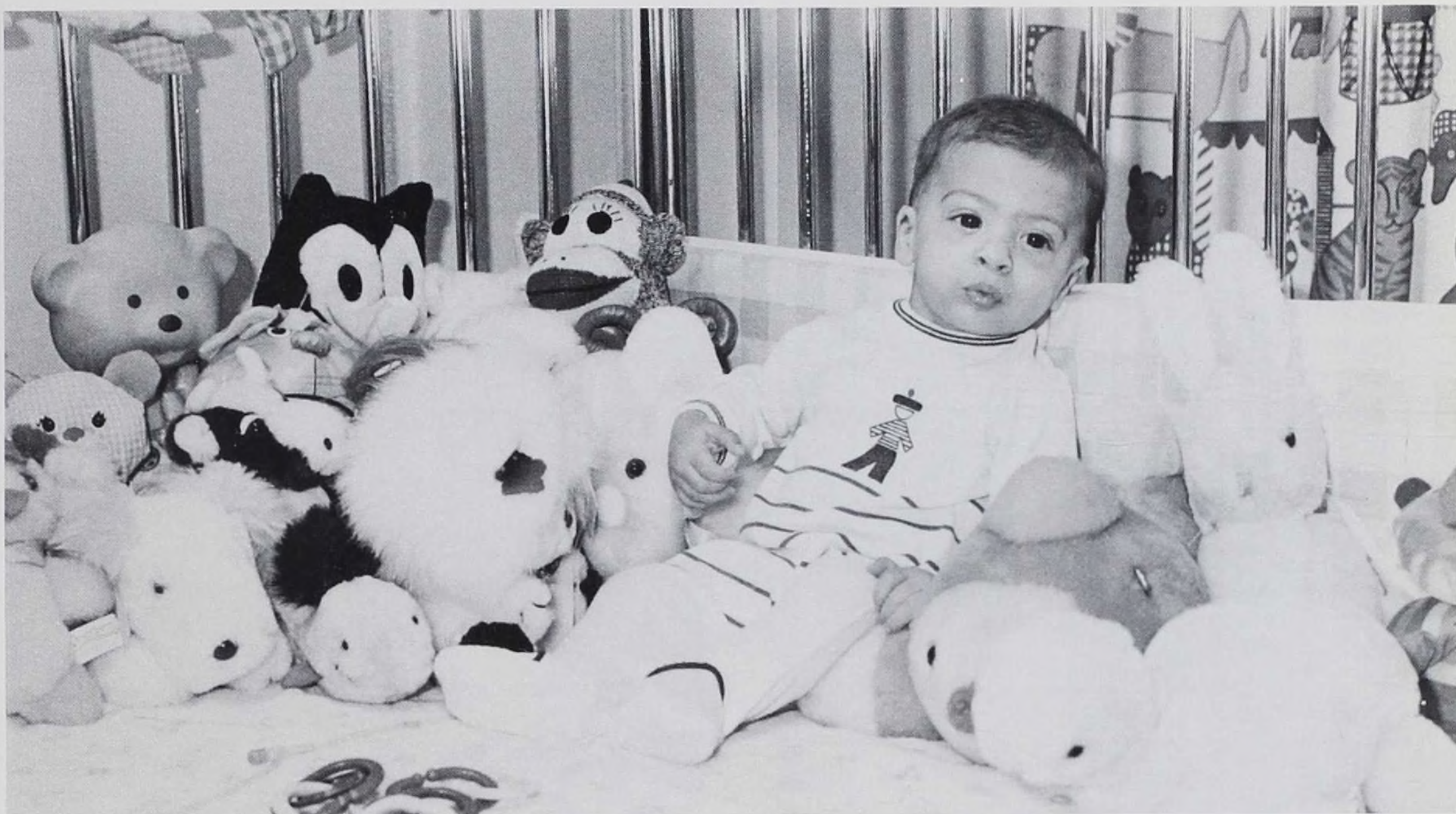

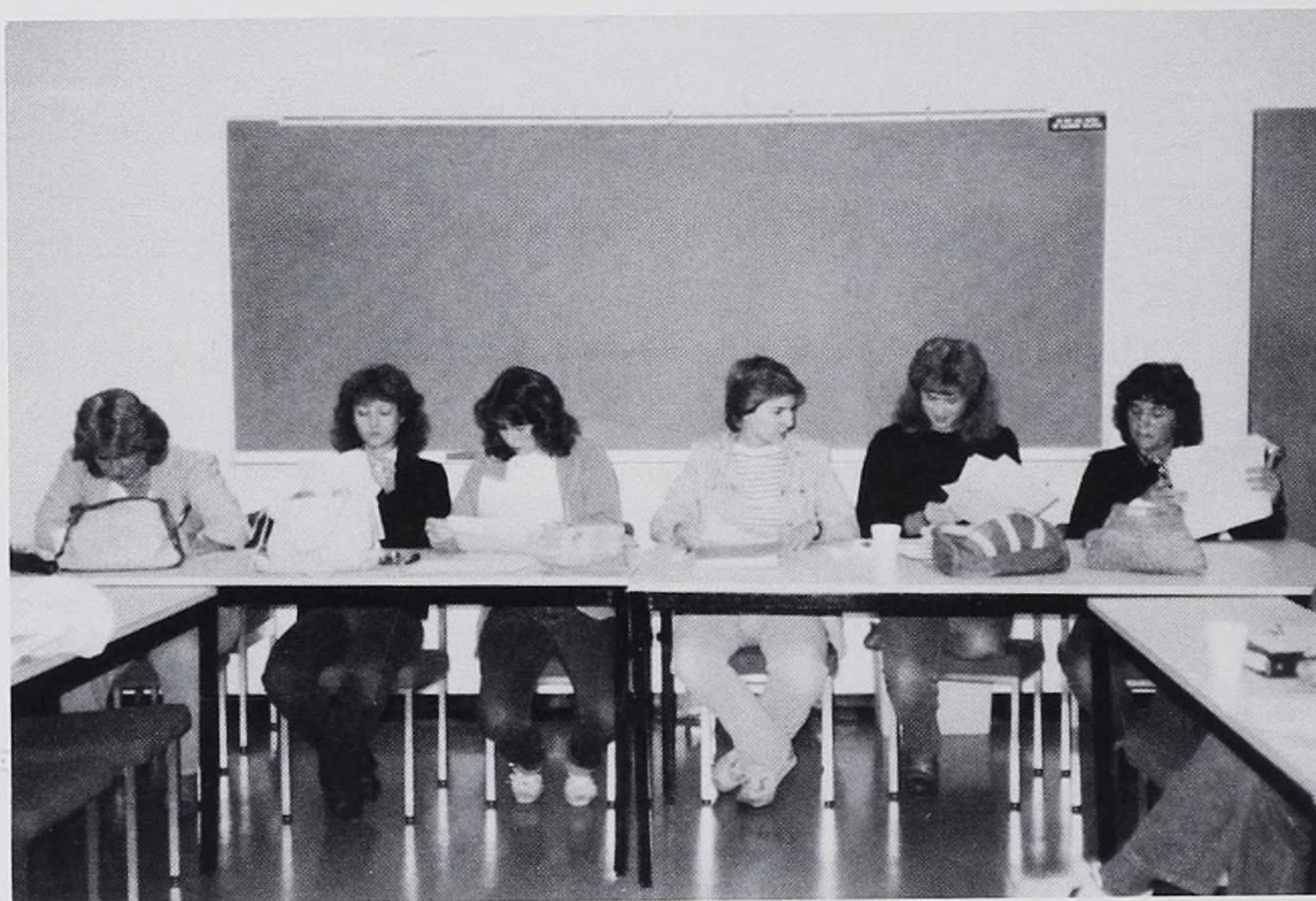


## C.A.P. II

This course focuses on the concepts and principles of rehabilitation and gerontological nursing. The student studies the effects of aging and physical disability on the individual, the family, and the community. 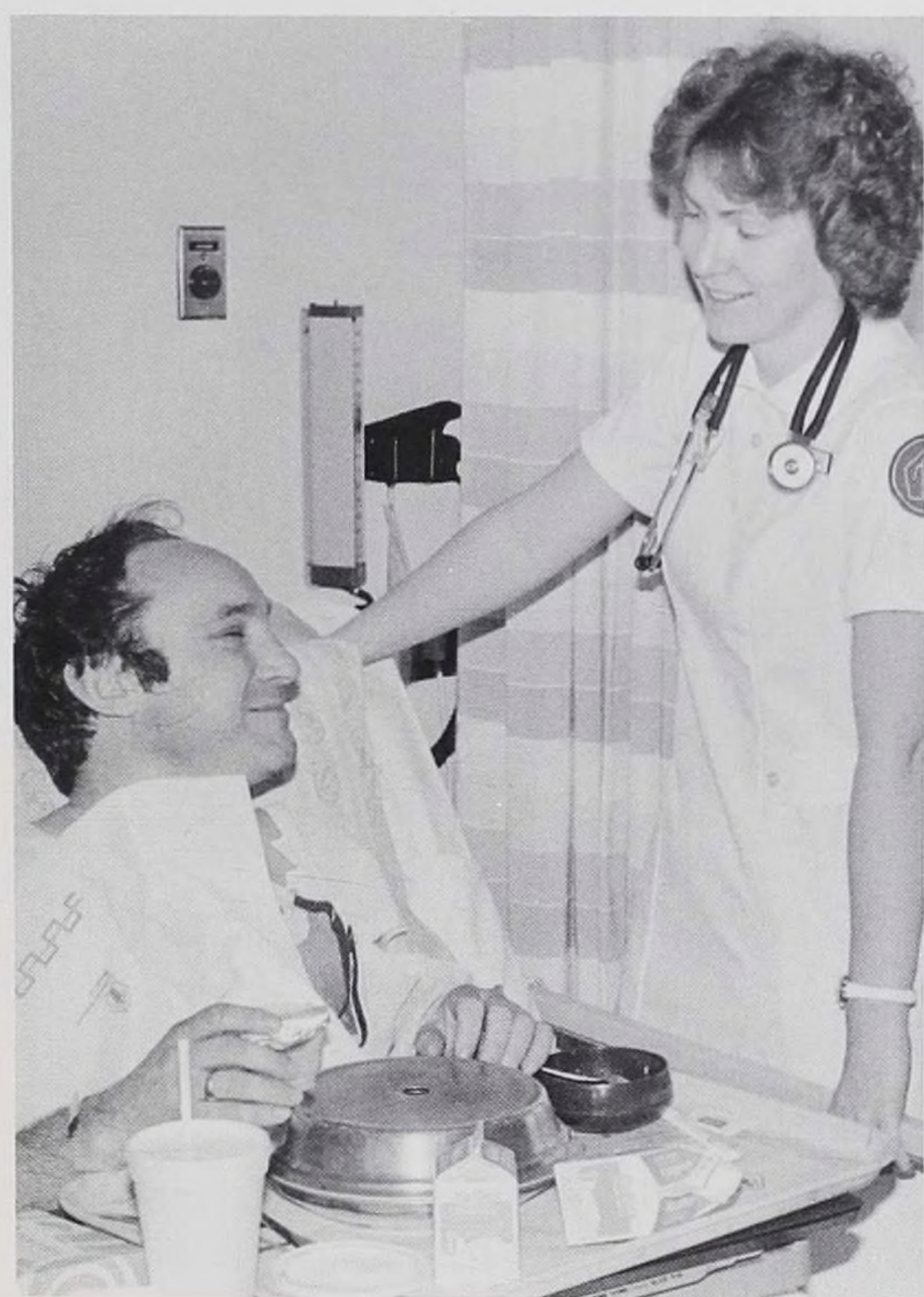


# C.A.P. III

This course focuses on the application of the philosophy of Human Ecology to critical care nursing. The effects of critical illness on the patient, the family, and the health care provider are identified. Nursing management of selected pulmonary, cardiovascular, renal, and neurological alterations is presented. Patient care experiences are provided in various critical care units, a cardiac-renal surveillance unit and a cardiac rehabilitation unit. Students investigate community facilities for treatment and rehabilitation following a critical illness or injury. The role of the professional nurse in the Emergency Department is explored.









# MANAGEMENT IN NURSING

The course, Management in Nursing, is designed to assist the student in exploring the management and leadership principles that affect the practice of professional nursing. Learning activities are based on the premise that by understanding leadership components and applying management principles and functions, the student can begin to practice professional nursing in the community. During this course the student functions in the role of staff nurse, primary nurse, and team leader.

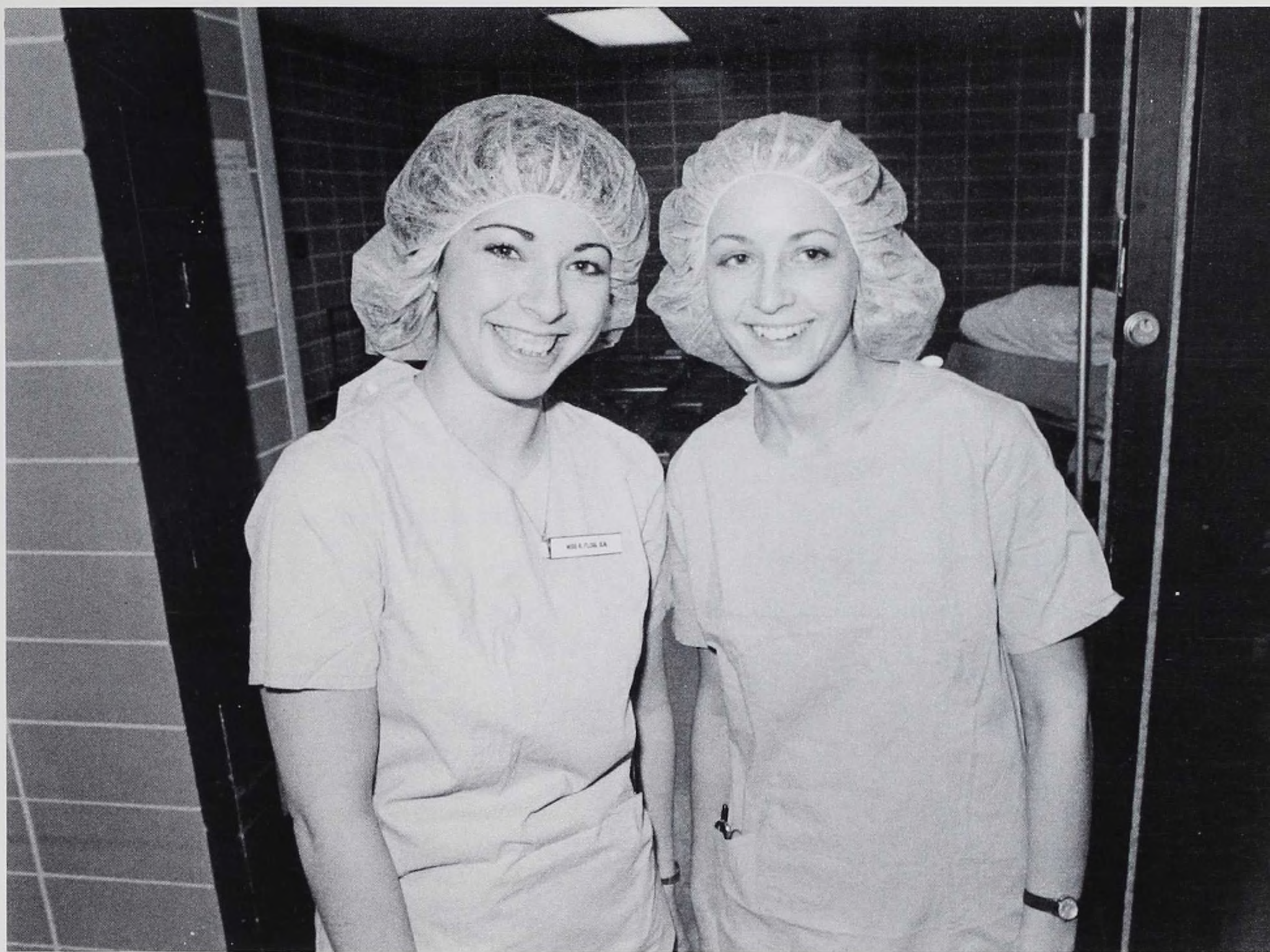
