GEORGE WILLIAMS COLLEGE

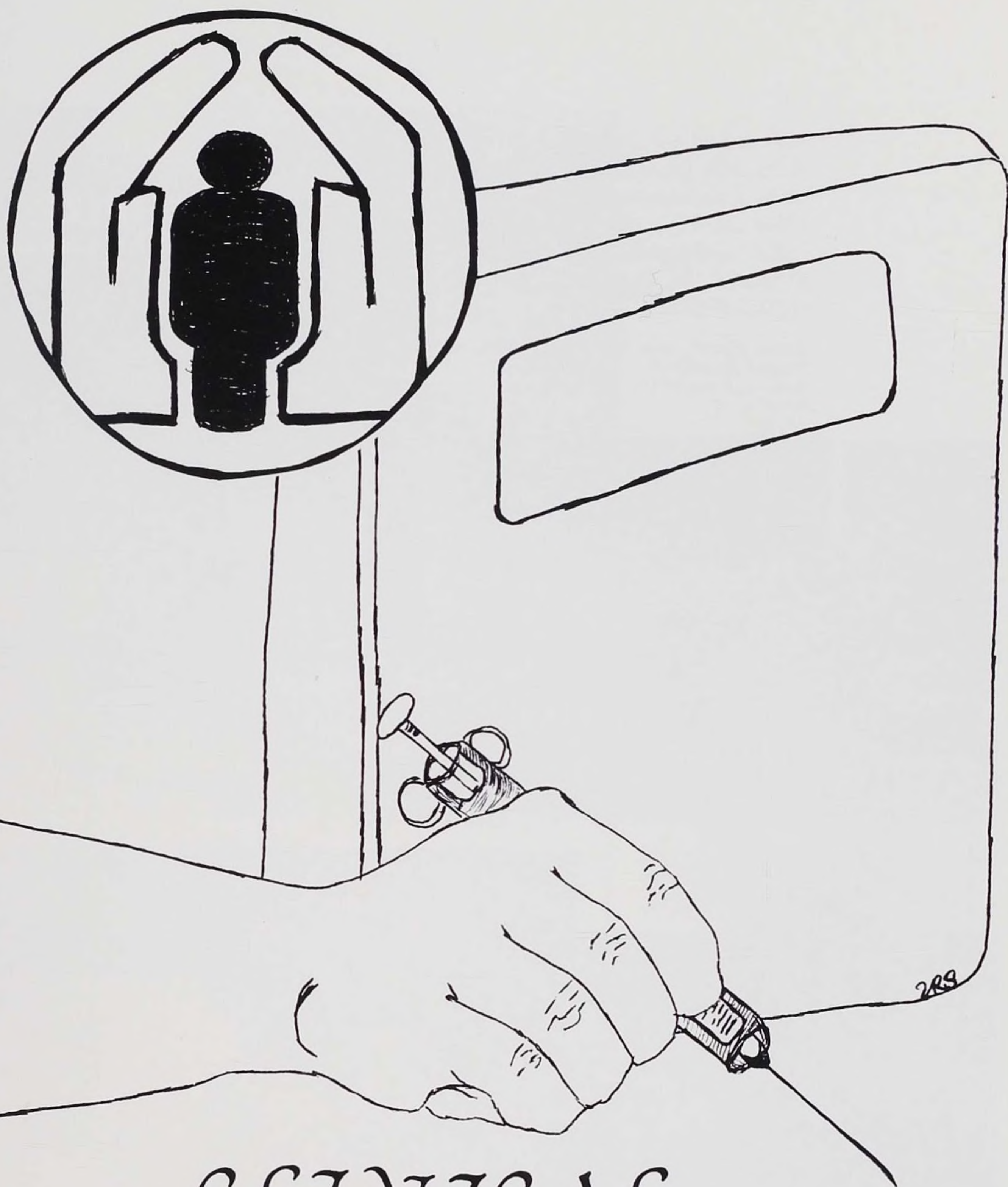

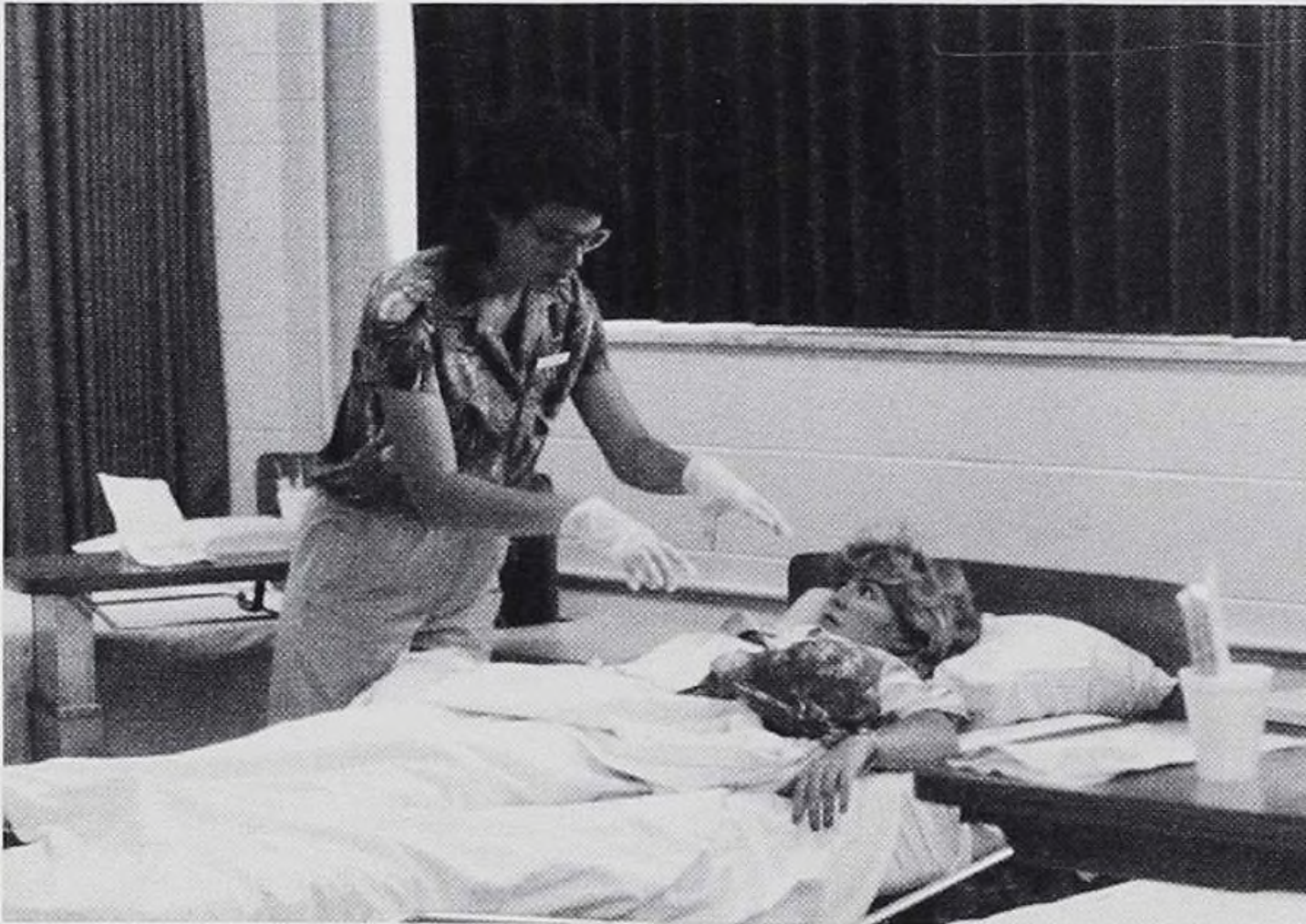


CLINICAL

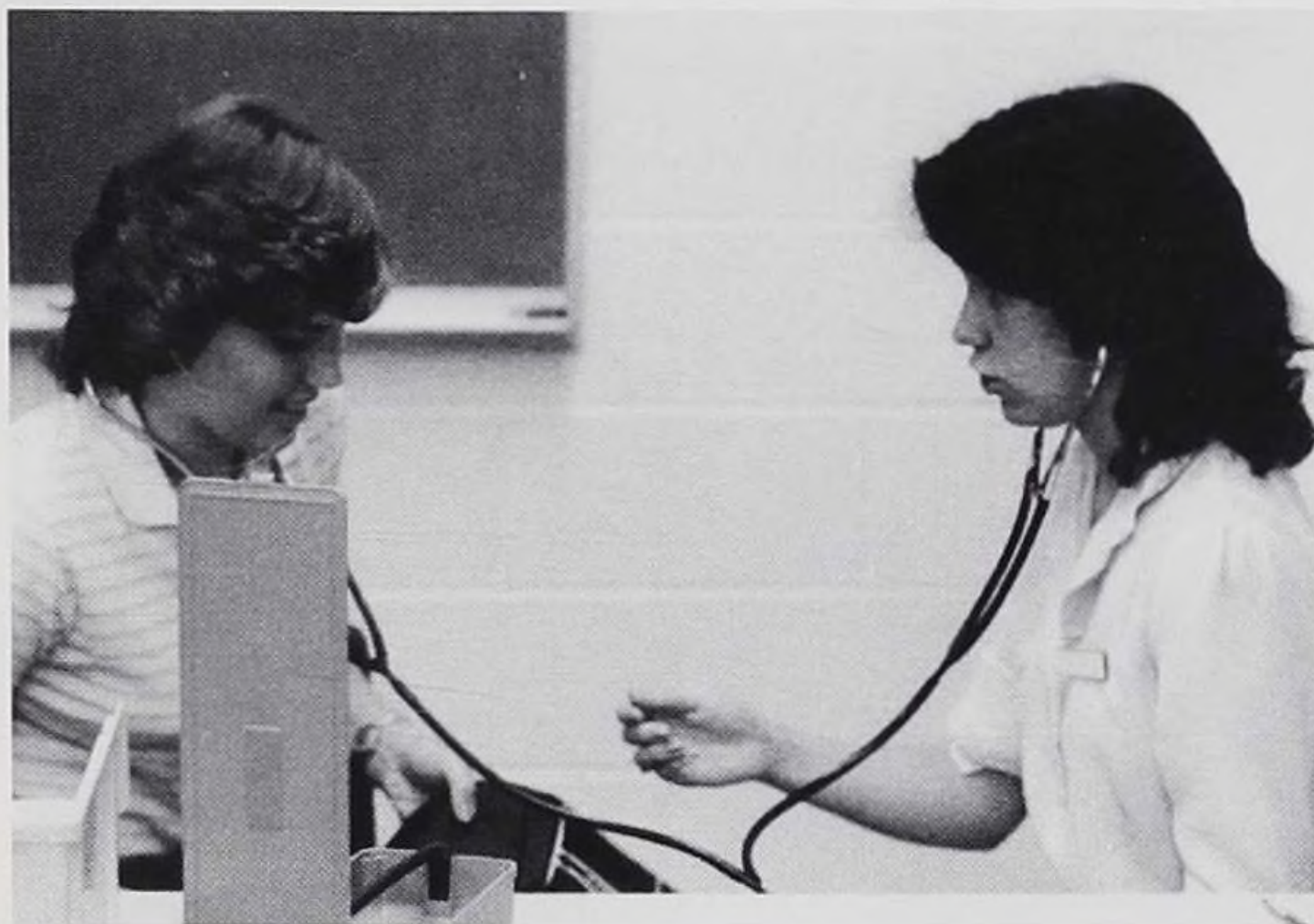

C.A.P. IB

This second medical-surgical nursing course continues to focus on the concepts of stress and adaptation in the adult. The application of the nursing process and adaptation of body systems is expanded. Clinical settings include medical-surgical and orthopedic units.

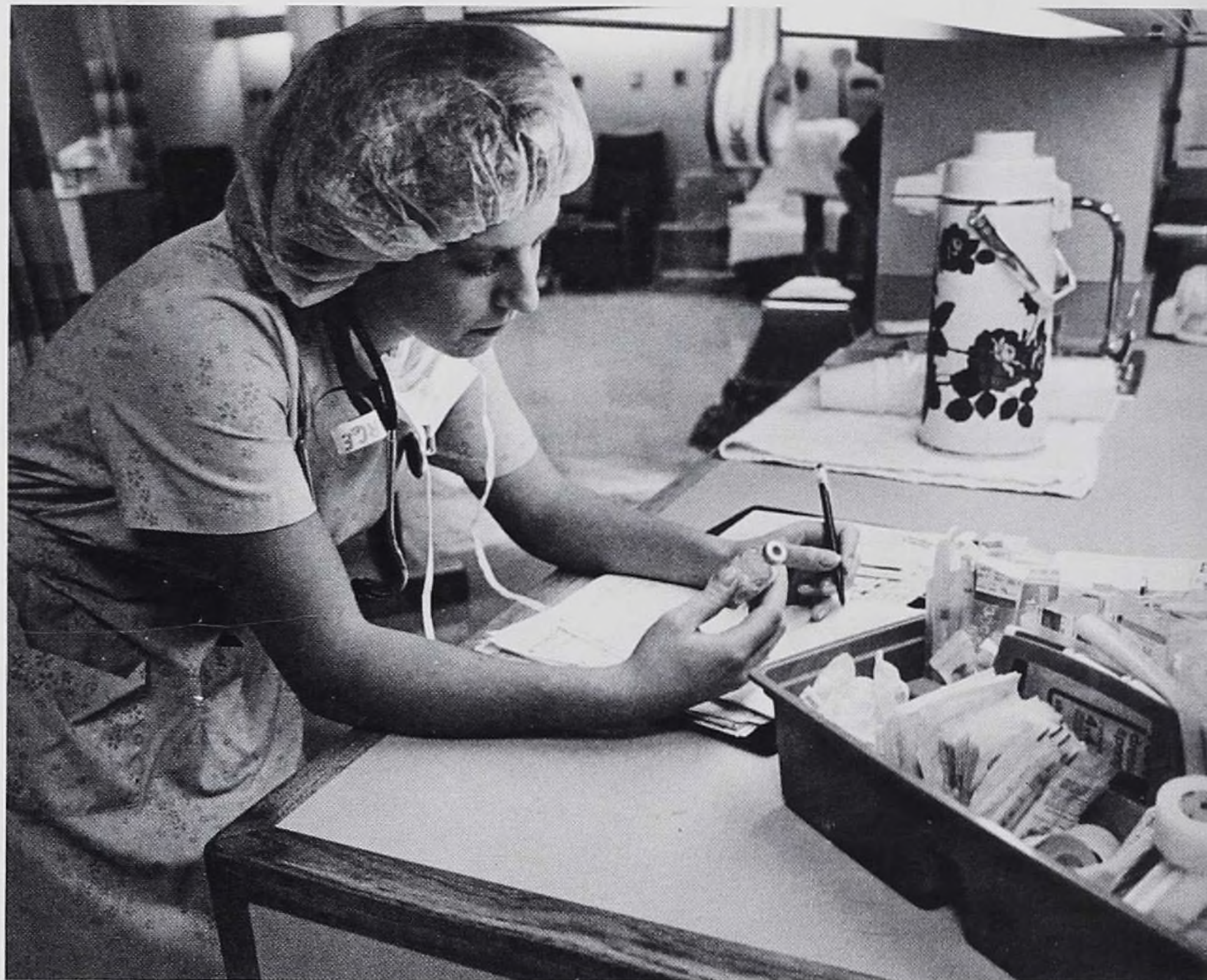

C.A.P. IB SURGICAL ROTATION

C.A.P. II

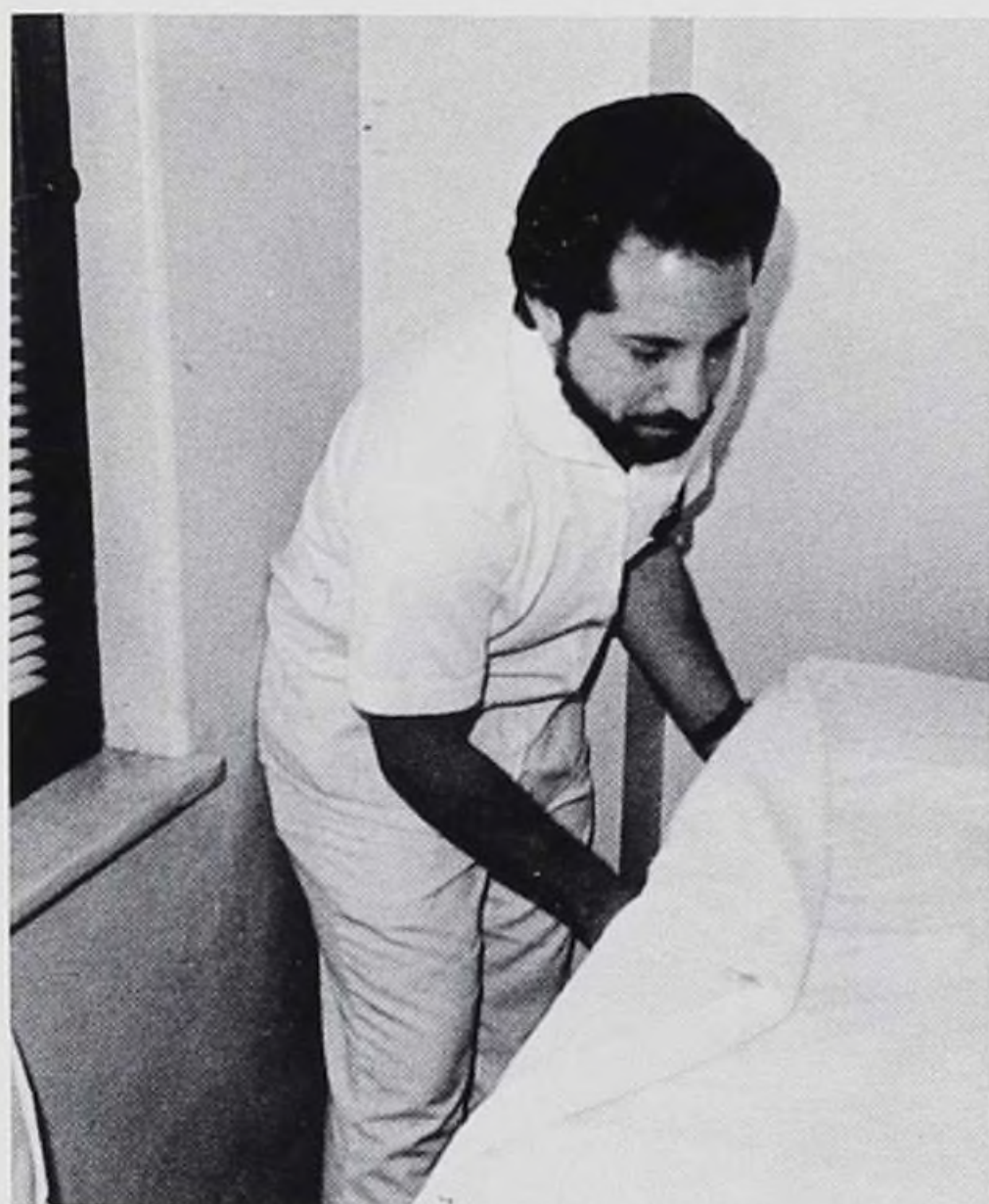
This course focuses on the concepts of rehabilitation and gerontological nursing. The student studies the effects of aging and physical disability on the individual, family, and the community. Emphasis is placed on the nursing care of patients in the process of rehabilitative therapies, long term illness and the biological and psychological effects of aging. Clinical experiences occur on both a medical unit and a rehabilitation unit.

PSYCHIATRIC NURSING

This course focuses on the use of developmental and interpersonal concepts of human behavior. The application of mental health principles and psychiatric nursing techniques to a variety of psychiatric and non-psychiatric settings is explored. The student is provided the opportunity to develop the knowledge, skills and attitudes essential for therapeutic communication. Clinical knowledge was gained on a psychiatric unit at Lutheran General Hospital and at the Lutheran Center for Substance Abuse.

MATERNITY NURSING

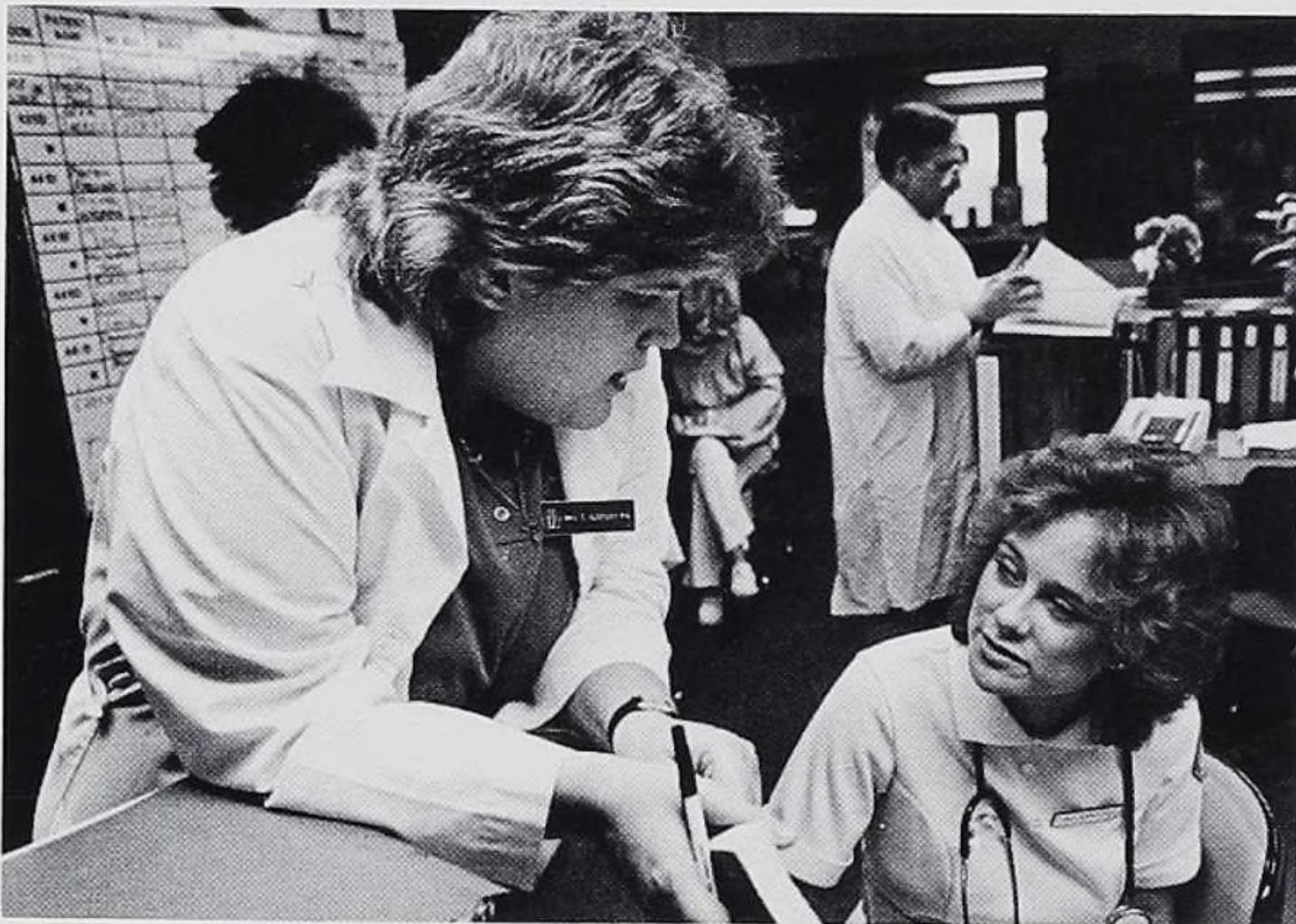
This course includes the study of nursing interventions to meet the needs of a woman during her life cycle. Special emphasis is placed on childbirth as a family-centered event. Assessment and nursing interventions for the normal and high-risk newborn are introduced. The basic principles of male and female reproductive function as they apply to nursing are explored.





NURSING OF CHILDREN

This course provides a wholistic approach to the nursing care of the child and family. Interaction with children at various points along the health-illness continuum is provided. Emphasis is placed on the child and family undergoing stress and adaption in physical, psychological, intellectual, spiritual, and social modes. Principles and concepts from physical-biological and psychosocial sciences are employed to provide a rational basis for the nursing process. Patient care experiences occur on the pediatric units, adolescent unit, neonatal intensive care and the ambulatory care clinics.

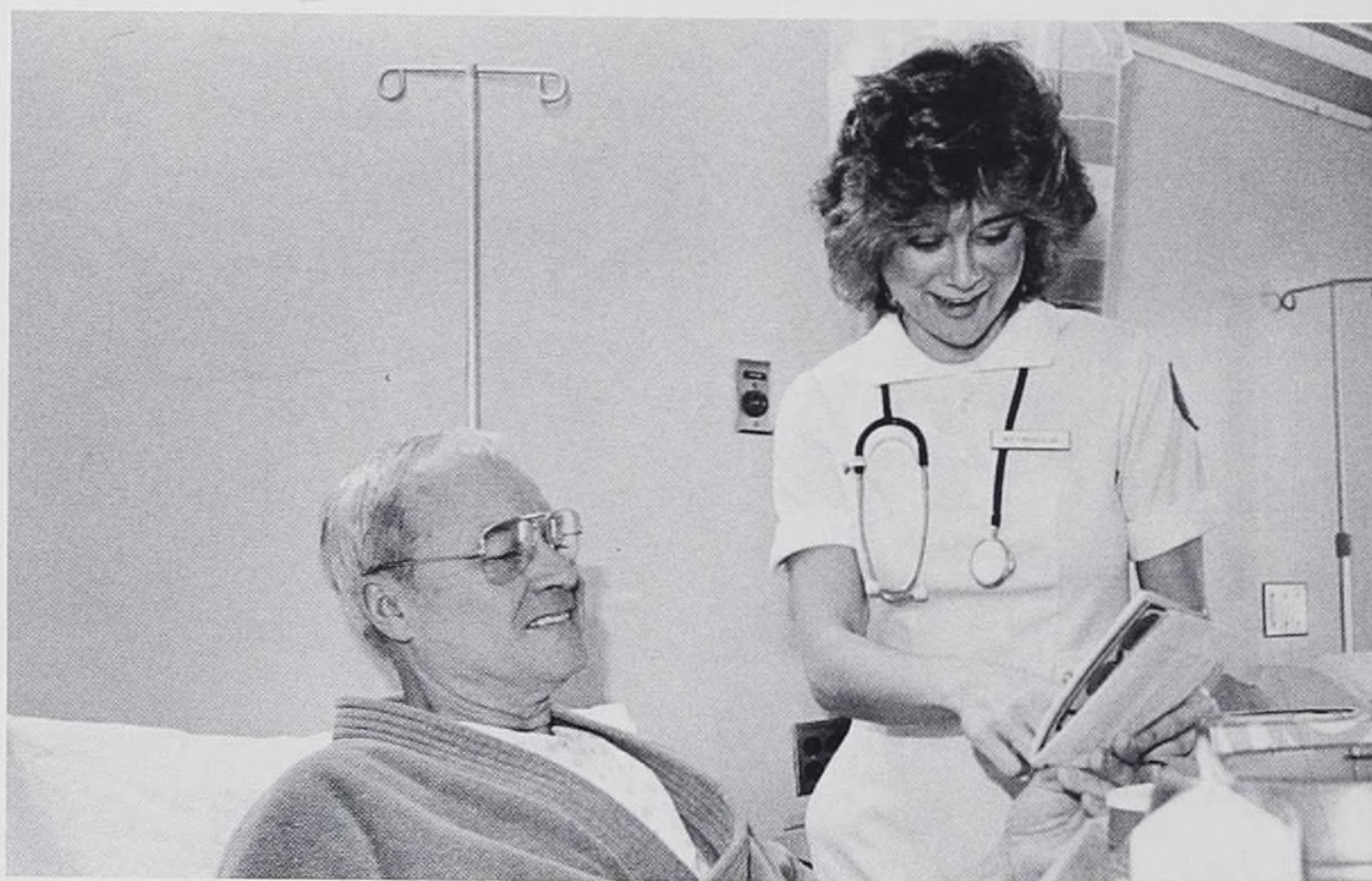
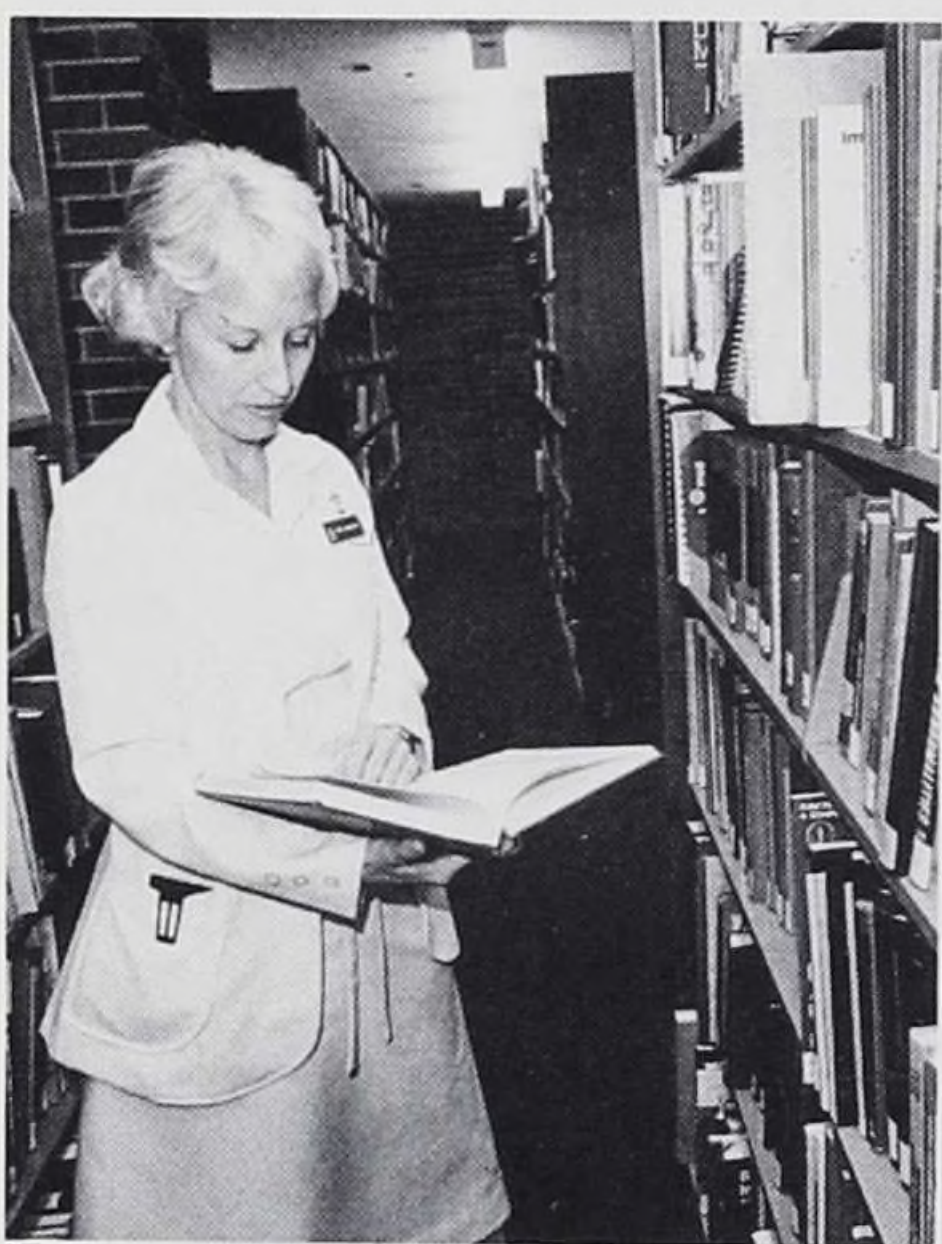
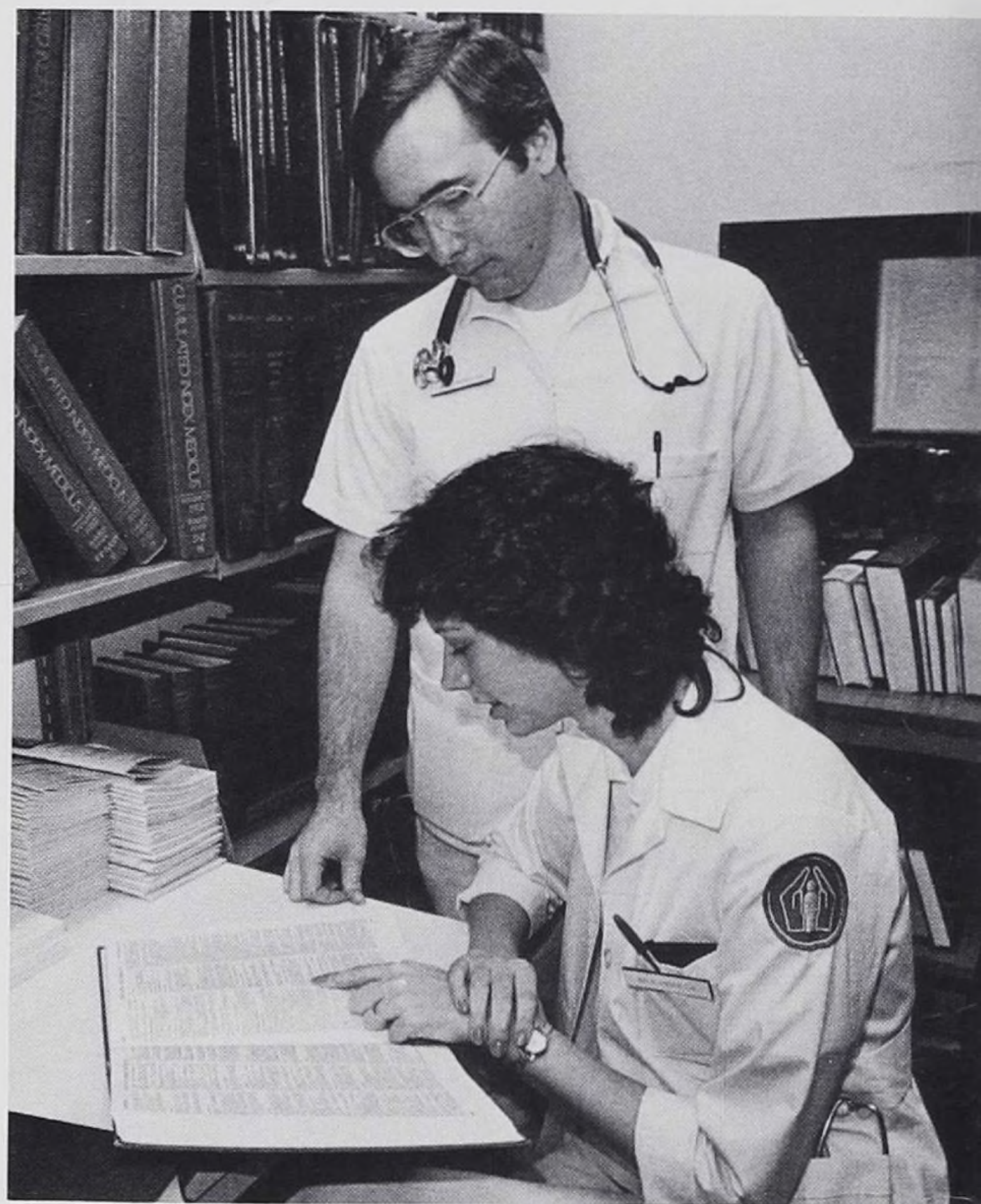

CAP III

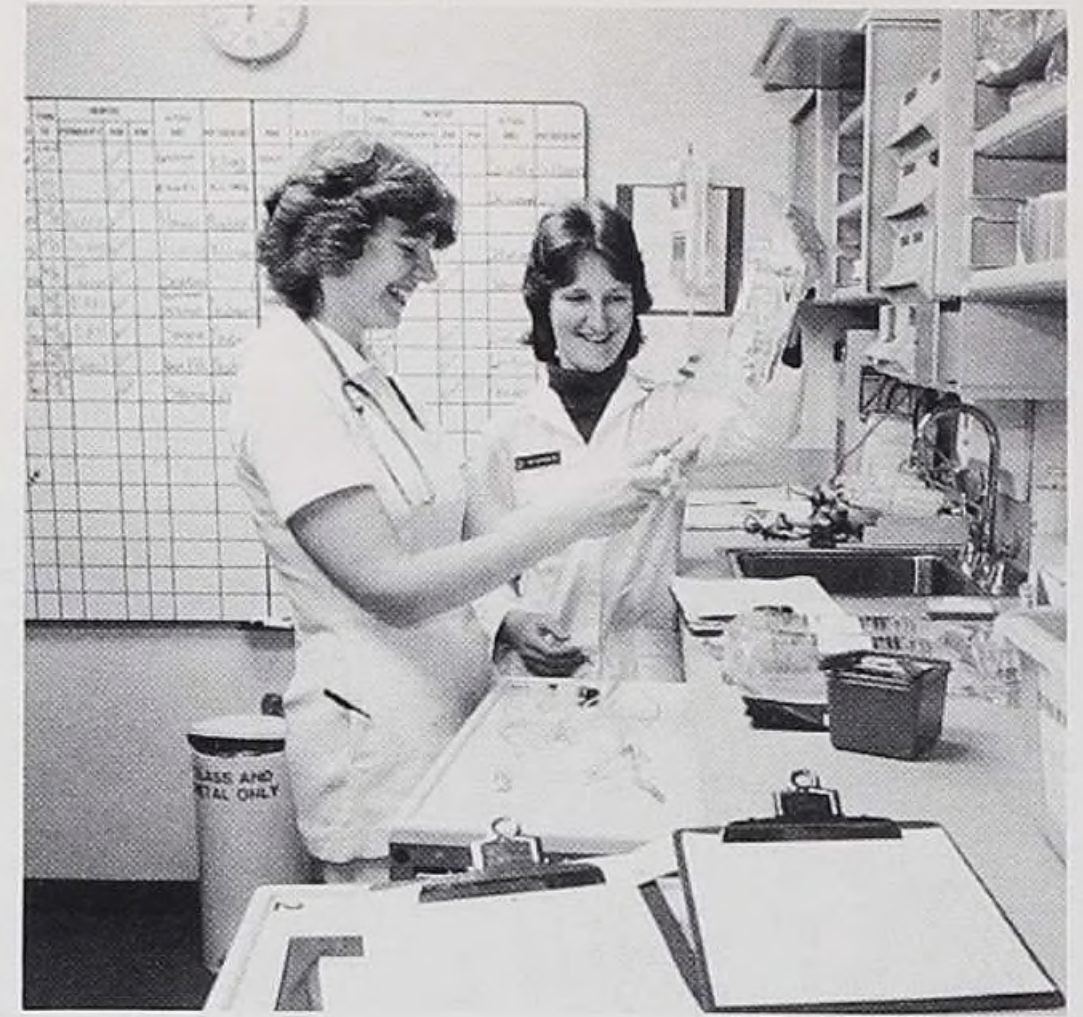
This course focuses on the application of the Philosophy of Human Ecology to critical care nursing. The effects of critical illness on the patient, the family, and the health care provider are identified. Nursing management of selected pulmonary, cardiovascular, renal, and neurological alterations is presented. Patient care experiences are provided in various critical care units, a cardiac-renal surveillance unit and a cardiac rehabilitation unit. Students investigate community facilities for treatment and rehabilitation following a critical illness or injury. The role of the professional nurse in the Emergency Department is explored.





MANAGEMENT IN NURSING

The course Management in Nursing is designed to assist the student in exploring the management and leadership principles that affect the practice of professional nursing. Learning activities are based on the premise that by understanding leadership components and applying management principles and functions, the student can begin to practice professional nursing in the community. During this course the student functions in the role of staff nurse, primary nurse, and team leader.
