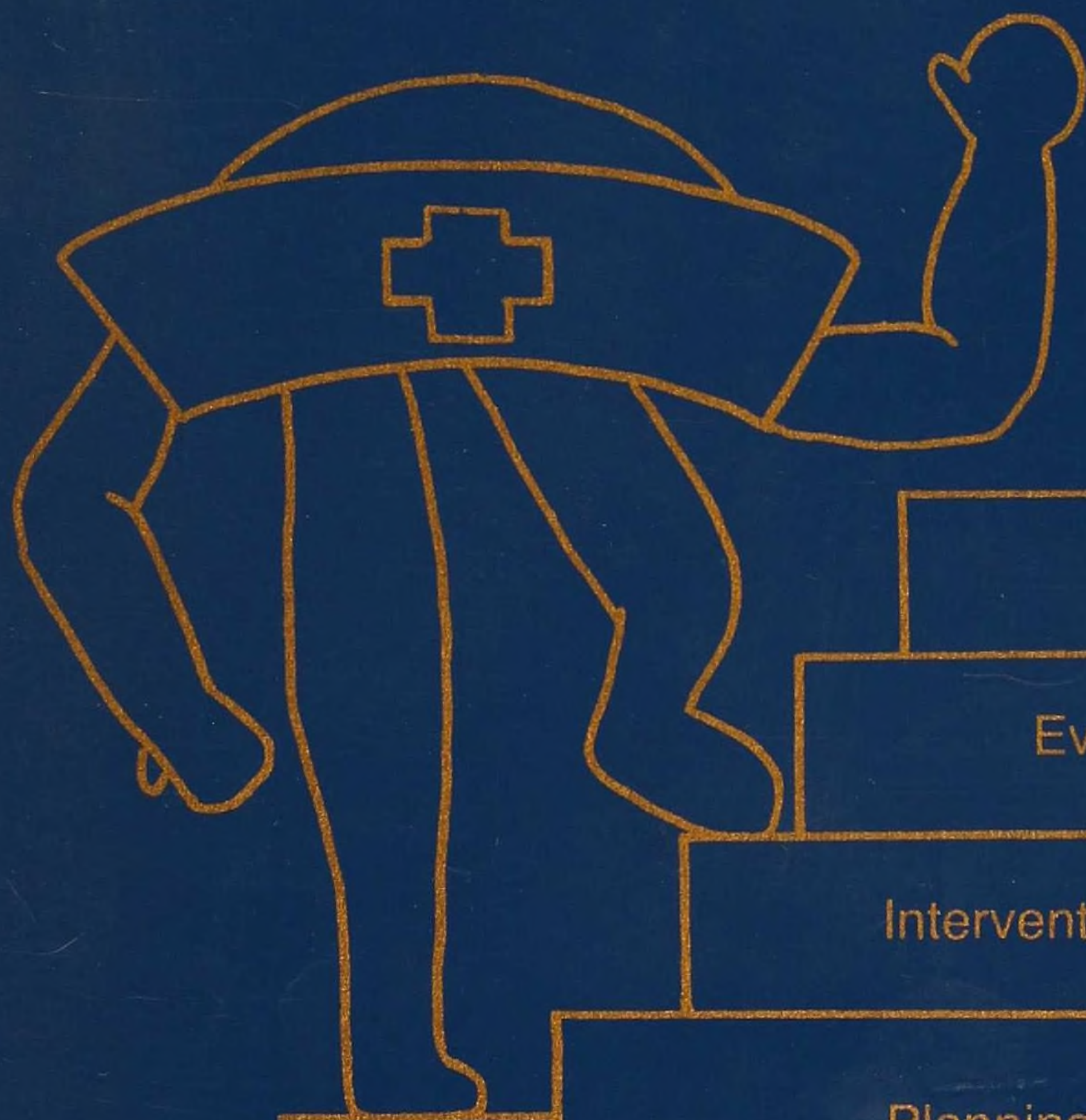

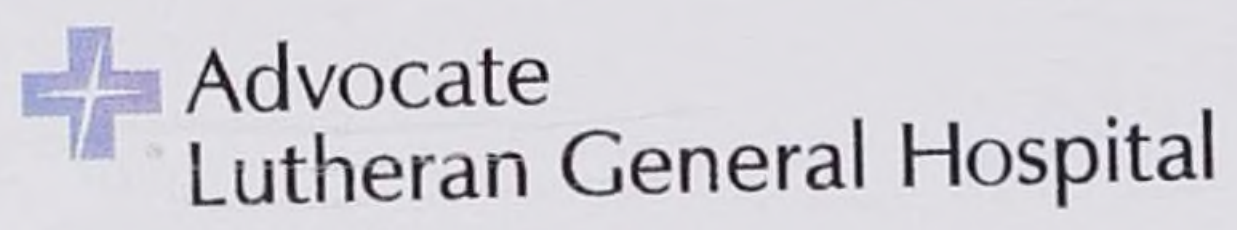

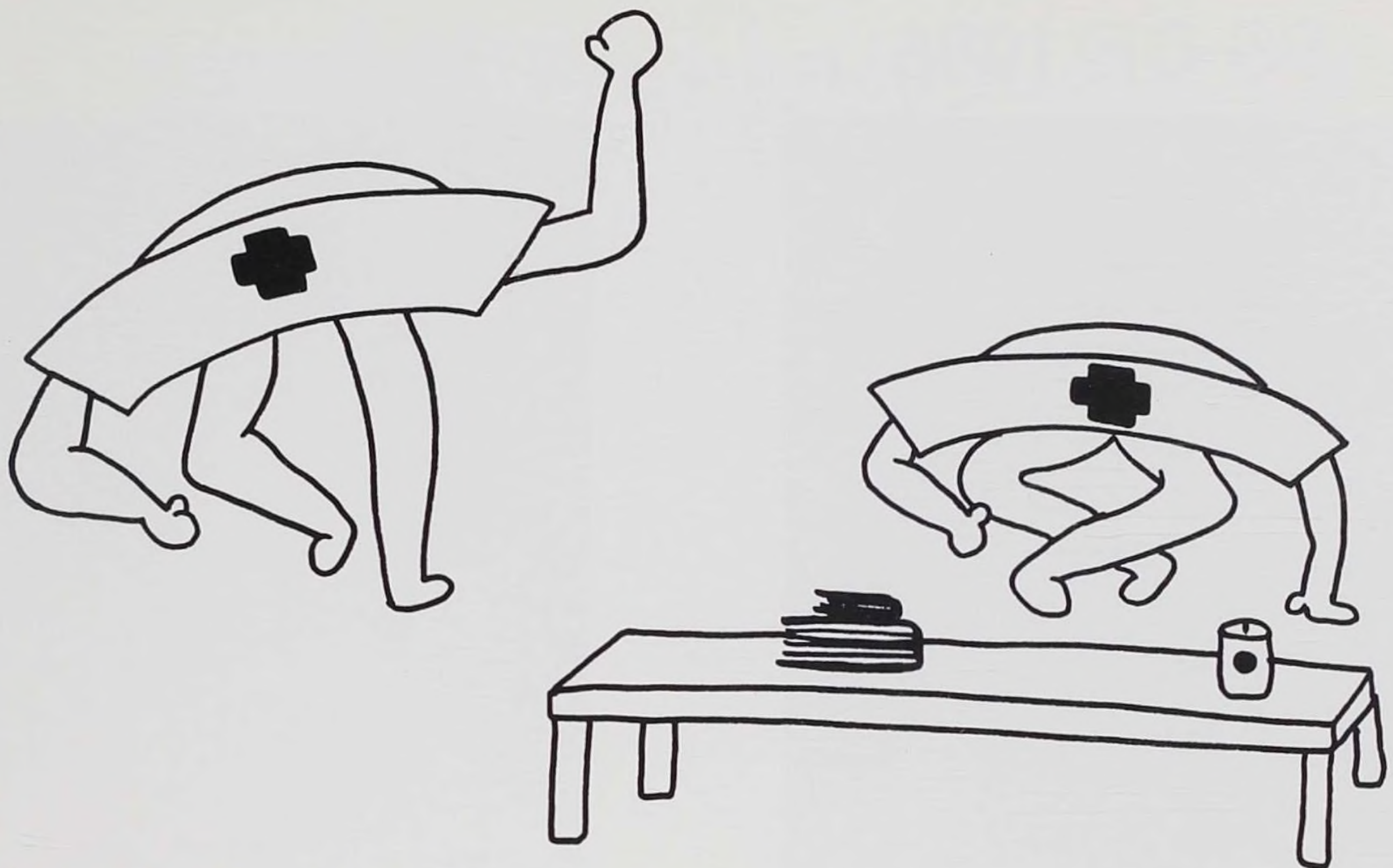
In remembering Dr. Garsenstein, he was a man of many talents, the doctor, astute teacher, and also as the loving husband and father.

Born March 25, 1932, in Rochester, New York, Myron Garsenstein was to become a doctor. In pursuance of this goal he graduated from Northwestern University in 1953. In 1957 he received his medical degree from the University of Buffalo. His postgraduate training included an internship and residency at Rochester General Hospital until 1960. He also completed two research fellowships in Nephrology, the first from 1960 to 1961, with R.M. Kark M.D., University of Illinois; and the second from 1961 to 1962, with S. Sherlock M.D., Royal Free Hospital, University of London.

Dr. Garsenstein's medical career was quite varied. Through his private practice he shared his knowledge and concern with his patients and their families. A member of numerous hospital medical staffs, Dr. Garsenstein's most recent affiliations were with Lutheran General and Skokie Valley Hospitals. As an associate in Medicine at Northwestern University School of Medicine and a consultant to Veteran's Administration Research Hospital, Dr. Garsenstein's commitment to education was strong. In addition, Dr. Garsenstein was a member and active participant in numerous professional organizations such as The American Medical Association, The Society of Nephrology, and The Chicago Medical Society.

Dr. Garsenstein is survived by his wife, Marie, and three daughters, Julia, Jennifer, and Johanna. Together the family shared many special interests such as travel and music. "Everything he did well and continually pursued new interests," says his daughter, Jennifer.

In recognition and appreciation of the superior nursing care administered to Dr. Garsenstein throughout his illness, his family requested that donations be made in his name to the Lutheran General Hospital School of Nursing. Their support and generosity will always be remembered.

Intervention: Students will successfully complete clinical rotations.

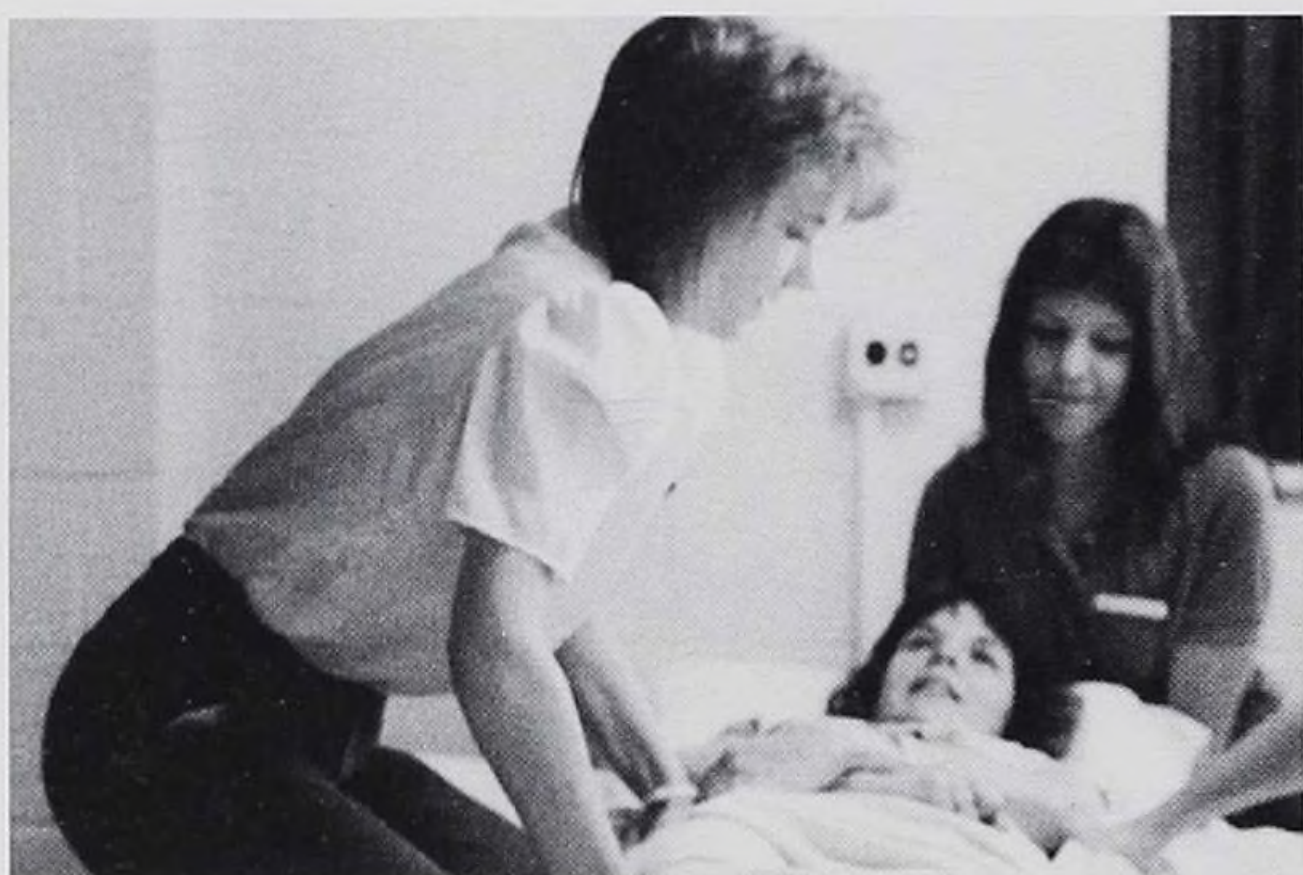


NURSING ARTS

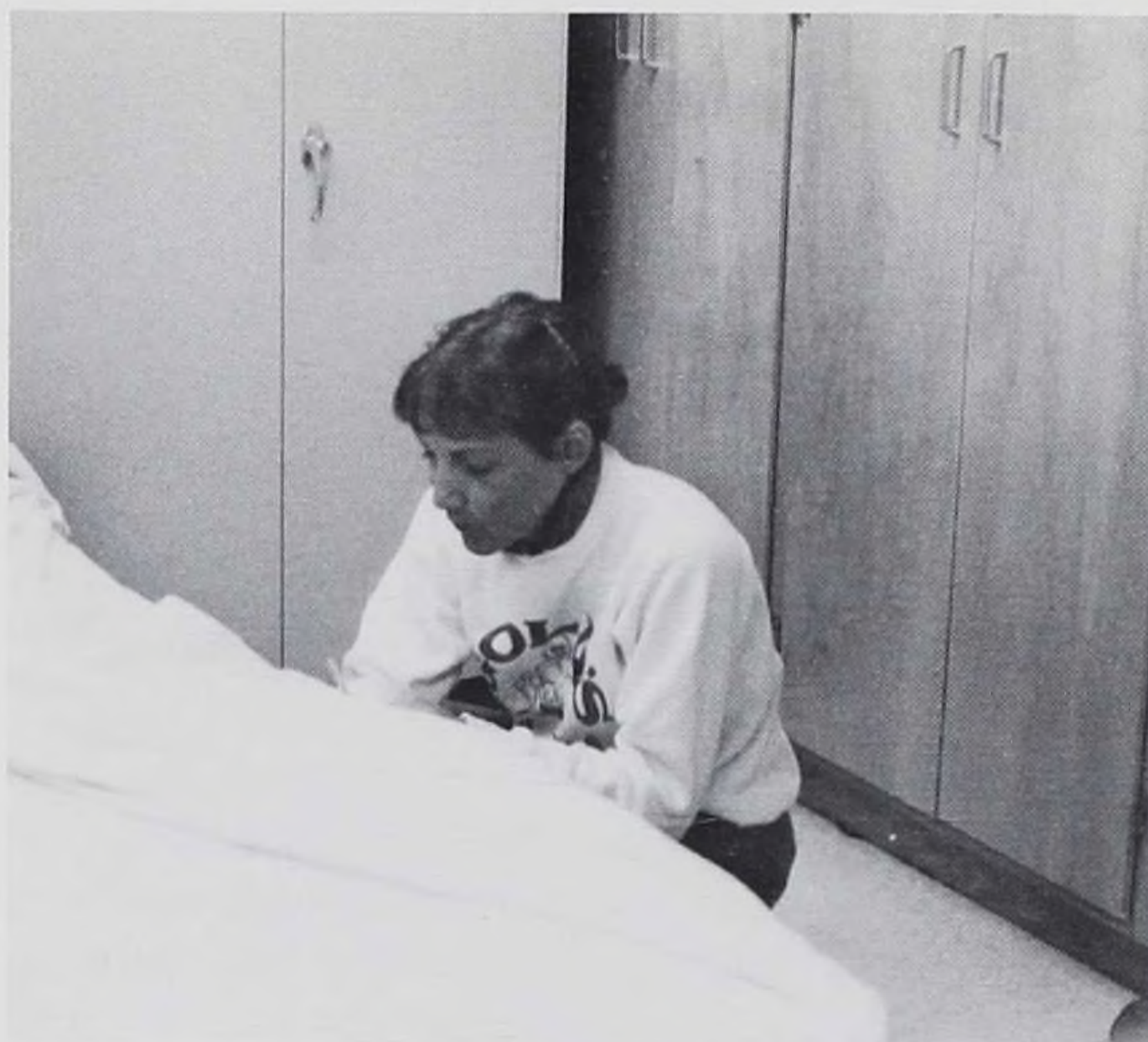

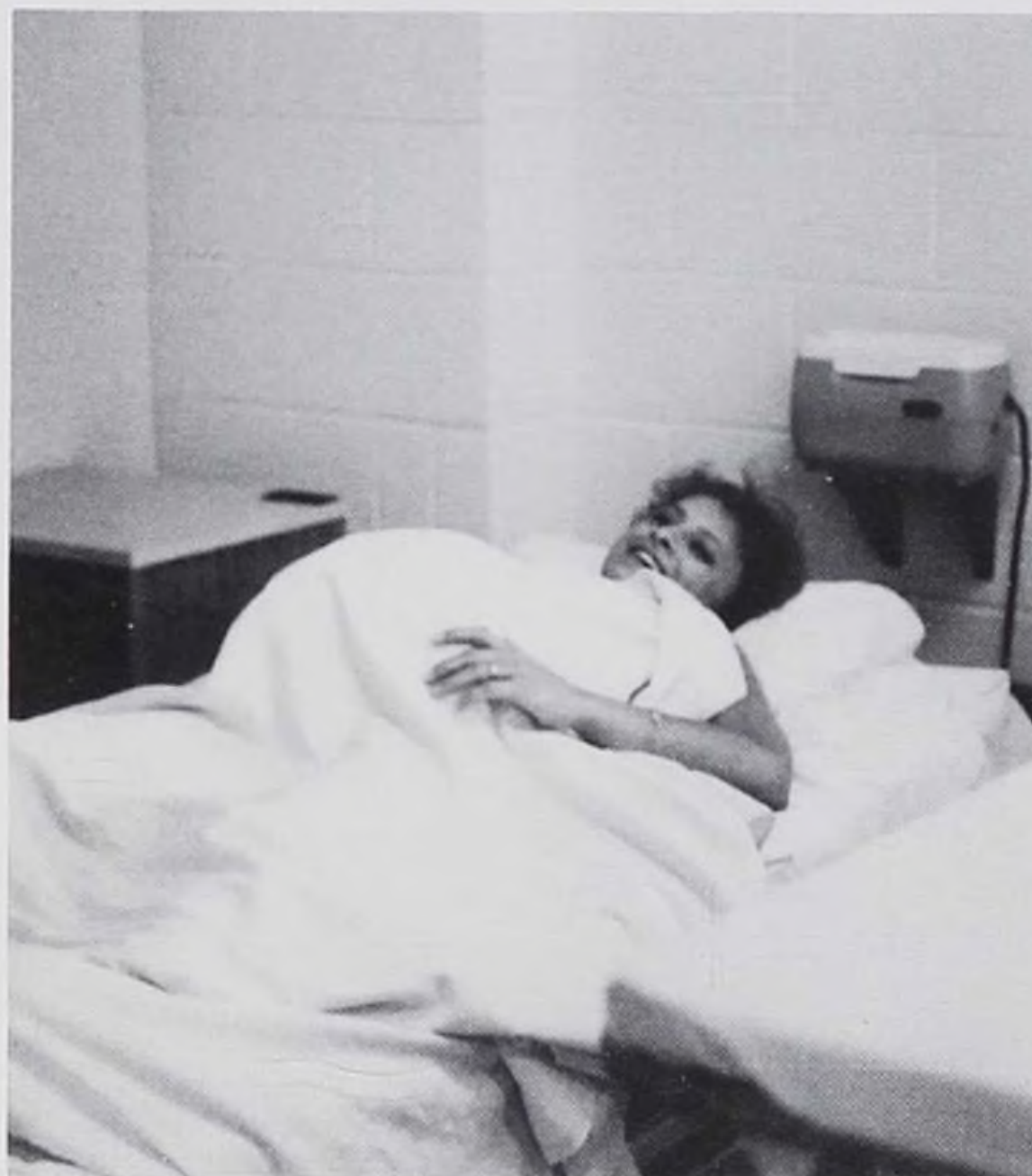

CARE OF THE ADULT PATIENT IA

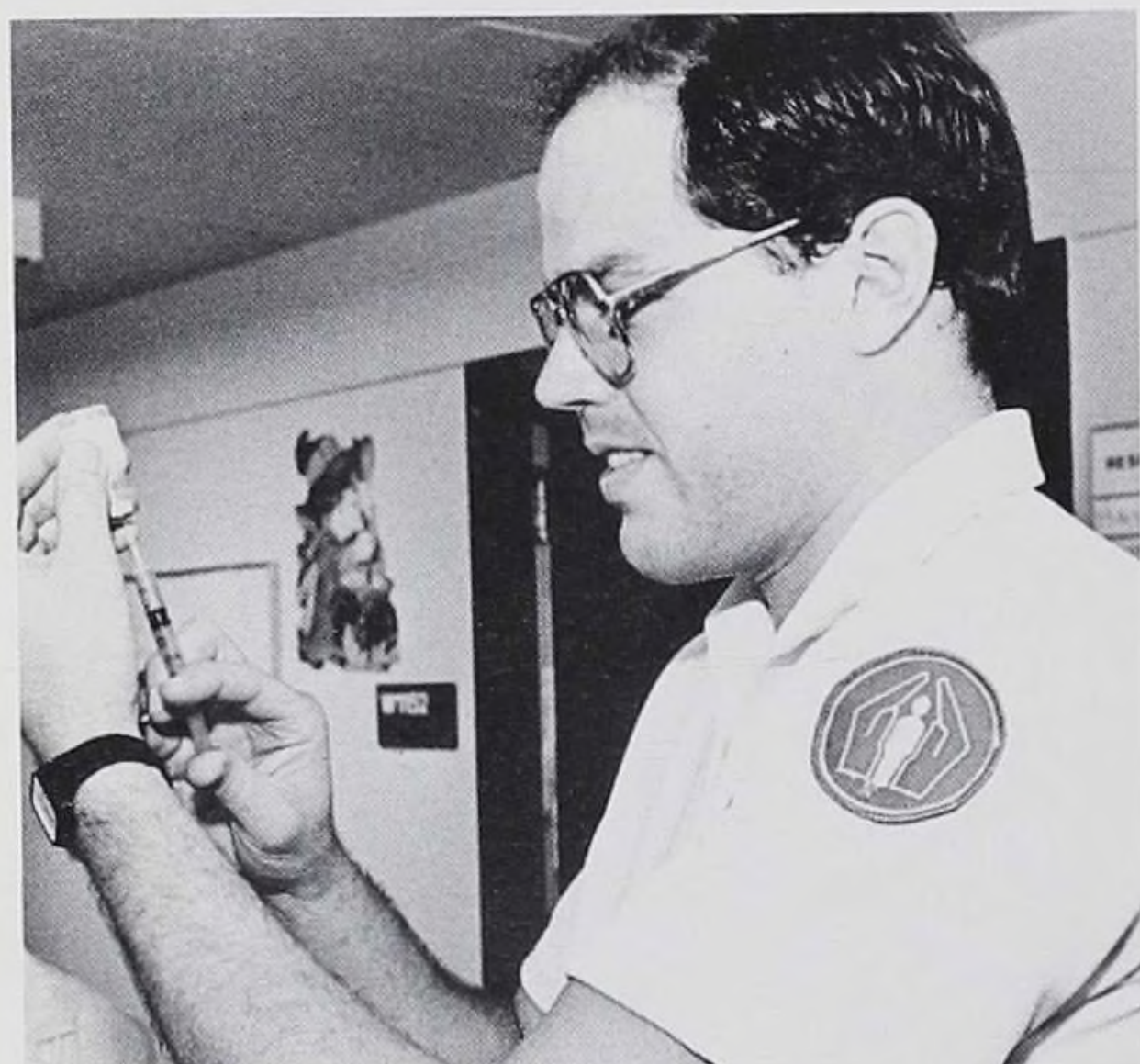

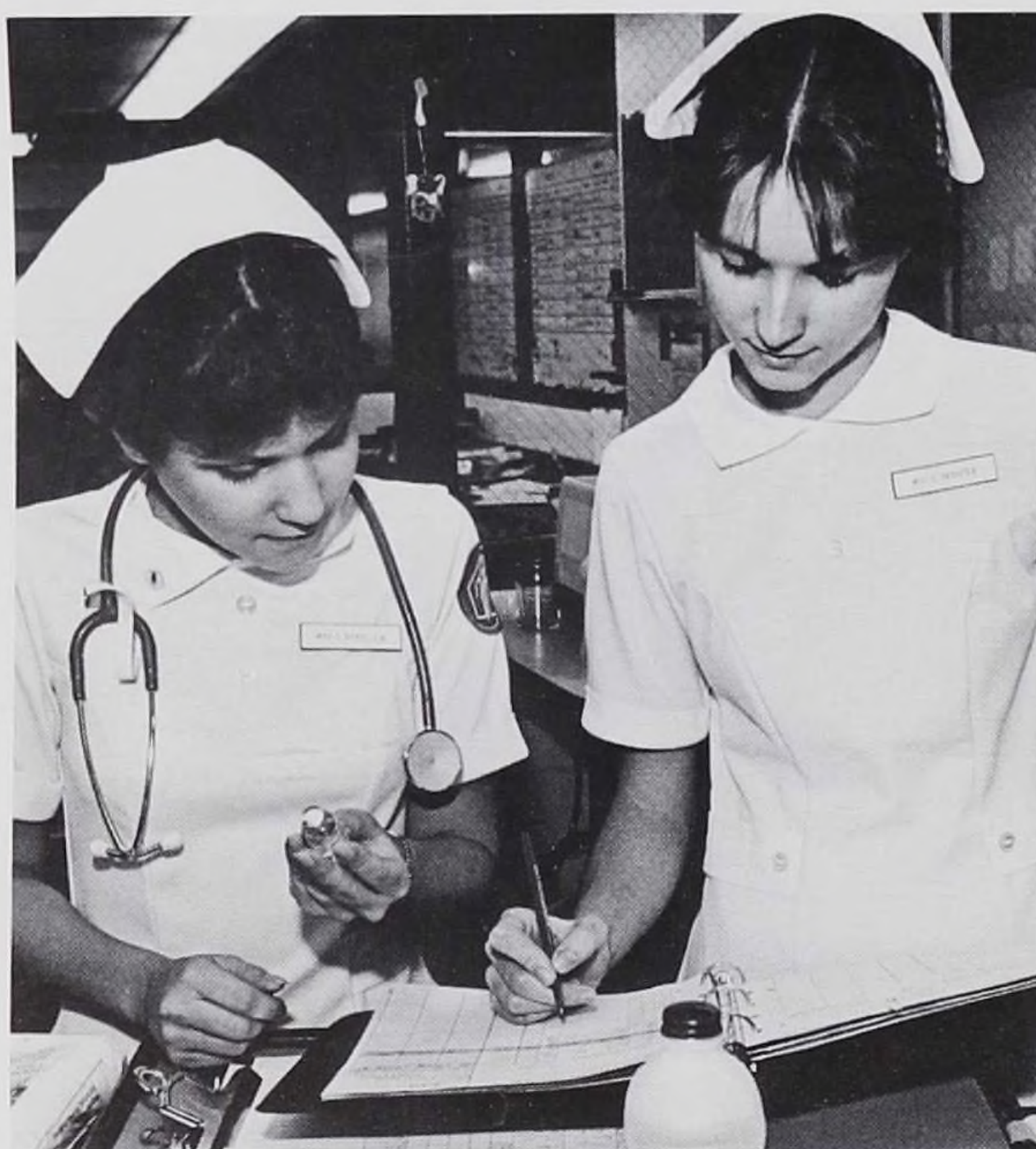

CARE OF THE ADULT PATIENT IB

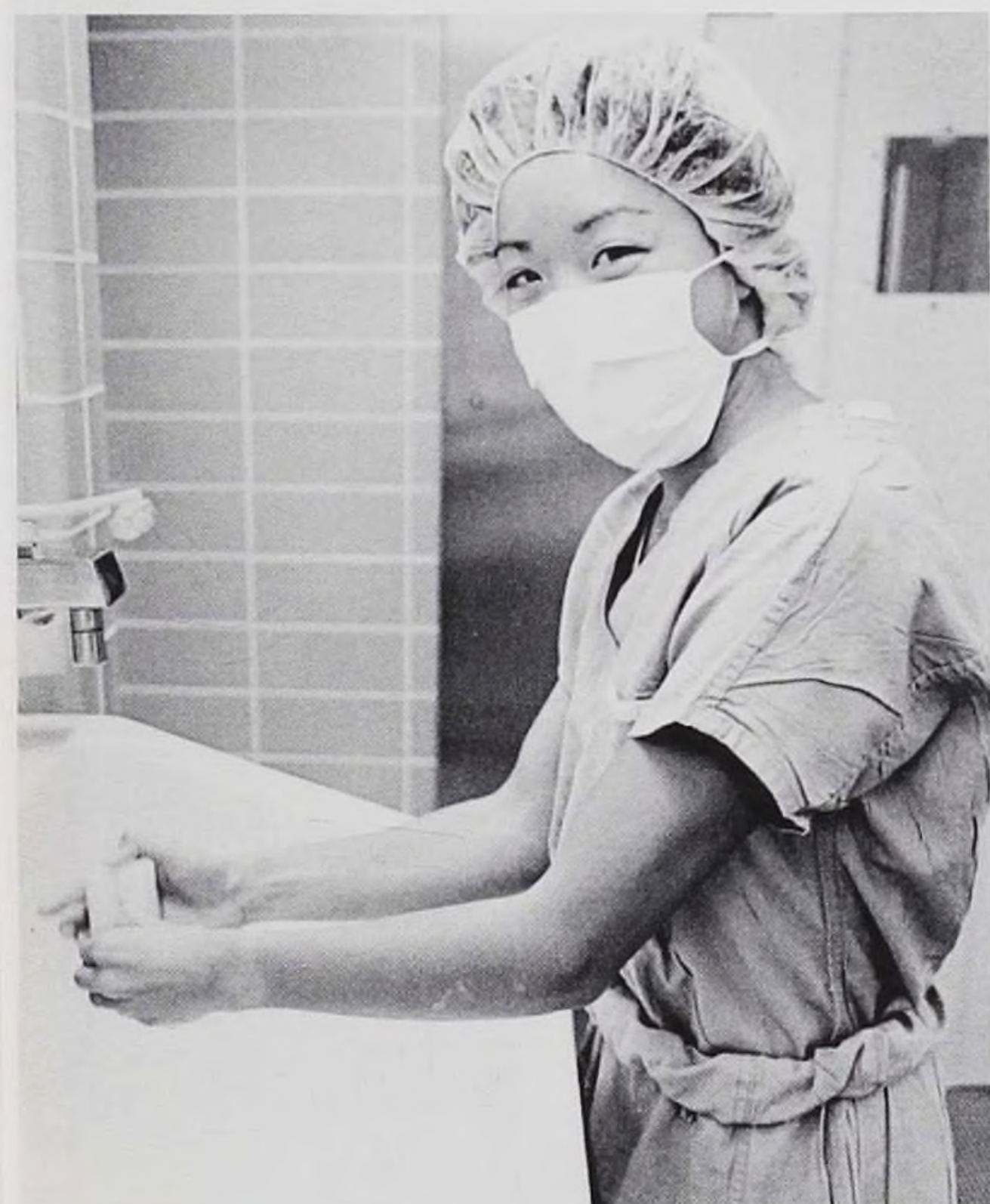

MATERNITY NURSING

This course includes the study of nursing interventions that meet the needs of a woman during her reproductive cycle. Emphasis is placed on a family centered birth process. Assessments of the childbearing family, including the normal and high-risk pregnancy are introduced.

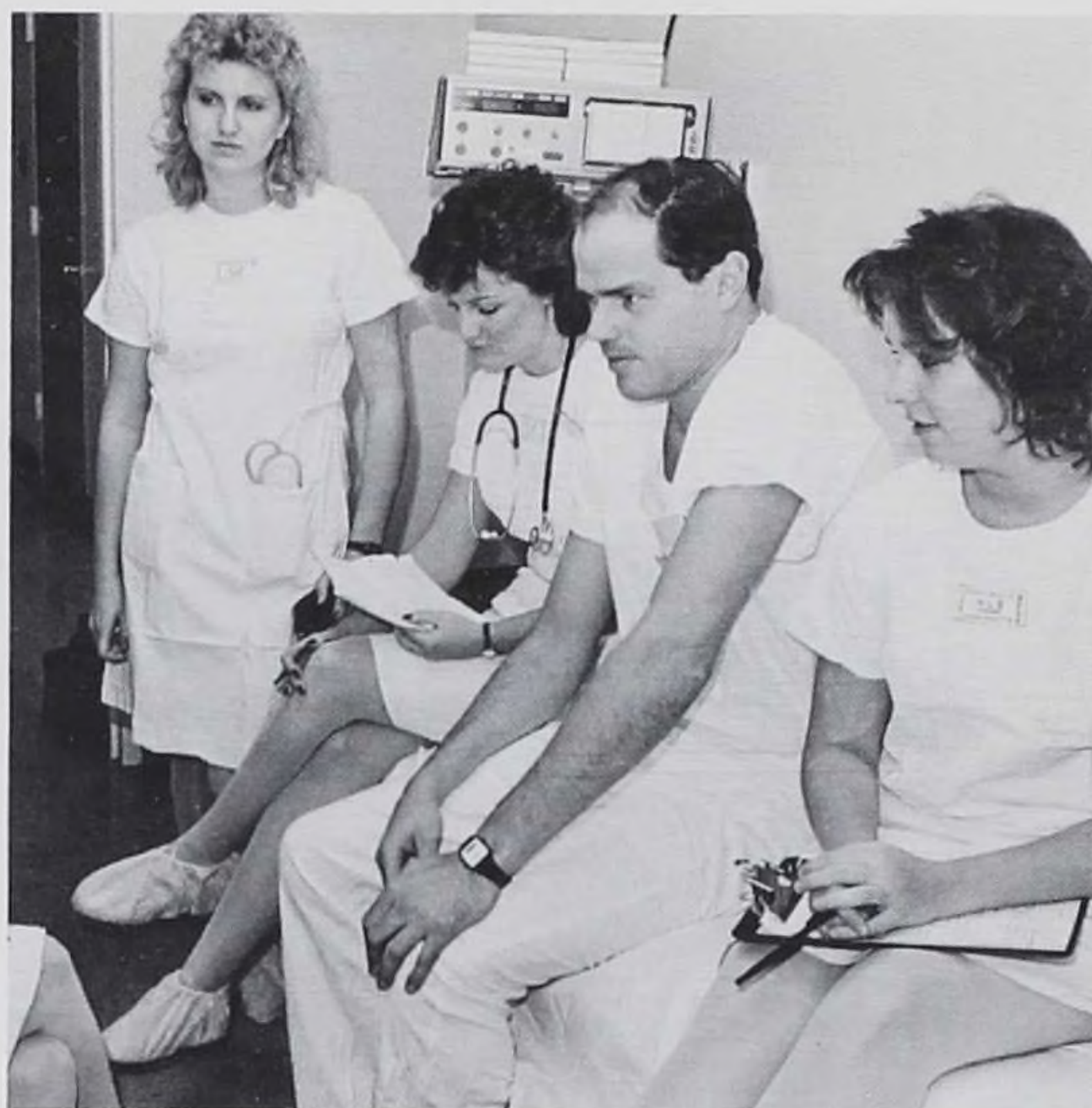

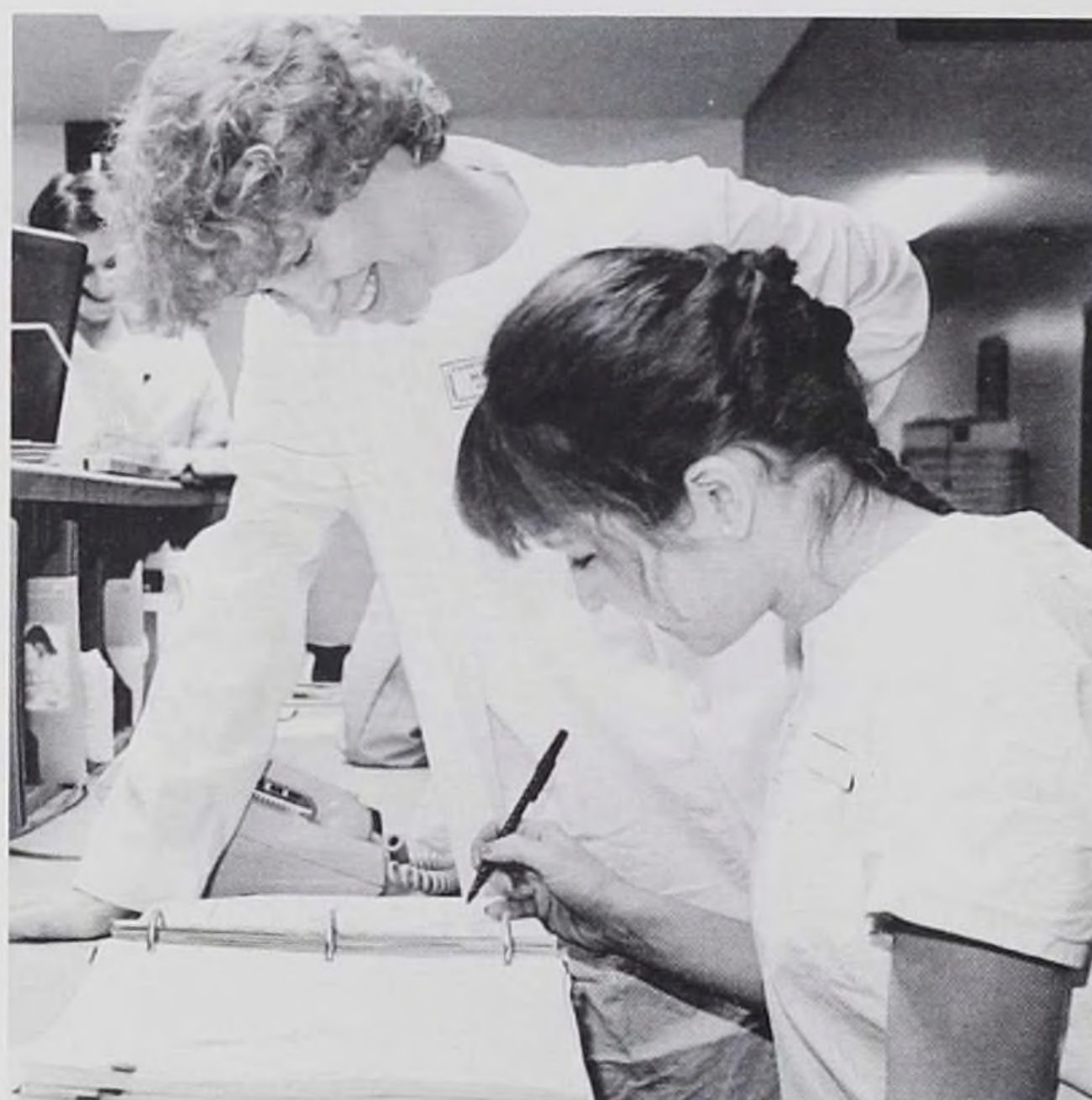

NURSING OF CHILDREN

The course provides a wholistic approach to the nursing care of the child and family. Emphasis is placed on the child and his family undergoing stress and adaptation to illness. To meet this need, application is directed towards the physical, psychosocial, intellectual, and spiritual beliefs of the patient. Patient care experiences occur on the pediatric and adolescent units, neonatal intensive care unit and the ambulatory care clinic.

PSYCHIATRIC NURSING

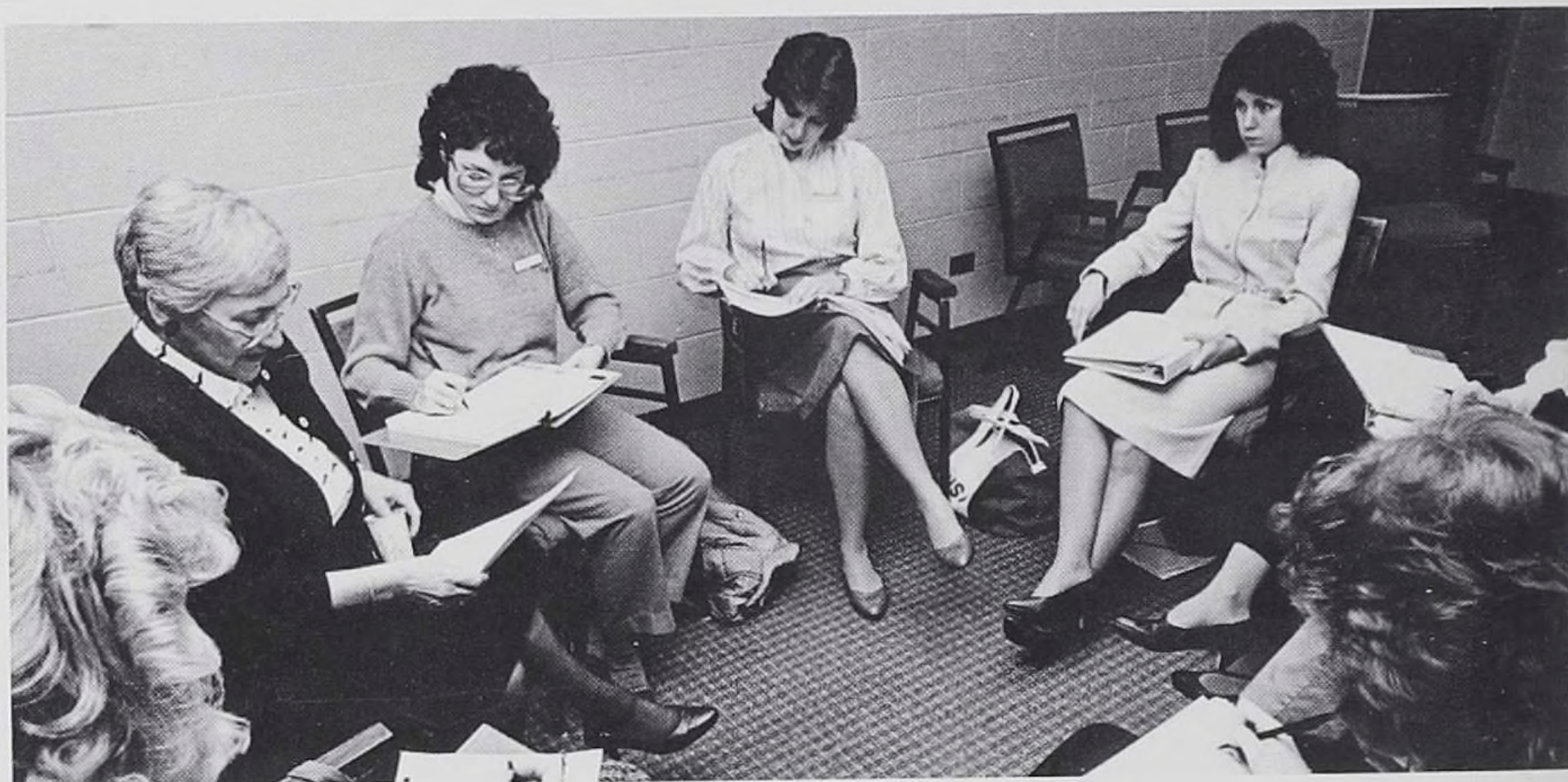
This course focuses on the use of developmental and interpersonal concepts of human behavior. The application of mental health principles and psychiatric nursing techniques to a variety of psychiatric and non-psychiatric settings is explored. The student is given the opportunity to develop the knowledge, skills and attitudes essential for therapeutic communication. Clinical knowledge is gained on a psychiatric unit at Lutheran General Hospital and at the Lutheran Center for Substance abuse.

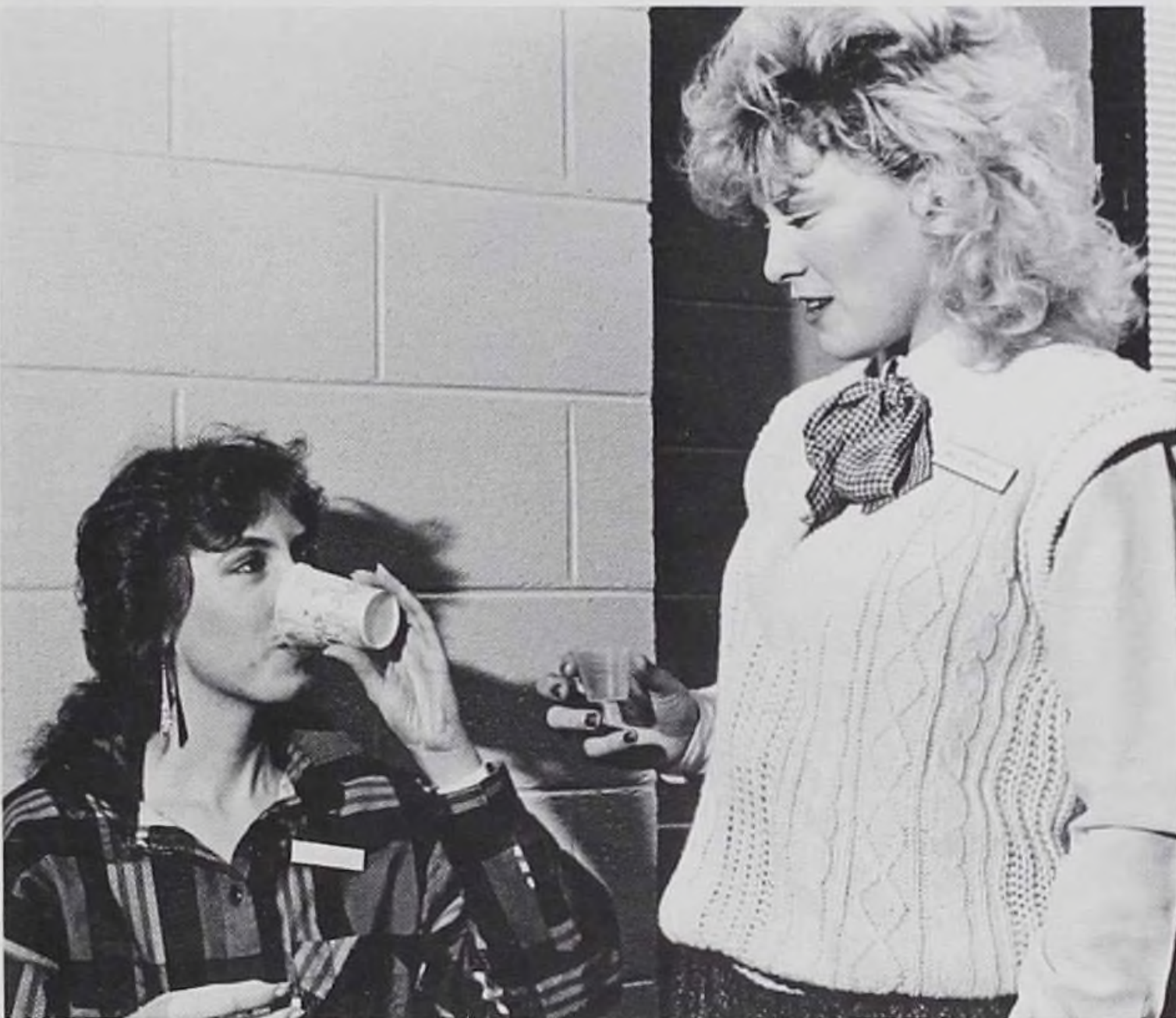

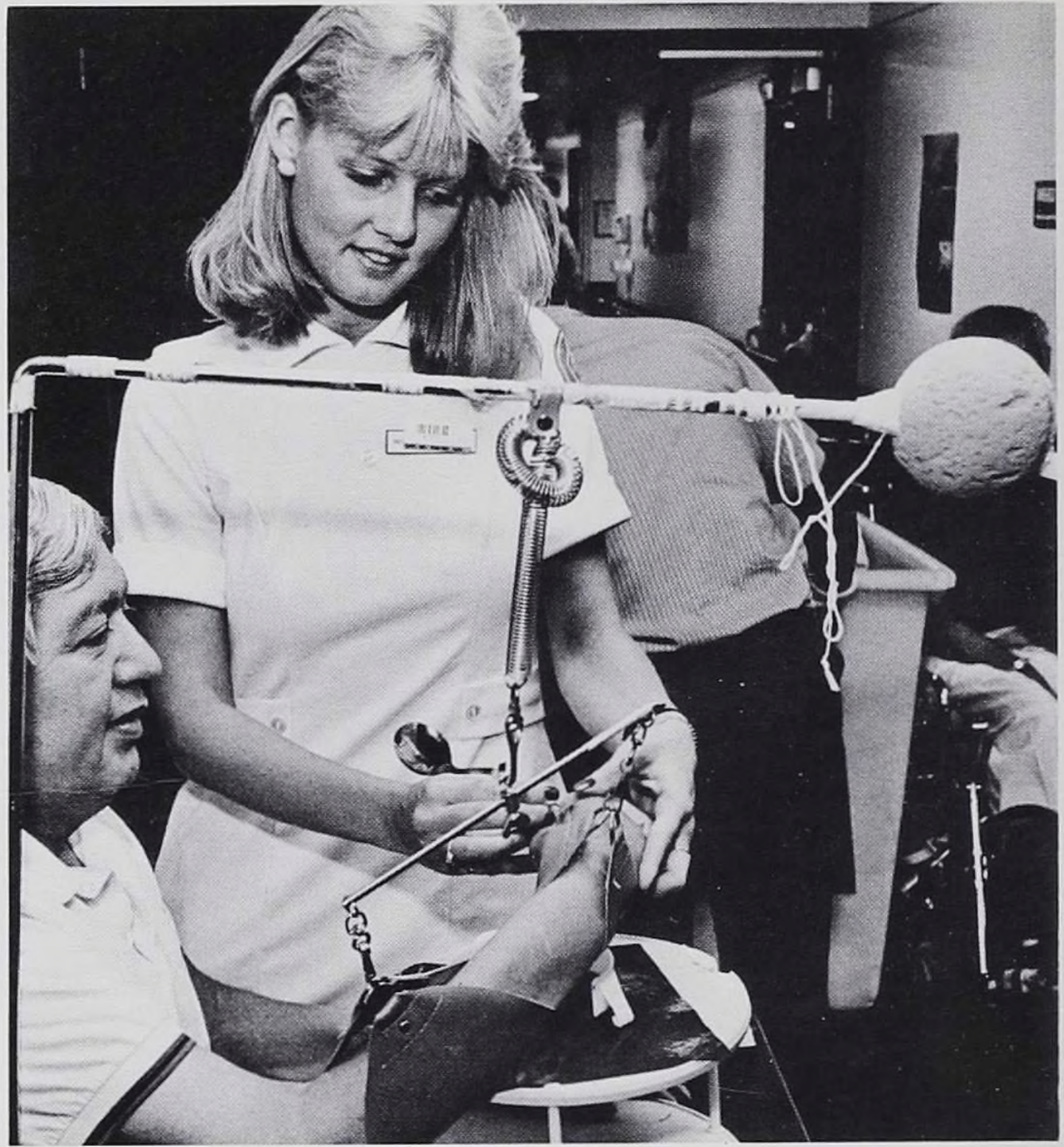

CARE OF THE ADULT PATIENT II

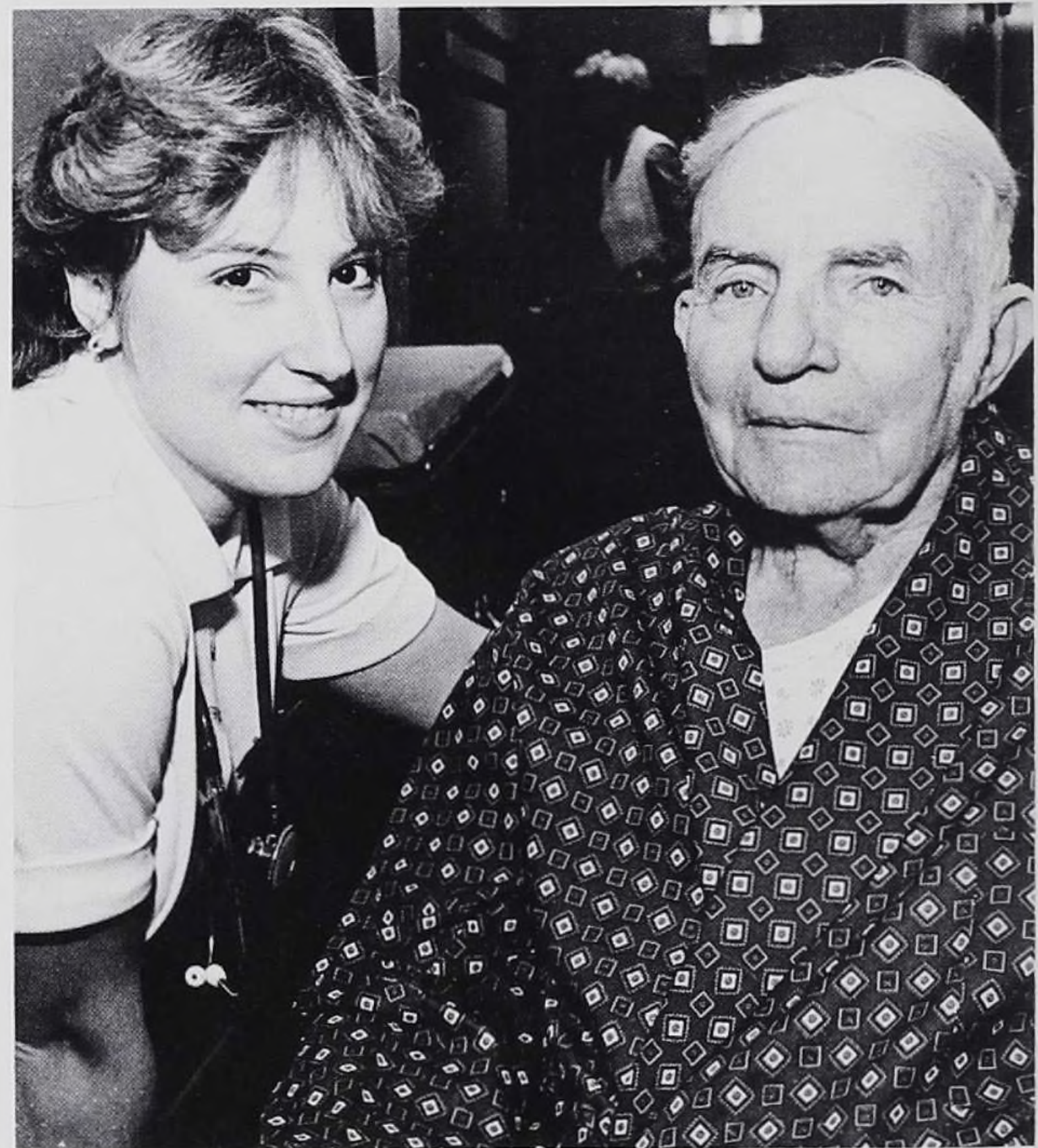
This course focuses on the concepts and principles of rehabilitation and gerontological nursing. The student studies the effects of aging and physical disability on the individual, the family and the community. Emphasis is placed on the nursing care of patients in the process of rehabilitative therapies, long term illness, and the biological and physiological effects of aging. Clinical experiences are provided on both a rehabilitation unit as well as a medical unit.

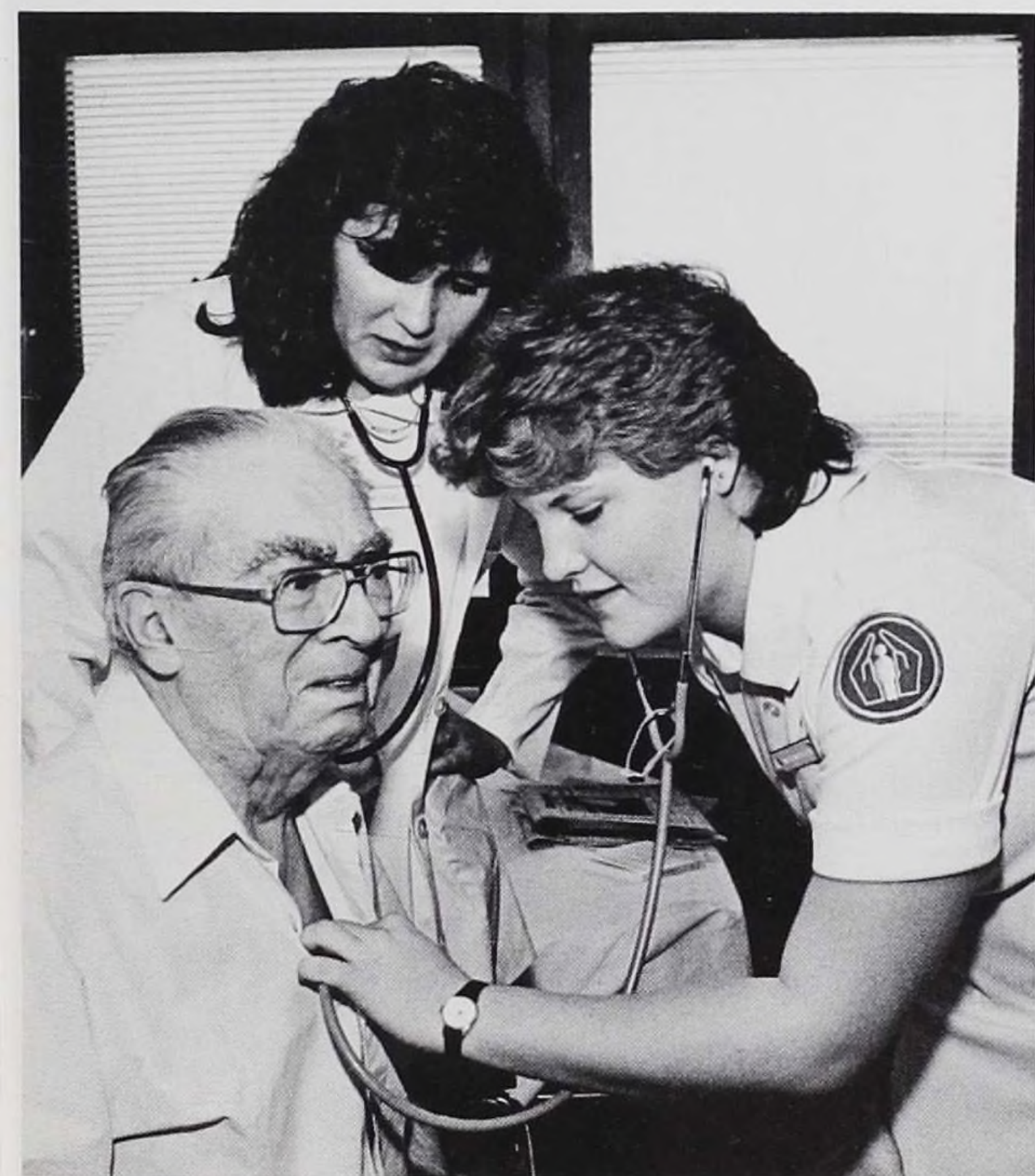

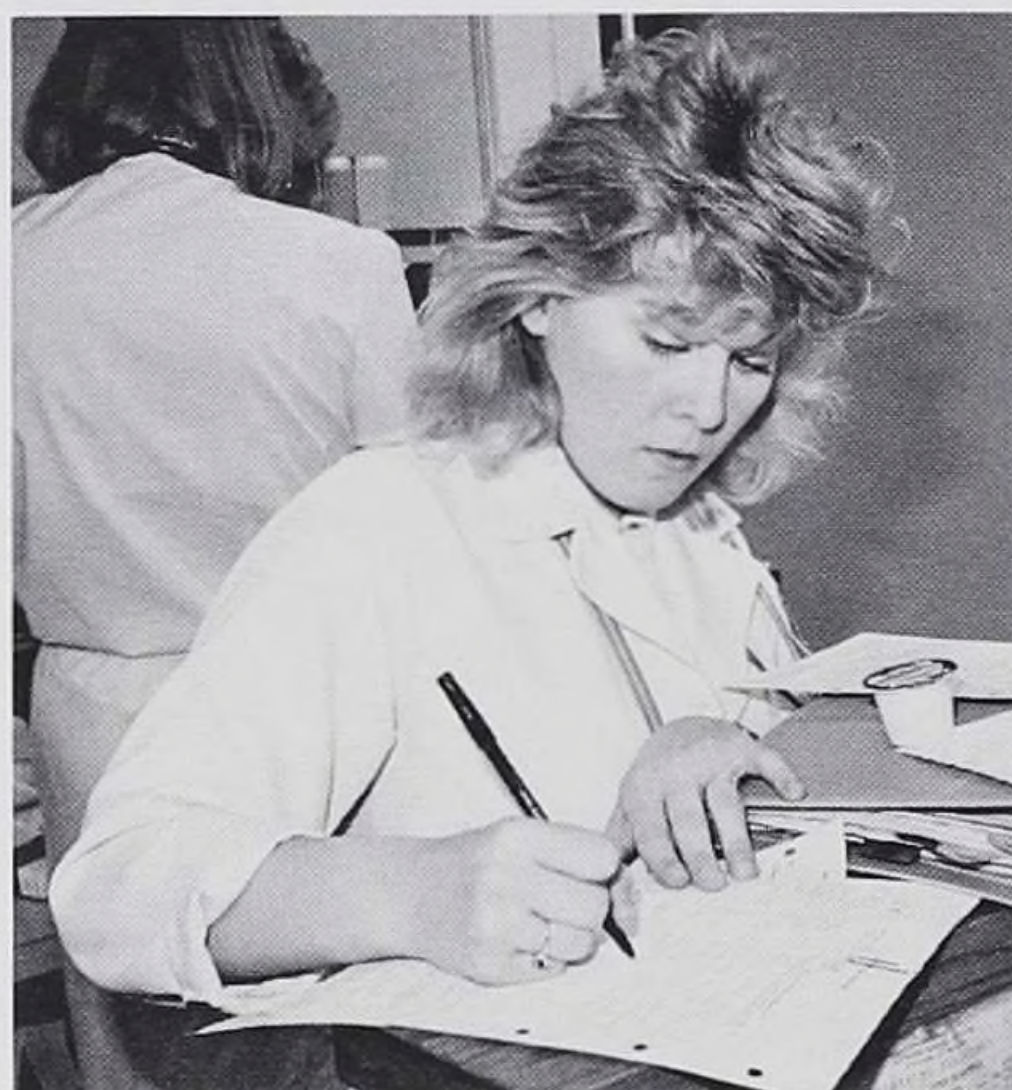

CARE OF THE ADULT PATIENT III

This course focuses on the application of the philosophy of Human Ecology to critical care nursing. The effects of critical illness on the patient, the family, and the health care provider are identified. Nursing care of selected pulmonary, cardiovascular, renal, and neurological alterations is presented. Patient care experiences are provided in various critical care units, a cardiac-renal surveillance unit and a cardiac rehabilitation unit. Students investigate community facilities for treatment and rehabilitation following a critical illness or injury. The role of the professional nurse in the Emergency Department is explored.

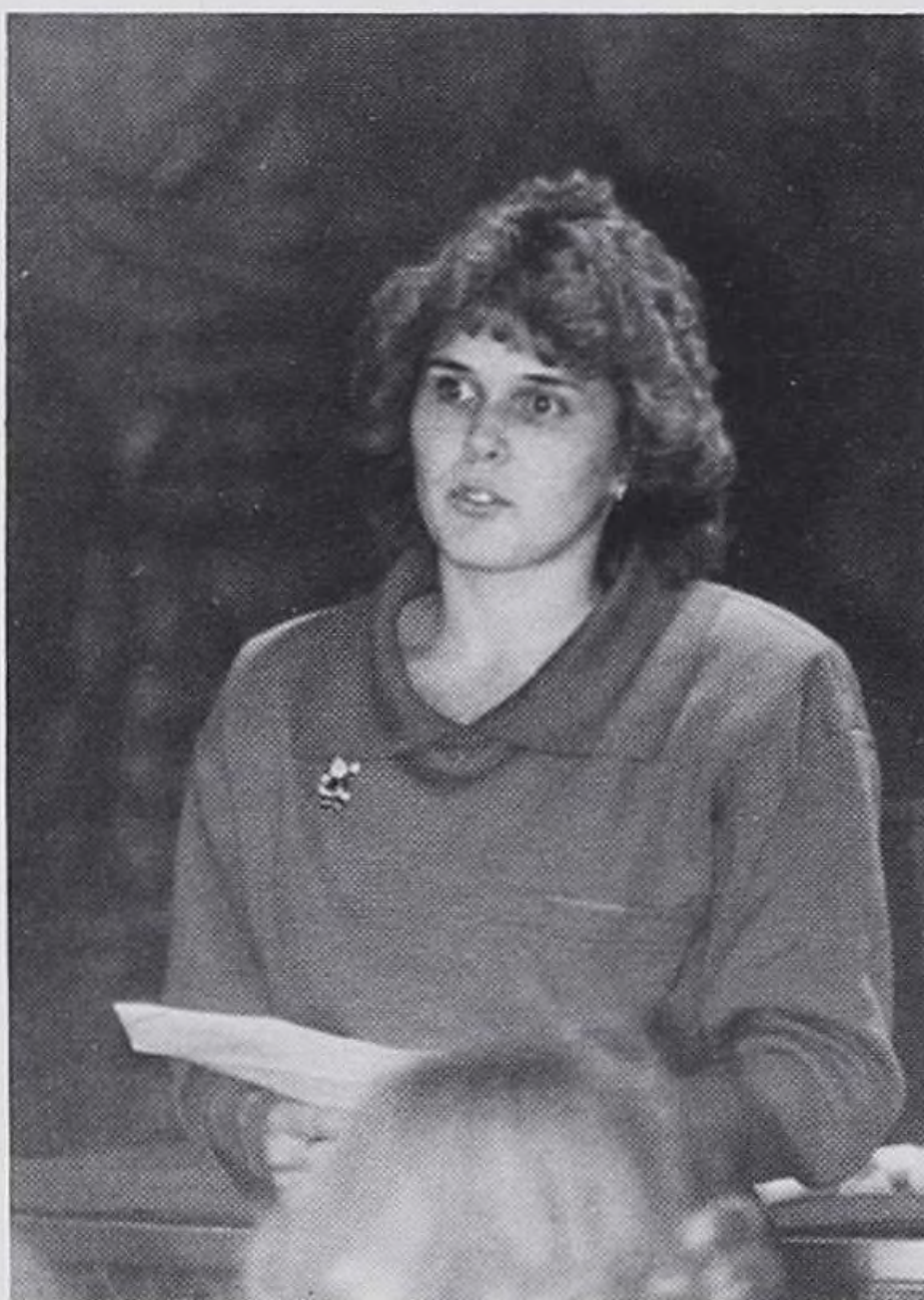
