Now I'll never walk alone while I walk with God. /

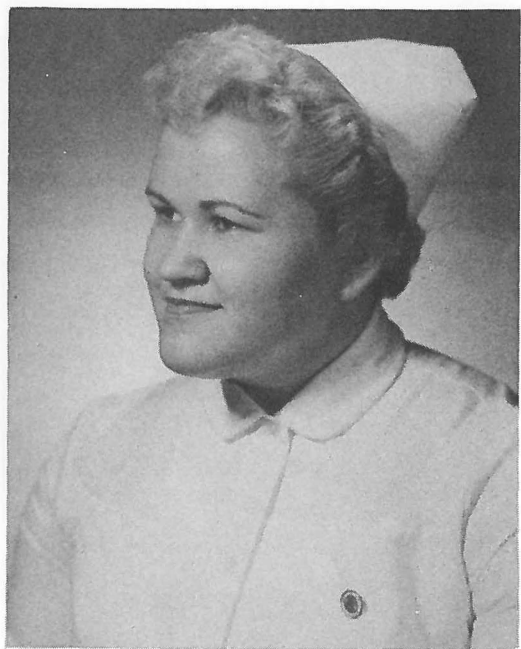

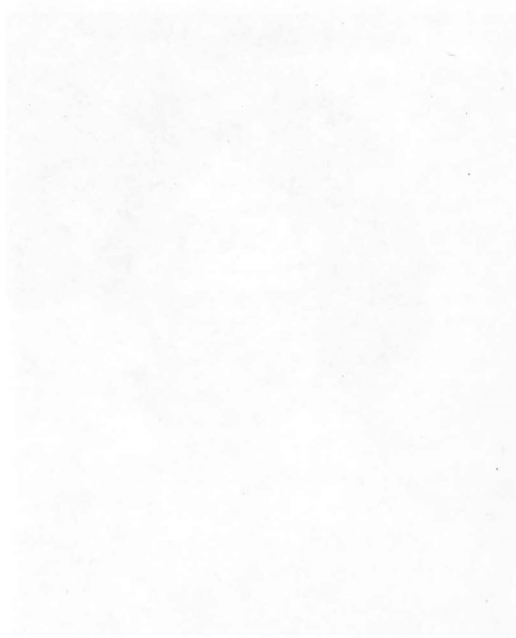

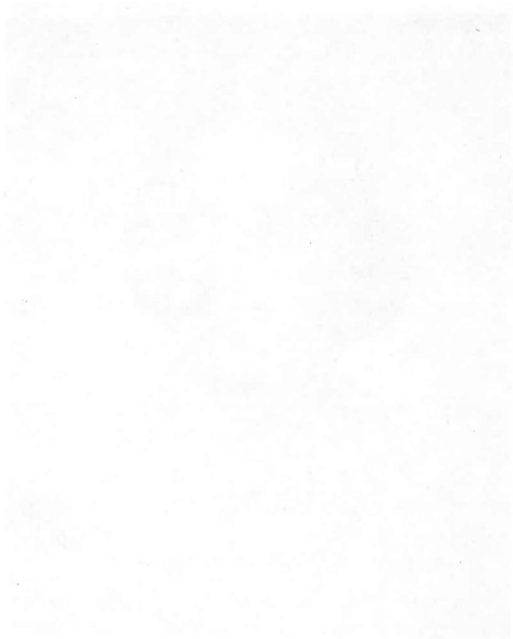

History Class of 1960

On September 3, 1957, twenty-eight girls took the death-defying step, forsaking friends and family for studies and solitude. Into E. H. C. Hall we moved bag and baggage!!!

That night our Big Sisters had a Welcome party for us at which we met the Hospital Administrator—Rev. George, Director of Nurses, Mrs. Peterson and the Faculty.

I am sure that none of us will forget those next trying hours!!! The familiar expression was a *groan!!*

The rest of the week was spent in orientation to classes etc. Remember the thrill it was to wear our uniforms for the first time at the Senior graduation.

The following week we started classes such as Nursing Arts, Anatomy and Physiology, Chemistry and Microbiology. We shall never forget *Barney* and the bus rides to Wilson Junior College accompanied by those "Happy Anniversary To Us" songs.

About this time we started putting in A.M. floor duty, giving baths, answering lights and passing drinking water. The time went so fast for Alice Higgins that she had to invent a new and more efficient method of passing water.

Before we knew it, it was December. The Juniors were making plans for their Christmas Dance at which Shirlee Funk was chosen queen. Next came the Christmas Dinner which the hospital gave for the students and as a Christmas gift we received those welcomed checks. Remember the fun we had preparing our Christmas Play and the embarrassment that Rosie Kopfer had???

Prior to Capping, Gwen Kapischke and Ruth Meyer had major surgery — molectomies and two classmates decided to leave, namely Carol Kochalka and Jane Pirtle. Now we are twenty-six.

On February 16th, that very special occasion arrived—our Capping. Penny Darrah arrived just a few seconds before the twenty-six of us proceeded into church and Mrs. Peterson was wondering if she planned to come!!! Capping was very beautiful and not many of us were dry-eyed as we walked down the aisle. How about artificial candle light—at least they won't go Out????!!!

After Capping we elected our class officers: Shirlee Funk, President, Barbara Cavanaugh—Vice President, Jane Jung—Secretary and Ruth Meyer—Treasurer.

Our first Freshman function was a St. Patrick's Day Dance which was really a success, especially for Janie Jung and her triangle.

Spring came and another classmate left, Deanna Schmudde—now we are twenty-five.

Formal classes were just about over and we were covering bandaging in Nursing Arts when Darlene Will and Carol Van Doren wrapped Darlyne Helm like a mummy. A few days later Carol left school unexpectedly taking Darlyne's suitcase with her. The \$64,000 question was where's Carol??? A week later she came back not a MISS but a Mrs. and with Darlyne's suitcase. About the same time Janie Jung got her spray colognes mixed and used lavender room spray instead. Mary Thomas couldn't be left out of the excitement and accidentally used Noxzema while washing her hair. She really enjoyed that cool mentolated smell!!!

We were all sorry to see Bobby Broman leave; even though she was only four feet nine inches tall, she was real BIG in our hearts. Now we are twenty-three.

June was a big month for us; we are really NURSES now passing pills and giving shots. Ruth Meyer received a lot of teasing the day she charted Combiotic in the nourishment column; and the day that Kathy Riorden and Gwen Kapischke went to see Dr. Macalalad perform a tracheotomy!!!!

On June 6th, fate struck our class again and two favorite classmates leave, namely Kathy Riorden and Shirley Ford. Now we are twenty-one.

September 15, 1958 will be remembered by Barb Cavanaugh; complete with pizza-pie and pepsi pre-op she went to surgery to have an appendectomy.

On September 30th, we officially became Juniors with the presentation of chevrons. It didn't seem possible that we had only TWO years to go til that big day. About this time Lorie Funk decided to sample hospital life from the patient's point of view.

The INEVITABLE has happened!! We started working P.M.'s and nights. Will we ever get used to this kind of night life!!!!!!

In October we welcomed Peggy Wierth while we lost Darlene Will. Now we are still twenty-one.

It was a late October night when Janie Jung found the dead MOUSE under her bed, and the nurse's home went up for grabs, but was promptly calmed down by Mrs. Godfrey. Bonnie Dziedzic gave the mouse an appropriate burial down the "john", meanwhile, Judy Phillips made like Da Vinci and calmly went back to her painting.

On December 17th we gave our Christmas Dance at which we missed Janie, as she was in the hospital for her operation.

Marge Hawkins, Penny Darrah, Bev Hesson, Barb Cavanaugh, Shirlee Funk and Darlyne Helm started the New Year off right at STATE—as nurses, not patients. While Pauline Engel and Jackie Pellitier left for Hinsdale. Those who were here will never forget how to COMMUNICATE!!!!

The months flew quickly by and vacation time was here at last. Pauline Engel was looking forward anxiously to those 5 A.M. "cow sessions" on her parents' farm. Sharon Bohle, Judy Philips, Mary Thomas, Bonnie Dziedzic and Corinne Eckert left for State.

On August 31, we gave the graduating class of '59 their Dinner-Dance at the Del Prado Hotel with music by Don Fernando and his orchestra.

On September 27, we welcomed the kids back from State and said good-bye to Jane Jung, Peggy Wierth, Ruth Meyer, Rosie Kopfer and Gwen Kapischke.

On October 1st we finally became Seniors with the presentation of that coveted third stripe. Ruth Meyer received extra congratulations on her engagement and became the second member of the "Sparklers Club". The first member of the club was Carolyn Ultch who received her ring on December 21, 1959.

In November class elections were held. Carol Ultch—President, Sharon Buhle—Vice President, Pauline Engel—Secretary, and Lorrie Funck—Treasurer.

December brought with us a sort of sadness as we realized that this would be our last Christmas together. On December 27th we welcomed back the kids from State and were forced to face our last three months of classes. We also welcomed back Mrs. Bev Maxwell and now we are twenty-two.

January 9th was an exciting day for Shirlee Funk—she became the third member of the "Sparklers Club."

February and March were exciting months. We picked out our graduation uniforms and had our pictures taken.

On April 29th, Sharon Buhle became the fourth member of the "Sparklers Club," when Dave popped that question of all questions!!!!

In April Alice Higgins, Jackie Pellitier, Pauline Engel, Lorrie Funck, and Carol Ultch went to State while Shirlee Funk, Peggy Wierth and Ruth Meyer went to Hinsdale. On May 8th we welcomed back the kids from Hinsdale and said good-bye to Bonnie, Corrine and Darlyne.

On May 25th we made our last appearance as members of the student chorus at the Spring Concert, and we realized that this was one of the last times our class would be together until graduation.

On June 23, the Doctors entertained the entire student body at a dinner at the Ridge Country Club. The food was delicious to say the least. I'm sure there are a few who will never forget the long wait we had for our ride to get back!!!!

On June 26th, Mrs. Peterson and her husband entertained the entire Senior class and their guests at their summer home on Diamond Lake, Michigan. A great time was had by all but we felt bad when Carol's John had to be rushed to the hospital to have several stitches taken in his foot. And that night we were all scared out of our wits when we heard some of our classmates had been in an accident, but thank goodness they were all ok.

As we return to E.H.C. in September for the last time we look forward to the Junior-Senior Dinner dance and graduation.

Graduation, at last is almost here. We've had our laughs and our tears, our joys and our fears. This is our history. We've lived all these moments and they are now memories to be cherished. . . .
